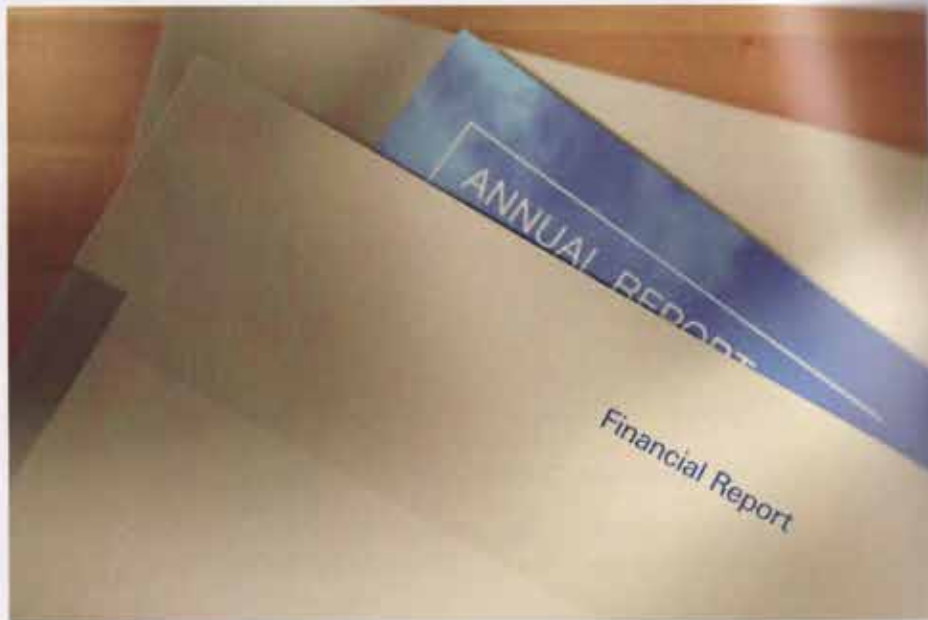

Season 2009/10 saw a continued focus on the development of club coaches through a number of initiatives and programs. This is also a focus of Cricket Australia and Cricket New South Wales as well and we should expect to see more in this area in the seasons to come. The future and strength of the SSJCA competitions relies primarily on the degree of volunteer participation at team level and enhancing their skills remains a priority.

The Coaching Mentor Program was implemented again this season. The program offered Clubs access to Sutherland District Grade Club coaches for tailored sessions designed primarily to assist Club coaches with training and player development skills. This season the focus was on providing a session for each Club (as opposed to on a per team basis), hoping this would enable a broader spread across the coaching ranks. Clubs, and their coaches and players, could take advantage of the more advanced training techniques passed on by the SDCC coaches. Thanks must be given to SDCC for agreeing to apply resources and funding for this program. It is an outstanding opportunity for Clubs and evidences the good relationship between the SSJCA and SDCC.

The SSJCA, in conjunction with CNSW, again promoted a series of Level 1 Coaching Courses at the start of the season. These were well attended and showed the commitment and enthusiasm new coaches bring to their Clubs. We have already commenced discussions with CNSW to expand the number of courses and timing to meet demand.

The SSJCA was invited to participate in a CNSW Coaching Accreditation Pilot Project during the season, working towards all SSJCA coaches completing at least the new on-line Introduction to Cricket Course (which replaces the old Level 0 accreditation). It is CA's stated goal that all cricket coaches should hold this accreditation at a minimum. The SSJCA achieved quite favourable outcomes and our appreciation goes to all coaches who evidence our established accreditation culture, as well as to those individually who assisted with this Project. The SSJCA remains committed to increasing the accreditation rates of all coaches, both at this base level

and in achieving the SSJCA's preferred accreditation standards.

In2Cricket programs were again offered across the SSJCA and those Clubs and volunteers who hosted programs are to be congratulated. This activity provides a great pathway to introduce boys and girls to cricket.

