While both our B3 & B5 were both defeated in their Finals our five junior teams were unable to take the field and therefore the highest qualifying teams were awarded the Premiership. Congratulations to our Minor Premier & Premier 12A team.

The season itself was a strong one with 11 junior competition teams and 4 senior teams. Most pleasingly we also had 19 boys and girls, making up 3 teams, participating in the Master Blasters program held at Kareela on Saturday mornings. Thank you to our 3 team coaches, Darren Chapman, Marty Field and Marty Manns who was awarded the Sydney Sixers "The Most dedicated/Committed Coach of the Master Blasters". A very special mention to Louise Laws who spent numerous hours recruiting and organising players for the program.

Though our numbers have remained fairly stable over the last couple of seasons, it seems we will need to do more to promote our wonderful game to increase or even maintain the participation rates. Concerning is the rapid decline of numbers of our neighbouring club up the road. To keep the game relevant, we need all clubs in the Sutherland Shire to be strong, especially in the Engadine and Heathcote areas. We have already instigated plans with Cricket NSW to reach out in various ways to promote the game.

Dragons had strong participation in the various representative teams. There were 26 players selected in junior representative teams and 13 current and ex Dragon's played in the Sydney grade competition. We also had 2 NSW Cricket Academy players, Maeve Martin and Kobey Freer.

I say this every year however it's true that a club cannot function without its volunteers. Thank you to our secretary Neil Croker. Neil must be one of the most hard-working club secretaries in the area. Not only does Neil provide hours and hours of support to the club, he is also involved in SSJCA representative team selections, this when he has no children involved with rep cricket. TREASURERS REPORT

While the season started a little later than normal it was great to see a full season completed. It was disappointing to see the wet weather at the end of the season interfere with the Finals for both Juniors and Senior competitions. Congratulations to all those who had a successful year.

During the year the club made an operating Profit of \$2,511.59 compared to last season profit of \$5,436.83 a decrease of \$2,925.24 over last year. The overall balances are very healthy at \$56,142.90.

Highlights include;


- Cash balances of \$56.142.90 up \$2,511.59 on last season.
- Income was \$37,717.70 down from \$39,282.01.
- Registration Fees down \$2,681.46 from \$29,952.64 to \$27,271.18 due to a decline in numbers.
- Sponsorships/Grants for the year were up \$3,324 to \$9,864 from \$6,540. Primarily due to grants received from Office of Sport \$5,664 to assist with the cost to repair the cricket nets, \$1,000 from Cricket NSW and \$1,000 from Cricket Australia. 2019/20 included a grant from Australian Cricket for the Shade tents of \$2,390.
- Uniform purchases were down \$1,449 to \$576 from \$2,025, likely due to lower registration numbers, continuation of online registrations and run out of old stock.
- Our Expenses were \$35,206.11 up \$1,360.93 compared to last season.
- Uniforms down \$1,628.40 to \$896.10 from \$2,524.50. Reduction due to lower Premiership numbers in 19/20.
- Our fees paid to the associations were down \$1,825.69 compared to last year mainly the result of lower player numbers.
- Cost of Balls were lower by \$1,960.79 due to less teams and using of prior period stock.
- Umpiring costs were up by \$1,295 compared to last season mainly due to 19/20 junior umpire fees paid in 20/21. Junior umpire Fees for 20/21 remain outstanding and will be paid in 21/22.
- Our Rent and clubroom costs were down \$764.04 compared to last year. This is due to rent relief from Sutherland Council due to COVID, as the complex was closed for 3 months and outstanding payment from last quarter.
- Other Sundries costs were significantly higher than last year by \$12,941.85. This includes repairs to the cricket net fencing of \$12,462.49, this was offset by a grant from Office of Sport for \$5,664.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether its sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players or parents. Everyone plays some part towards the success of the club.


Up until the last couple of seasons he had remained an active member of the Club organising our presentation trophies and raffles.




