PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another cricket season has been completed and by any indications it was an enjoyable and successful year on all levels. The standard of cricket continues to improve and most pleasing was any on field unsavoury incidents were at a minimum.

Through a few years of hard work and good management the SSJCA is in a strong financial position and discussions are continuing with Cricket NSW and Sutherland Council on how we can best deploy those funds for the benefits of junior cricket players in the Shire. I would like to thank John Chesher for offering his assistance to kick start these discussions and to put some worthy ideas forward for future committees to consider.

Competitions and junior sport must continue to evolve with the times and meet the needs of those that have a desire to play the game. To this end I would like to thank the hard working Presidents and Secretaries of all our Clubs for their fresh ideas and thoughts on how we can best meet our goals. Your support of the SSJCA committee and its Initiatives are also greatly appreciated. Similarly Cricket NSW and Russel Grimson in particular has been invaluable and they are always willing to lend their support and offer their advice.

We are spoilt to have an enormous range of volunteers to help run our junior cricket competition. Managers, scorers, committee people and umpires are all invaluable, but the really pointy end of our volunteers are our coaches. They hold an important position in the minds of our young players and often they are magicians at juggling player and parent issues. Well done and a sincere thank you to all our coaches. To this end the SSJCA has recognised the value of the coaches and I would like to thank Steve Mulally for filling the position of the SSJCA coaching co-ordinator, which was extremely helpful to Clubs and individuals in improving the ranks of our coaching personnel.

Representative Cricket is a very important part of our Association and whilst results on the field have been good (with our young Cawsey team making the final under the guidance of Peter Schofield), I believe that more importantly the SSJCA offers our young elite cricketers a fantastic learning environment on both improving their physical and mental skills and how to play in the Spirit of Cricket. My thanks go to the Managers and Coaches of those teams and in particular the SSJCA Representative manager Greg Thomas who for the last 3 years in this position has done an outstanding job. The administration of Rep cricket in the Shire has never been better.

This year saw a further improvement in the important relationship with the Sutherland Grade Club and I would like to thank past SSJCA President and life member Peter Smith for assisting both of our bodies to have an even more harmonious and open relationship.

We saw more Umpires officiating at matches this year and this is greatly supported by the SSJCA. Bill Rigby has done a great job bringing more young umpires through the ranks and this is a trend we will actively support in future seasons.

Once again we are very grateful for support from our long standing sponsors Kingsgrove Sports, and Marine Product Marketing. Sutherland Shire Council continues to offer us their support and as usual has done a tremendous job in maintaining our fields and handling with great professionalism the delicate balance between all the sports who all want to utilise our grounds.

In the demanding Association Secretary position (and in his first year on the committee!), Andrew Mazurkiewicz has been one of the quickest learners I have seen and now has made the role his own after having to fill some pretty big past Secretary shoes.

As happens with all committees we are going through a generational change. Next season will see myself and two long serving executive committee members retire from the committee. As I mentioned above Greg Thomas has done an exceptional job with our Representative teams, but I wish to remind all that Greg has also served with distinction in the roles of Vice President and President. In fact when the Association needed him, Greg stepped down from the Presidency and took up the Rep Managers role in a totally unselfish act. The Association owes Greg a great debt. I was especially pleased with this honour bestowed on Tom as it will only add total support to the SSJCA nominating Tom for Life membership at our soon to be held annual general meeting. In my opinion Tom's dedication and service to the SSJCA is second to none and this will be an honour so richly deserved.

My 3 years in the role as President has been an uplifting and humbling experience. The amount of great people I have met in this capacity is overwhelming and just shows us that the spirit of the game of cricket is alive and well especially in the SSJCA, and long may it continue through our children's experiences.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

A continued emphasis on providing guidance and training of club coaches was carried through this season, as this is considered the most direct means of assisting clubs to develop the skills of their players. All clubs exist only through the volunteer services of parents and supporters, and providing these most valuable people with the means to improve their coaching skills as well as furthering the knowledge of continuing coaches is the most time-effective and cost-effective way to deliver value to our membership.

A program developed with the Sutherland District Grade Club to utilise the services of experienced senior players has proved very productive. Liaison through SDCC's Peter Smith and also Steve Mulally, both well known in junior cricket, has laid a good platform for the expansion of this initiative, allowing team coaches to take advantage of advanced training techniques that can then be passed throughout the clubs visited by the SDCC players. It has also been a positive step in strengthening the relationship between the Junior Association and the Grade Club.