The U10 Development Squad proved extremely popular with over 60 players nominating for selection in the squad of 24. This season saw a slightly revamped structure with 4 coaches lead by Bill Johnson (Level 3) and Rob Knight (Level 2) – this smaller coach to player ratio assisting in allowing more player-specific focus and broadening the skill activities provided. The program was a great success with 4 skill sessions, 2 one-day games and a session at the SCG as part of the on-field entertainment during a Ford Ranger Cup match. The continuing success supports the SSJCA's decision to adopt a development program as opposed to fielding a smaller group of players in the interdistrict competition. Thank you to Bill, Rob and Jim Lee for their assistance this season in running the squad.

Girls' cricket is an area of continuing development. It is hoped that more and more girls will get involved and that Clubs will actively encourage girls to enter the game and take advantage of the various pathways available to them. The SSJCA acknowledges the efforts of Michael Ryan, both within the SSJCA as well as the SRGCA, to develop girls' cricket within the Shire.

The above are the key highlights of this season's development programs and does not recognise the multitude of activities that are undertaken at team and Club level. The SSJCA appreciates the time and effort that all parents and Club officials put into the game on a weekly basis. The SSJCA acknowledges that more always can be undertaken and that opportunities should exist for all players and coaches, whatever the age or grade. The SSJCA remains focussed on developing and providing these opportunities.

I would love to meet with anyone who was interested in forming alternate competitions.

Like all years there are always challenges to overcome and this year was no different. Our major challenge was the weather and this played a huge part in the success of the season.

Unfortunately we drew 2 games after being washed out with rain stopping play before our boys could show their true ability. We were lucky enough this year to play at home on three occasions with our trip to Richmond being our furthest trip from the Shire.

Round 1 Drew against Newcastle at GMO

This was our first rain affected game. Unfortunately our captain Jordan didn't get the toss he wanted and we were forced to bowl on what seemed a bit of a dead pitch. Our bowlers were still able to apply good pressure to the opposition's batsmen with Ryan forcing their opening batsman to make an early error resulting in a caught and bowled for his first in this year's campaign. The pitch was pretty flat and our opponents didn't get much out of it with the ball staying low on occasions. The boys looked like they were in a good mood to get some runs on a ground that had lush thick grass in some outfield areas. Adam and Ben took it to Hawkesbury from ball one but unfortunately Adam was run out after a

miscommunication. Ben and Bryce continued to anchor the innings early and provided a good early partnership. But it was Harry's aggressive innings of 91 that pushed the run rate through the roof. Nick P and Harry both contributed with 1 wicket each and Jordan W took 2 wickets for 1 run off 1.2 overs with the help of Ben's safe hands. Jordan D, Nick S and Jordan W also contributed with 1 catch a piece. Hopefully we could take this good performance to the next game which would be against a tough Parramatta side.

Round 3 Drew against Parramatta at Sutherland Oval

The weather had not been favourable leading up to the game with showers the day before and overnight. We knew that this game was possibly the most important one out of the five games and a win was necessary to get through to the semi's. Again the toss wasn't in our favour but we were determined to come out fighting. The pitch was less than ideal with the need to remove huge chunks of floating turf from around the batsman's feet. It was great to see that our boys had come to play today with the bowlers ripping through Parramatta's top order and having them 5 wickets down for only 37 runs. Ryan provided the early breakthrough with the help of a handy catch from Scott to send the opener back for an early rest. Scott also contributed with a clean bowled with Alexander getting an LBW and bowling Parramatta's main strike batsman for only 1. With a comfortable catch to Nigel at point Ben was able to extinguish a possibly dangerous innings that was building from the Parramatta opener. The man of the match was left for Bryce who provided frustration to the opposition with a well pitched

ball that created opportunities for catches to Adam, Ryan, Jordan D and an LBW which produced great figures of 4/18. The rain had been a pest all morning with the covers being put on numerous times during the 43 overs that we had completed. The overs had been reduced but we were only able to get out and face 1 over before the umpires called for the covers again. The game was abandoned after further rain fell and there was insufficient time left for Parramatta to bowl the 30 overs required to make a game.