Matthew Russell

CURRENT JUNIOR CLUB RECORDS – 2018-19 ONWARDS

NOTE: In the season of 1991/92 the junior competition rules were changed as follows: from time limit to an over limit game, with restrictions on individual bowlers, the number of competition rounds were set at ten. In the younger age groups Introductory and Modified rules were introduced. In 2018/19 junior competition rules were changed by Cricket Australia as follows: the U10 & U12 competitions changed from two day matches to one day matches, the length of the pitch shortened, number of fielders reduced and compulsory retirement at a set number of balls faced by the batsman. In U14 & U16 competitions matches were limited to one innings per team. Because of these alterations the following EDCC junior club batting, bowling and wicket keeping records have been separated into three eras: 1959/60 to 1990/91, 1991/92 to 2017/18 and 2018/19 onwards. The senior batting, bowling and wicket keeping records remain unchanged from 1967/68 onwards.

Season 2020/21 saw this squad move up from U/12s cricket into the big leagues of the 14s. Boys had become young men and the intensity had grown considerably from kid's cricket. The season began exceptionally well for the group and we held our own against several teams fielding more experienced squads and into their second year in this age group. Going into the Christmas break we led the competition with 6 wins and only 2 losses and felt really comfortable. Our batsmen were scoring freely, the bowlers were taking the wickets and we were in cruise control. After the break we returned but we'd lost our mojo and the things that had seemed so easy early in the competition now seemed difficult. We limped into the finals on the back of only 1 win and 4 losses to finish in 3rd position. In the semi-final we were pitted against a strong Miranda Magpies outfit whom we had had a few close battles with throughout the regular season. The men rallied strongly, renewed their determination and a tough battle was reduced to a one horse race as the Mighty Dragons bowling attack decimated their batting line up leaving our batsmen a modest total to chase which they did with relative ease.

For the second year running we were off to the grand final and this time, very confident to earn the premier's trophy having beaten Bangor, the minor premier, twice earlier in the season.

Unfortunately for the U/14B team, a once in 100 year weather event struck and our grand final match was washed out by torrential rain and we were lamenting "what could have been". In the end, we can hold our heads up high. We played some outstanding cricket and most importantly had fun with our mates each Saturday morning.

The Engadine Dragons U/14B squad for season 2020/21 was:

Bradford Beencke: 196 runs at average of 15.08 with a high score of 48: 8 wickets at average of 20.75 and best of 3-17: 6 catches. When Bradford got himself going with the bat, he terrorised the opposition bowlers and there was no field large enough to contain his power. He clubbed many to the boundary rope and plenty over it. His style is not just slogging out to deep mid-wicket though; genuine cricket shots with good technique earned much respect. With the ball we saw Bradford improve tremendously and harness some of that aggression to regularly deliver bowling spells with devastating speed and accuracy. A great leader within this team he captained the team to our semi-final success.

Kyle Blakeney: 40 runs at an average of 4 with a high score of 15*: 6 wickets at average of 27.67 and best of 2-8: 1 catch. Kyle's goal for the season was to replicate his bowling form developed through the younger age groups but to tighten up the accuracy and not give cheap sundries. So often the spear head of our bowling unit, with a heavy work rate, he bowled with a beautiful action that achieved this goal and he conceded very few runs while taking several top order wickets at crucial times. Batting down the order, he was among our best between the wickets, sprinting through for quick singles and turning the slightest fumble by the opposition wicket keeper into a cheeky bye for the Dragons. So often an under rated skill, Kyle made huge improvement gains with his fielding regularly limiting a well-timed shot into only a single.