The SSJCA again promoted a series of Level 1 Coaching Courses this season, that were well attended and plainly beneficial to new coaches and others involved with their children's sport. The clubs are to be congratulated for encouraging the parents of their players to participate in this activity. The In2Cricket activity, successor to Have-A-Go on Friday evenings, was again a popular and successful

introduction for many families to the game of cricket. The SSJCA appreciates the efforts of the clubs that host this activity, and the enrolment of new players in each successive year is proof of the value of this program.

The u10 Development Squad again proved extremely popular with clubs and players, the ongoing success of the format vindicating the SSJCA's decision some years ago not to field a team in the u10 interdistrict competition. Much hard work by the convenors Martin Cole and Grant Arnold, assisted by Tony Neale, was appreciated by the boys and their parents. The squad participated in a program of training sessions, 50 over matches, a session at the SCG as part of the on-ground entertainment during a Ford Ranger Cup match, and finally a workout in the SCG nets to conclude their involvement.

Girls cricket continues to develop with the encouragement and guidance of Michael Ryan of the St Patricks Club. It is hoped that more and more girls will get involved with the game, and follow in the steps of several of our very successful female players.

Selection into the SDCC's Academy was again a priority for the most promising of our players, the benefits of the intensive and advanced training and the introduction to senior level representative cricket proving a strong attraction for the triallists.

There is always more to be done to develop the skills of our players, and not just the 10% or so who aspire to representative selection. The SSJCA appreciates and thanks all the parents and club officials who support the programs that are put in place to improve those skills.

The greatest joy as coach for me was watching the team bond together. The majority of the boys were together during the U10 Development Squad in the previous season, and their friendship was strong. Even though the boys came from many clubs, on Sunday's they played for Sutherland and were proud doing so.

The team of up-and-coming champions were:

Jack Thorne (Captain): It was a pleasure to have Jack as captain. He always led by example and lifted the boys when needed. He was exceptional with the ball, taking crucial wickets when required. He led the batting and bowling stats, and took control in the field as captain by setting fielding positions and encouraging his team. An excellent year.

Joel Drury (Vice Captain): As vice captain, Joel, along with Josh, helped Jack with setting the strategies for the team. Joel has a good cricketing brain and this helped ease the team through their first year. With the bat, Joel was put into a number of tough situations where things didn't always go his way. In our final game he helped us see out our overs, ensuring we had a competitive total.

Josh Horner (Vice Captain): Josh was dynamic with all aspects of his game this year. With the ball he was very quick, keeping the batsmen on the back foot, and always being difficult to play. His batting improved as the year went on, culminating in a great innings in the last game. In the field, he consistently restricted runs with feats only Josh could do.

Joel Almond: With both bat and ball, Joel showed the promise of developing into a very good rep cricketer. Coming off a tough introduction in the trial, Joel worked hard to remove his occasional loose ball to become by season end one of our top liners. In the field Joel excelled, putting his body on the line.

Joey Cox: As our keeper and opening batsman, Joey had a big ask this season. He did without missing a beat. His keeping was amazing, taking 8 catches including one that shouldn't happen by a boy his age. As an opener, he never left any questions unanswered, taking charge and pushing the runs.

Angus Fallins: It's always handy to have a left hand bowler, especially when they are as talented as Angus. He was unlucky not to take more wickets, but his strength was that his bowling was tough to score from. He bowled in a number of high pressure situations and handled it like a pro.

Mathew Griffiths: As our spinner, Mathew could always be called on to mixed it up. His highlight was the 4 wickets he picked up in our first game just as it was starting to slip away. With the bat, Mathew played the innings of his life against the eventual finalist to get us within a whisker.

Joshua Johnston: One of our top line batters, Josh showed his class across a number of innings. He kept the score moving along through a wide selection of shots. The coach could always breathe a little easy knowing that Josh was at the crease.

Jarrold Mazurkiewicz: Playing up a year didn't stop Jarrod looking like he belongs. As an opener, he helped see off the top line bowlers to give our talented stroke players a chance. Excellent technique will serve him well in the future.

Henry McCray: Our Mr Fix-it. If something needed done, Henry was on hand to do it. All-round skills helped Henry excel when given the opportunity. He was instrumental in

a number of our wins, with either bat or ball. A stand out in the field, including an amazing catch in slips.

Dylan Smith: Playing up a year, Dylan showed his class with the ball. Giving the opposition a year's head start might faze some, but not Dylan. He bowled with excellent pace ending the season with the team's best strike rate taking a wicket every 17 balls.

