Sutherland Hospital was bowled over by the generosity of young cricketers in the Sutherland Shire, who raised \$3,480 for the Gunyah (Oncology) Ward

The Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association held a 'Green and Gold' charity round on Saturday, 12 November, 2011, when all participants donated a gold coin or more.

According to Samantha Martin, Finance Officer for the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association, players, coaches and umpires wore green and gold arm bands and sweat bands.

"Some painted their faces green and gold, and some young players donned green and gold shirts instead of wearing traditional white," Ms Martin said.

"There was a strong community spirit on the day, with many of the 1,500 players registered to play in the Association pitching-in in imaginative ways. Some of the teams held barbeques, others sold green and gold merchandise, with profits going to the cause," she said.

Tina Kulevska, Nursing Unit Manager, Gunyah (Oncology) Ward at Sutherland Hospital, said staff were touched by the support from the young cricketers, aged from five to 16 years.

"The Gunyah Ward specialises in oncology and neurology, with patients receiving specialised care for cancer and stroke. Their generous donation will be used to buy medical equipment to assist with the rehabilitation of these patients." Ms Kulevska said.

The Caringbah Sports Cricket Club 12As won the right to present the \$3,480 donation to the Gunyah (Oncology) Ward by raising \$250, the largest amount from any team.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Season 2011-12 saw a continued focus on the development of club coaches, as well as development opportunities for players, through a number of initiatives.

The SSJCA, in conjunction with Cricket NSW, again promoted a series of Level 1 Coaching Courses at the start of the season. These were well attended and showed the commitment and enthusiasm coaches bring to their Clubs. The SSJCA remains committed to improving the accreditation rates of all coaches, both at the ITC base level required by CA, but also in achieving the SSJCA's preferred accreditation standards across our cricket formats.

Development of our coaches, along with our players, is a focus of the SSJCA in support of the overall targets of Cricket Australia and Cricket New South Wales. The tuture and strength of the SSJCA competitions relies primarily on the degree of volunteer participation at team level and enhancing their skills is critical. We are very fortunate with the number of coaching volunteers we

have in our competition and it is the responsibility of us all - the SSJCAS, the clubs and the individual - to see we support the ongoing development of this resource.

The U10 Development Squad proved extremely popular again with well over 50 players nominating for selection to the squad of 24. This season saw some further refinements to the program in an attempt to retain relevance of the program, as well as player and family interest and support:

Tom Croucher accepted the role of Progam Coordinator and this will hopefully bring some continuity to the role and the program over the next few seasons.

We also shifted our training programs to Friday evenings - hopefully better for both players and families, as well as coaches. This also allowed us to access alternative venues - this season we were fortunate to gain access to Glenn McGrath Oval and we thank the SDCC for that

opportunity.

We held two internal 40-over a side games and were fortunate to play a T20 Game on Glenn McGrath Oval - an increase in the 'game experience' offered in prior seasons.

With a continuation of our preference for higher coach:player ratios, we were able to maintain our small group structure, allowing more player-specific focus and small group skill development and activities. We thank our coaches – Tom Croucher, Darren Smith, Rick Johnson and Denis Tokic.

The continuing success of this program, and of our representative teams in the ages above, supports the SSJCA's decision to adopt a wider development program as opposed to fielding a smaller group of players in the interdistrict competition - a position lauded by CNSW who have openly recognised the benefits and successes of our program.

In2Cricket programs were again offered across the SSJCA and those Clubs and volunteers who hosted programs are to be congratulated. This activity provides a great pathway to introduce boys and girls to cricket.

The SSJCA also greatly appreciates the support and involvement of SDCC in the development of our junior cricket and looks forward to working together in future seasons, furthering both these and possibly expanded

opportunities. This relationship is one strongly supported. This season saw the offering of a specialist coaching clinic during the January break, and we hope further opportunities - to coaches and players of all levels - is something we can develop in tandem with the great support of SDCC.

Girts' cricket is an area of continuing development. It is hoped that more and more girls will get involved and that Clubs will actively encourage girls to enter the game and take advantage of the various pathways available to them. The SSJCA acknowledges the efforts of all Clubs who foster girls' involvement in cricket, along with the activities of the SRGCA, to develop girls' cricket within the Shire.

The above are the key highlights of this season's development programs and does not recognise the multitude of activities that are undertaken at team and Club level. The SSJCA appreciates the time and effort that all parents and Club officials put into the game on a weekly basis, including the activities that Clubs already undertake to assist in the development of their own coaches and players. The SSJCA acknowledges that more always can be done and that opportunities should exist for all players and coaches, whatever the age or grade. The SSJCA remains focussed on developing and providing these opportunities.



COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

addition to these positive very results it is also ment that across all ages and all grades players are the playing cricket and that overwhelmingly games being played in a great spirit and that we can be very of the good conduct of our players.

Here were two innovations this year:

- * Split Innings Cricket was introduced in 7 grades (10A, 10B, 12B, 12C, 12D, 12E and 14E) that play traditional Cricket. This meant that for both trains their batting was split over the two weeks of the match. Feedback on this has been very positive, with many players commenting that upending half the day in the field was good and that the change meant that they almost always got a bat or a bowl every week.
- The scheduling of matches was changed so that all Under 10 matches started at 8am and except for INA they were finished by 10am. The move to get an earlier start for younger age groups has also proven to be very popular.

Despite all the positives in SSJCA competitions the puzzle this year was that for the 2nd year in a row our numbers dropped after 7 years of steady growth. The reduced numbers are largely due to a drop in the number of new players. Feedback from clubs suggests that many parents have the perception that playing junior cricket takes all day on Saturday. As Under 8's last for 90 minutes and most Under 10's now finish by 10am we do need to convey this message better to the parents of potential players.

In the last 6 months the SSJCA has worked closely with Councit and the SSFA (Soccer) to develop a Five Year Plan to greatly improve the quality of all pitches and the area immediately surrounding the pitches. At the same time Council have created a Shire Sports Forum to work more closely with local sporting and recreational groups to better provide the needs of groups encouraging healthy and active living in the Shire. With these two occurrences we can look forward to an improvement in the quality of our fields, especially the area around the pitch.

Thank you to all players, parents and volunteers who have helped to make 2011-12 such an enjoyable and successful season. Thank you to everyone who has helped, even in the smallest manner. I hope that everyone has enjoyed their part and will be back for more next season.



However, the boys gained plenty of experience playing in rain with a heavy wet ball on swampy uncut grounds.

I would like to complement each of the boys, who turned up at training and competition games with the attitude to learn and improve their performance. It is a great pleasure to see the team working together and encouraging one another in the many difficult situations that the team found themselves in. Some highlights are listed below in the summary of the matches played with all the boys at some stage stamping their authority in

certain situations.