Oscar Burke: 9 runs at an average of 1.29 with a high score of 3: 6 wickets at average of 26.67 and best of 2-6. 1 catch: 1 run out. An amazing year for a cricket debutant. What Oscar achieved in his first year of cricket was truly remarkable and testament to his attitude and determination. At the start of the season, the coaches gave him a crash course in the skills - most of which take several years to develop. By the second half of the competition, Oscar was putting up his hand to open the batting. A fearless character and popular team man, his bowling efforts were truly special at times. He took a wicket in his very first match! On paper, batting runs may appear scarce but they don't tell the whole story as he regularly occupied the crease and assisted his partners to accumulate their innings.

Dashiel Delaney - Fielding: 81 runs at an average of 8.10 with a high score of 38*: 6 wickets at average of 20.83 and best of 2-8: 7 catches and 6 run outs. The is little to debate about who wins the <u>fielding award for the 14Bs</u> in season 20/21. Dash put the baseball mitt to one side and came across to give cricket a try and looked like he'd been playing for years. An outstanding fieldsman close to the wicket and in the outfield, he snared some classic catches and threw the stumps down with amazing regularity. Not just a one trick pony mind you; Dash looked at home at the crease and with the ball and was an excellent contributor in both aspects. His score of 38 not out vs Miranda in round 8 was a highlight that exuded class, power and poise.

Ethan Driscoll: 40 runs at an average of 5 with a high score of 12*: 5 wickets at average of 27.40 and best of 2-7: 3 catches and 1 run out. Don't let the laid back attitude of "JP" fool you. This guy is super determined, competitive and thrives when captaining and leading the team. Ethan was so often our middle order rock; occupying the crease, taking the singles and rotating the strike. He had an uncanny ability to dislodge a key opposition batsman with his swirling medium pace deliveries and really wound back the scoring rate and gave nothing away. In the field he was sharp as a tack snaring a few very good catches and turning certain opposition boundaries into rushed singles.

Jett Jones: 144 runs at an average of 14.40 with a high score of 27*: 5 wickets at average of 29.40 and best of 1-3: 1 catch. Jett capitalised on his strong first season to return in 2020/21 with a spring in his step. The improvement in all facets of his game but most notably his batting was out of sight. In addition, his attitude to training, development and competitive spirit made Jett a popular choice to earn the <u>Dragons 14B coaches award</u>. To rank 4th in cumulative runs for the season, amongst an excellent squad is outstanding. He may not have clubbed as many shots to the boundary but his graceful technique with the bat and lighting fast pace between the wickets ensured Jett got full value out of every innings.

Coby Keillor: 27 runs at an average of 3 with a high score of 9: 5 wickets at average of 25 and best of 1-8. Arguably the most popular member of the 14B team. Loved by his team mates and the coaching squad alike for his fierce determination, cheeky charisma and will to win. Coby was the perfect foil for our pace bowling attack with his looping spinners. Many opposition batsmen were lulled into a false sense of security when he came onto bowl but this guy had a wonderful knack of breaking a partnership by forcing an error. Down the order he saved our bacon on more than one occasion by grabbing those last few runs or holding up an end to keep the momentum on the side of the Dragons.

Rory Mesaglio: 31 runs at an average of 3.10 with a high score of 6*: 12 wickets at average of 13.33 and best of 3-5: 1 catch and 2 run outs. Season 2020/21 saw a significant improvement with Rory's bowling. He stepped up from the gentle trundler of seasons past to someone we really relied upon to restrict the scoring and take wickets. He regularly delivered spells early in the innings against their best batsmen without sundry and often knocked over an opener or two with superb line and length. With bat in hand in the middle order, Rory was always good for a quickfire batting performance and his fielding efforts were spot on.

Fred Morando: 316 runs at an average of 26.33 with a high score of 79: 13 catches and 1 stumping. Built very much in the Adam Gilchrist mould. Plenty of runs - scored quickly. Lots of catches - gloved safely. Fred's commanding haul of runs was more than enough to earn the <u>14B batting award this season</u>. He always looked like he had time at the crease even when facing the fastest of bowlers. The key to his success was an unflappable, graceful and powerful technique that saw the ball covering all parts of the wagon wheel. He stepped up as our full-time wicket keeper this season and was outstanding. Very few byes conceded and always over the bails to take the return throw from the outfield cleanly.