Aolei Yu: Easily the most reliable and dependable bowler in the team. Aolei could drop the ball on a twenty cent piece at will. His accuracy was outstanding, ensuring he was tough to score off, with a third of his overs being maidens. In the field Aolei was outstanding, quick with excellent hands.

I would like to thank our manager, Michael McCray, for his tireless efforts this year, and for being on hand when I had to sound out some ideas. To the moms, your afternoon teas were easily the best on offer, with Vicki leading the effort. Thank you to the Thorne family for the lovely gift for each of the players, it was truly appreciated by all. The team has the potential to win the competition and I wish you all the best of luck for the future.

Initial disappointment gave way to the realization that we were undone by only two class

players. There is no doubt we worried an outfit who went on to win the competition without losing a game.

So with some excitement we traveled north of the harbour for our first away game against Hornsby. We again batted first despite losing the toss and made a promising start with solid contributions by Gavin, Jake and Ben. Then came the coach's nightmare as we self-destructed losing 5 wickets for 1 run against tight but not devastating bowling although we now knew why we were put in to bat. James Thomas and Gareth Brown dug in to make our score more respectable but a total of 72 was never going to be enough. However the bowlers rolled up their sleeves and Matt and Ernie soon had the home side reeling at 3/17, but despite solid contributions by Gavin (1/7 off 7) Hornsby took their time and passed out total with 5 wickets down.

Our next match was away to Central Coast and the parents decided to make a weekend of it with most of the team electing to stay at some interesting accommodation on the Saturday night. The bonding session seemed to work as the boys responded to the decision to insert the opposition with as good a fielding display as could have been hoped for. All 11 opposition batsmen were caught, no chances were dropped and with the bowlers bowling straight the opposition were bundled out for a meager total of 86 with pride of place going to keeper Joel Beattie with 4 catches. The team has worked hard on its fielding and this effort was vindicated by this performance. We lost 3 wickets only in passing the total with Gavin (26), Jake (21) and Jonathon (24*) bringing us safely home. Tea and an early drive home were a sound reward for a great team effort.

After the long Christmas break our first outing was a daunting away trip to Penrith. On a very hot day in trying circumstances Penrith batted first and scored 8/223 – if our fielding was spot on in the previous match it was lacking on this day with a number of chances missed throughout the innings. To their credit the boys kept going and Jake (2/19) and particularly Gavin (3/19 off 10) returned creditable figures. Chasing such a large total was always going to be a tall order but Jake chose this day to show his qualities as a batsman with a magnificent 81 before he fell victim to the home-team umpire. Liam Fletcher was promoted to opener and scored a fighting 43 but the pressure of chasing a big total proved too much despite some bold late hitting by Brock Johnstone (18) and James T (14). However a lot of valuable lessons about playing cricket at this level in these conditions were learned today.

And so to our last home match of the season on the turf at Sutherland Oval, a first for many of the lads. Another hot day, we won the toss and elected to bat. Our best opening partnership of the season of 82 (Gavin 54, James C 30) laid the foundation but we did not quite capitalize and there was plenty of debate as to whether 146 would be enough. The bowlers started well with Matt making early inroads (2/11) supported by James T, Gareth and Jonathon. Some chances were missed as one of the Newcastle batsmen made a fine 50 but Ben stood up with 3/26 and the fielding tightened with three run-outs finally seeing us home by 11 runs. A great win and fabulous day all round against very gracious opponents. Days like today are what Presidents cricket is all about.

The play off match was against Newcastle away and half the team duly drove through the rain on Saturday to sample the delights of the northern city on Valentine's Day. A

great night was had by all but the rain did not stop and a 6.00 am pitch inspection confirmed what we all knew – no game today. A disappointing end to the season.

My thanks to a lot of people who contributed to what was ultimately a successful and most enjoyable season. To the parents for sharing the burden of scoring, umpiring and chauffeuring and providing the best teas and for their support, to Jeremy Ng for assisting in the training duties and his encouragement and enthusiasm (the boys really appreciated your involvement) but particularly to Neil for taking on the role of manager with such efficiency and dedication – thanks mate. And last but not least to the boys, to the captain Ben who really grew into the role and whose captaincy against Newcastle went a long way to winning the game, to his able assistant vice-captain Jake and to the rest of the team who showed themselves to be a fine body of young men who are a credit to the Association, their parents, their clubs and themselves – good luck in the future.