Round 4 Won against Hornsby Ku-ring-ai at Barker College Hornsby

There was no sign of rain and we won an important toss and decided to bat on a very flat wicket. Ben cemented himself at the crease and with the support of the other top order batsmen was able to accumulate a great innings of 79. To be 5/160 was great and with overs in hand we would surely be able to amass a good total for the opposition to chase. As usual Ryan was able to put together a quick 34 runs which pushed the total to 155. It was important to use our 60 overs so Jordan D put together a not out innings trying to encourage the remaining batsmen to stay at the crease as long as possible. The final score of 9/198 gave us something that we could definitely defend. Ryan struck early and put the opposition into a spin with them losing 3 early wickets for only 8 runs. Ryan put together great figures of 4/28 to cap off a good performance for the match. The first change bowlers of Nick P and Scott broke 2 critical innings that were on the rise and Nick P also captured another to get 2/17 for the innings. Ben also contributed to the removal of the opposition's tail with the taking of a wicket. Jordan D had a great day behind the stumps to take 4 catches all up but it didn't come without some pain as Adam was given the ball and was able to get 2 wickets as a result of bowling with plenty of venom, so much so that a stray ball made it through Jordan's gloves to leave a bloodied reminder of what the pitch was capable of providing. We were able to come away from this game with plenty of confidence for our last encounter against Canterbury Wests.

Round 5
Lost against Canterbury West at GMO

Unfortunately Jordan D's luck with the toss wasn't improving and Canterbury West jumped at the chance to bat first. Our bowlers weren't quite hitting the mark and it took some great attack in the field to get our first wicket by a quality direct hit run out from Bryce. With a change to the bowling attack to Adam we were able to force an error for a catch to be taken by Harry. The opening batter was still turning over the score and before we knew it they were over 120 on the scoreboard until Nick P provided a gem of a ball to knock the stumps over. Harry with 1 wicket, Ben and Adam with 2 each all put in to capture the middle order of Canterbury West with the assistance Jordan D behind the stumps. At the end of the 60 overs we were only able to capture 7 wickets and they had wound the score up to 203. We were capable of getting the runs as long as we didn't panic. A lot of our top order got good starts but we had lost one additional wicket for the same amount of runs. It was good to see everybody contributing runs from Ben 36, Bryce 37, Harry 41, and

Jordan D 34. We were now in a good position but it was going to be a real nail biter. Could the tail wag enough to get us over the line? Nigel got a good start to his innings before getting run out. Nick S, Scott and Jordan W could only advance the score to 186 so it was up to Nick P and Alexander to bring us over the line. Unfortunately with 10 balls remaining and 3 runs to get we lost our last wicket. There would be no chance to advance to the semi's as we had now dropped to third place in our group.

Thank you to all the families for the great afternoon teas with Sutherland always setting a very high standard that other associations raved about. Finally as this is the final year of the boys' junior cricket I would like to take this opportunity to wish the boys all the best in the future in their cricketing careers.

Is an observant and talented cricketer. His leg-spin

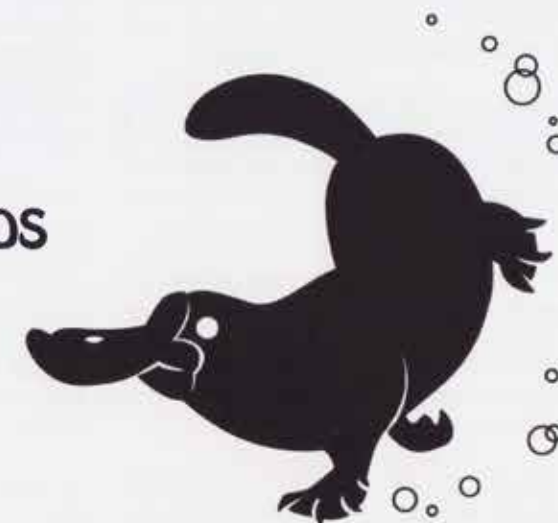