Tom Powell: 131 runs at an average of 13.10 with a high score of 26: 12 wickets at average of 8.17 and best of 5-9: 4 catches and 2 run outs. For most of the season Tom was in the mix to collect all 4 of our awards; batting, bowling, fielding and coaches! To sum it up we really need to reflect on round 7 vs minor premier Bangor when he scored 26 runs including 4 boundaries then took 5 wickets for 9 runs including a catch off his own bowling and no sundries. It was quite a day out... This was an outstanding season overall but a break out one with the ball, recording a ridiculously low average. Tom was particularly dangerous and used his height to send down some deliveries at a nasty length that were both intimidating and very difficult to score from.

Jake Rea: 67 runs at an average of 5.58 with a high score of 17: 15 wickets at average of 9.87 and best of 4-11: 9 catches and 3 run outs. Jake was the leader of our bowling armoury this season and is the worthy recipient of the 14B bowling award for season 2020/21. He was most devastating when batsmen were new to the crease, taking an uncanny number of wickets before they had scored and generally in quick succession with hauls of 2 or more scalps. Jake's ability in the field was sensational and he pouched many catches he had no right to take. Blessed with a rocket arm, he effected more

than his fair share of run outs too. With a strong defensive aptitude when batting, he often saw off the new ball and was rapid between the wickets to build his innings.

Oliver Te Hira: 157 runs at an average of 15.70 with a high score of 42: 10 wickets at average of 12.40 and best of 2-4: 3 catches and 2 run outs. A fearsome sight for the opposition bowlers when he was on a rampage, often building an innings with sheer force to club the ball to the boundary recording strike rates of 150+. With the ball he was also a handful, sending down bouncers that had batters ducking for cover and unwilling to play shots against. For a big guy, Ollie was remarkably agile in the field and excelled close to the wicket and was superb out in the deep whipping the ball back to the 'keeper accurately.

Leading into season 2020/21 the successful 14B's from last season began preparations with 3 new faces to the team. Due to salary cap restrictions and some age issues, we lost 2 from last season, only to pick up some quality replacements in Maeve, Mackay and Patty T (Tangles).

Squeezing 13 into 11 was made even more difficult with the format we were presented with at the start of the season, ie. all games to be 25 over a side one dayers. The Association eventually changed this to 30 over a side games by round 6, which made it slightly better, but not ideal for a team that relies heavily on sharing opportunities around.

A huge thank you to all the players and parents who understood the limitations and got on board with the coaches' philosophy.

Indeed, it probably wasn't till around Round 7 that we worked out the best way to approach each game. At this stage of the season we had won 2 and lost four and were in a bit of a rut. Our bowling was excellent in patches, but overall, lacked consistency and our batting was lacking intent, which is really important in limited over cricket.

To the kids' credit, they took on our new plan with vigour, looking at scoring 4 an over without too much risk, just lots of energy between the wickets, and bowling line and length to a set field. The returns were instant and resulted in four straight victories to put us back in the mixer for the semi-finals.

Between the rain and a few close results, we did enough in the remaining rounds to finish in 3rd position, and felt very comfortable with our opponent in St Pats 1, who had finished 2nd and had beaten us in 2 of the 3 meetings thus far.

Fittingly, the Semi Final started with a few old towels being stamped down at either end to sure up the bowlers run up after the usual Friday night shower. The damp outfield caused some uncertainty about decision time at the toss, but our team strategist had done plenty of homework and were adamant to send our opponents in. Captain Dundas obliged after winning the toss and St Pats put the pads on.

It was noticed that the said team strategist started heading for his car as the St Pats opening pair dispatched some poor bowling to all parts of the field to get off to a "flyer". Due to the draw and rain interruptions, we had only played Caringbah once, but had given them something to think about as the only team to have challenged them during the season.

While this was a shame for the kids, and relief for Caringbah, it certainly didn't take away from the season we had. Plenty of fun, lots learning and improvement, some outstanding performances and great camaraderie amongst the players and parents.

As a group, our bowlers led the way this year and often put us in competitive positions.

He was exceptionally sharp behind the pegs (16 dismissals and just 19 byes all season, easily the best keeper in the grade), led the team with distinction and tactical nous, and fostered a wonderfully positive team environment. It was very telling that, even after losing a match, it was our boys hanging around having a beer and a laugh together. Steve Hyem was a fantastic new addition to the squad this season. 6th on the batting aggregates, exceptionally sharp and positive in the field, and thoroughly committed to the cause. And the legendary Paul Dixon continued to be an example to us all - bowling his hand grenades, throwing himself around the field, "busting up his hand" on a number of occasions, and battling through heat exhaustion.

Just generally great blokes who encourage a love for the game for all the right reasons. Finally, as the season that followed the year of COVID, it was just good to be back playing sport. Good to be with your mates, good to be thinking about trying to nick someone off rather than the worries of life, good for the ol' mental health and just good for the soul. And that's what makes cricket so special and that's exactly why we'll back to do it all again in '21/22.

In came Eddie to join AJ at the crease with the game coming down to the last ball with six needed to win. AJ slapped the ball backward of square to the hoots and hollers of Eddie who was starting to spread his wings in joy as the ball sailed towards the far boundary! The umpire called six, and then changed his mind, to ask the fieldsman, who promptly signalled four, so that we lost by a run. Ecstasy turned to agony in a second. And then the war began. Tony made it clear that it 'doesn't happen this way in Wales', and the Gymea boys were adamant it was four. That is until some unnamed bowler from Gymea (Vikas Puribya) told Lachie at school that he was on the boundary, and it was definitely six, but they didn't want to call it. Gymea B5's is going off our Christmas card list this year!

A follow up loss to Bosco by 26 runs was highlighted by some of the unluckiest bowling from Eddie who had so many catches dropped that day.

By this time some results weren't going our way, and we were dropping out of finals contention even though we hadn't lost too many games through the year. This is where our character as a side would be further tested.

It was another wet Saturday afternoon at the renowned 'Akuna Pool' which saw us needing to play, and win. The pitch was underwater, but thanks to some amazing teamwork, especially by Thal and plumber dad, Cam, we got the strip ready. Thankfully we were met with an accommodating St Pats side who got the pitch ready for play also, following which Pete and Craig put on the partnership of the year with a 159 run stand for the first wicket, Craig ending with 71 off 94 and Pete 88 off 69 on a severely wet deck. Thanks to a great bowling performance by all the boys, but especially Adam, Rhys, Pete and Laythen we knocked them over 3 under the target for the bonus points, taking us into the final bye in third spot.

A loss by second place Bangor 5 in the penultimate round of the season made the equation clear going into the final round. Win, and hope Bosco don't lose outright to Bangor 5 and we make the final. Bosco did all they could to throw the game, but thankfully they only lost on first innings, as we managed a strong, and hard fought win against Bangor 3 who had beaten us convincingly earlier in the season. We scored 7/253 thanks to a great partnership by AJ (67 off 130) and Jez (66 off 82) and a cameo from Steve (37 off 27 with three zacs). A tight effort in the field saw us bowl Bangor 3 out for 179 with 4/27 off 16 for Steve and wickets to Rhys, the Brownscombe boys and Adam. Jeremy broke another bail with some over-zealous keeping (though it may have been that the bail was sick of his talking so was looking to 'call in sick')

This put us into the final against a strong Bosco side at the WHO. Knowing the weekend was going to be full of rain on day two, we had to drive the game, so won the toss, and against conventional wisdom in the final, bowled first. Steve's opening spell saw their best bat out in the first over while Pete chimed in from the other end. Then it was over to the spinners who tied up the middle overs, with Adam (0/18 off 10) and Lachie (1 for 11 off 10) bowling brilliantly. They got away from us a little in the final 20, scoring 217 all out. Nathan ended up with 3/32 and Steve 4/52 off 16 overs.

Day two was full of rain and wind, compared with the heat of day 1. Bosco weren't keen to get on, and the umpire had clearly just done a course in risk management, not looking like he wanted to get us on at all! Finally, we got on and Pete and Craig put on a 79 run partnership for the first wicket, before Pete was out for a well made 48. Sadly, a couple of quick wickets including the devastating mix

up and run out of the season's best batsman, Craig, resulted in a slowing of the run rate, and though Lachie scored a lovely 43, it wasn't enough, and we lost by 50 runs in the final.

We were not disgraced, well in contention in the final, and falling just short of the 50th premiership for the club. As was said many times, it was a test of character, and though the result didn't go our way, the character shown was inspiring.

Considering where we had come from the previous year, this was an amazing season for our side. Most notable was the teamwork, camaraderie, mateship and encouragement of the team. For a mix of old blokes and young bucks, we gelled beautifully as a side, giving everyone one of the most enjoyable seasons in recent memory.

In personal highlights, Craig scored the most runs in the comp with 450, and Steve the second most wickets in the comp with 26, however they were far from solo contributors. Indeed, MyCricket rated our side as having not only having the top three players in the grade, but six of the top ten.

Pete, Lachie, AJ, Jez, Gaz, Steve, Jesse and Nathan all chipped in with important contributions and partnerships through the year with the bat. Likewise, with the ball, Nathan, AJ, Lachie, Pete, Adam, Eddie and Rhys all took wickets, while Tony remained with the best average of 0.00, even though the catch taken was on the boundary and was like intercepting an exercet missile. In all seriousness though, the culture of the side was seen clearly as Jockey would turn up to each game, (regardless of his ongoing alleged legal battle with the skipper!) even following a hip replacement, just to cheer the boys on. Thal, Sean, Rob and Connor rounded out a squad that was more about the culture of the team and enjoyment than it was about any personal highlights. Each of the boys, from the top of the order right through saw at least one personal highlight and improvement in their game, and we made the final as a 'squad', a tight squad, which had the recipe for success. Hats off to the whole squad! Love your work gents!

Next year we hope to see Eddie flying those wings, AJ collecting more in the swear jar, a few more of Jez's stories, as well as runs from all the boys, wickets for everyone and for us to go one step further than 2020-21.

Massive thanks to Pete for skippering us so well this year. He is a calm head under pressure, and an even better bloke. Thanks Pete. Keeping it all in the family, Justine Garment scored every single ball of our season this year, and did so 'live' so even if we weren't in the side, we could follow from wherever we were. We'd be lost without you Justine, thank you!

Thanks, boys, for an enjoyable year. Until next season, stay patient, persistent, and slow to anger!

PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA (Amended May 2020)

GUIDELINES

The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.

Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final match has been played or any other such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

In the absence of nominations, the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.

The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge exceptional circumstances or to provide encouragement. The Management Committee may also adjust criteria's from season to season to reflect changed conditions of play.

All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

All perpetual trophies remain the property of Engadine Dragons Cricket Club. All perpetual trophies must be returned in good order to the Club Secretary at such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

ADMENDMENTS

Due to the implementation of Cricket Australia Junior Cricket Stage 1 in 2018/19 and the subsequent changes to the U10 playing format our Club decided to no longer award U10 "Individual Team Awards". Instead, all U10 players shall be presented with a participation trophy. It was also decided that U10 players will be ineligible to be awarded "Performance Awards" or "Special Club Awards". The Club has introduced the "Most Consistent U10 Player" trophy to recognise the most consistent performance by an U10 player. The "Junior Division" has been amended to only represent U12 teams and players, while the "Intermediate Division" remains unchanged and still represents U14 & U16 teams and players.

GENERAL CRITERIA

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the assessing and determination of awards, the following criteria shall apply when read in conjunction with each award criteria.

- For each 10 runs scored 1 point
- For each wicket taken 1.3 points
- For each wicket keeping catch 1 point
- For each wicket keeping stumping 1 point
- For each fielding catch 1 point
- For each unassisted run out 1 point

PARTICIPATION AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Master Blasters and U10 Teams

All U8 Master Blasters and U10 players will be presented with a participation trophy.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions

For all U12, U14 and U16 teams engaged in SSJCA competitions there will be four awards presented per team. The awards are - Batting, Bowling, Fielding (including wicket keeper) and Coaches. For batting, bowling and fielding all awards shall be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team. Batting — runs scored, Bowling — wickets taken and Fielding — non wicket keeping catches, wicket keeping catches, stumpings and unassisted run outs. These aggregates will be derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition round, but exclusive of Finals Series.

- In the case of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average shall be awarded the trophy.
- In the case of more than one fielder/wicket keeper sharing the highest aggregate the player greater number of catches shall be awarded the trophy.
- In the case of one player achieving both the highest batting and bowling aggregate the award shall be determined by using the "General Criteria". The highest calculated points in either batting or bowling shall determine which award is presented. The remaining award either batting or bowling shall be presented to the player with the next highest aggregate.
- In the case of either the batting or bowling award winner also achieving the greatest number of fielding /wicket keeping dismissals the fielding award shall be presented to the fielder with the next highest aggregate of fielding/wicket keeping dismissals.

The Coaches award will be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager).

No one person may be presented with more than one of the above four awards.

Senior Division

For all teams engaged in SSCA competition cricket there shall be two awards presented per team. The awards are — Batting and Bowling. For batting and bowling all awards shall be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series.

• In the event of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average shall be awarded the trophy.

In addition, consideration shall be given by the Management Committee to recognizing "all rounder" skills where the efforts of an individual player provide justification for an all-rounder award. As a guide, minimum 200 runs scored and 15 wickets taken or minimum 200 runs scored and 12 wicket keeping dismissals (catches/stumpings). In the event of a bowler/wicket keeper qualifying the

standard is set as 200 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. All team awards shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from the official Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series.

PERFORMANCE AWARDS

Batting Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

<u>Junior Division (U12)</u> <u>Intermediate Division</u> <u>Senior Division</u>

"The Ray Noakes Trophy" "The Russ Waddell Trophy" "The Drew Lake Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the greatest number of runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

Bowling Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

<u>Junior Division</u> (U12) <u>Intermediate Division</u> <u>Senior Division</u>

"The Col Keenan Trophy" "The Alf Lemmon Trophy" "The John Carlisle Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

Wicket Keeping Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

Junior Division (U12) Intermediate Division Senior Division

"The Mike Fordyce Trophy" "The Clem Heffernan Trophy" "The Col Berry Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of wicket keeping dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined by the lowest average of byes to dismissals.

Fielding Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

<u>Junior Division</u> (U12) <u>Intermediate Division</u> <u>Senior Division</u>

"The Paul Waddell Trophy" "The Greg Heffernan Trophy" "The Greg Knowles Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the fielder is credited with the greatest number of fielding dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will be the aggregate of all fielding catches and unassisted run outs credited to the fielder derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on the most catches taken.

CLUB AWARDS

Most Improved Team

"The Bob Vannan Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager)

Determined by the Management Committee and awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be taken into account.

Encouragement Shield

"The Bob Price Shield"

(Perpetual shield and personal shield)

Nominations are sought and awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee the award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will take into account age, performance, level at which played, years of experience, commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricket to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Junior Rookie of the Year

"The Ken Tever Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee in consultation with the team coach and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to a player who has competed in their first season of competition cricket and has displayed a high level of skill and ability. There is no weighting for grade. The "General Criteria" set above excluding run outs shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Rookie of the Year

"The Bill Knowles Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds including first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to a player who is ineligible for junior cricket and has competed in their first season as a senior cricketer and has displayed a high level of skill and ability. There is no weighting for grade. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award

Most Consistent U10 Player

"EDCC Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to the most consistent U10 player, who through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive in the SSJCA U10 competition. The "General Criteria" set above <u>excluding run outs</u> shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Player of the Month Award

(Personal trophy)

At the completion of each month of the season one player from each of the U10, U12, Intermediate and Senior division who has achieved the best performance shall be awarded the "Player of the Month". No player can receive the award more than once in a season. If two performances in the one division are deemed equal the Management Committee may use its digression to reward both efforts. Management Committee reserves the right to not award a "Player of the Month" if in their assessment the performance in any of the divisions does not deserve recognition.

EDCC Service Awards

(Memento awarded)

Club Service Awards were introduced in 1996-1997. Service Award acknowledges continuous club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards are in periods of five years – five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS

Intermediate Club All Rounder

"The Ian Latham Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in the Intermediate Division. As a guide the following qualification apply — minimum 150 runs scored and 12 wickets taken or minimum 150 runs scored and 8 wicket keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 150 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 12 dismissals. The criteria shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and shall be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Club All Rounder

"The Dean Griffith Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in Junior/Intermediate Divisions. As a guide the following qualification apply, minimum of 200 runs scored and 15 wickets taken or minimum 200 runs scored and 12 wicket keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 200 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. A player who represents the club in more than one senior team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Club Member of the Year

"The Val Tever Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy & personal gift)

Nominations are sought in writing and determined by the Management Committee and awarded to a club member who gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the Club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Executive Committee shall determine the recipient.

Junior Club Champion

"The Barry McManus Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of all competition rounds, but exclusive of Finals Series. Awarded to the most outstanding U14 or U16 cricketer through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSJCA Competition. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Club Champion

"The Harry Robbins Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who through their efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Life Membership

(Life Membership Badge)

In considering any such nomination the committee will be guided by the Club Constitution, in particular – Membership Part No.2 – 2.7 Life Membership –

- (a) A Life member is a club member awarded the honorary title of Life Member for outstanding services to the Club.
- (b) There shall be for the purposes of recognising outstanding service two streams of entry to Life Membership, playing service and administrative service.
- (c) Consideration for Life Membership may only be exercised when the nominee has given no less than 25 years service to the club as Playing Member (as defined in Rule 2.2) or, no less than 10 years service to the club as a Committee Member, or some other Club support service of a non-playing nature.
- (d) Consideration for Life Membership will be undertaken in the first instance by the Management only upon receipt of a written nomination containing reasons in support. Any club members may make such nomination to any member of the Management Committee.
- (e) The Management Committee will examine all such nominations and in exercising absolute discretion accept or reject any nomination. Any decision taken is neither subject to explanation nor appeal.
- (f) The Management Committee determines for approval that the nominee is worthy of the honour proposed, shall advise members at the next general monthly meeting. That recommendation shall contain details of the service given by the nominee and justification for the action proposed. Approval being a majority vote.

- (g) A Life Member whose award derives from 25 years playing service shall henceforth pay no playing fee to the Club beyond that which the Club will impose to cover costs associated with Association registration, insurance and any other like matter.
- (h) A Life Member shall pay no fees to the Club (with the exception set out above in Rule 2.7(g)) and shall be entitled to vote at any club meeting and receive any special consideration as the Management Committee may determine.
- (i) Each life member shall be presented with a suitably designed Life Membership badge.
- (j) A Life member is subject to the rules and regulations and Code of Conduct of the Club.

<u>Please Note</u>: The definition of playing service is the number of years/seasons completed, which has met the Association's qualifications of eligibility to play in their final series. The Management Committee may make considerations on the grounds of injury or other issues that may have caused ineligibility.
