- A shorter and faster version of cricket has seen the emergence of the 20/20 game. Whilst it did not cause the same controversy as the World Series Cricket (1977), it has created further interest in cricket for players and spectators especially amongst the younger age group.
- Cricket Australia recommended changes in playing conditions to increase player participation in our junior ranks. Whilst it is the early stages, reduction in hours of play, bowler's restrictions and batsman paired to a number of overs has forced changes to club and representative cricket alike. This strategy is to be reviewed overtime to see if desired player retention or player development is achieved.
- The wider acceptance and coverage of Women in sport at the elite level. Engadine Dragons have supported women in our junior teams, which have allowed them to follow their sporting endeavours.

We are a proud and successful club that will continue to provide a platform for all to enjoy their sport and develop long-term friendships. Our successes have come in many forms and we are especially chuffed that our players continue to represent at all levels of our game.

I hope that you enjoy the tales and information contained in this book.

Our sincere gratitude to our Life Member Ian Latham for compiling this chapter in our history.

THE BEGINNINGS

The first organised competitive cricket in the Shire dates back to 1921 where it continued until 1937 when, due to certain circumstances, it was disbanded. In 1947 the competition reformed. In the season of 1956/57 a small number of juniors (6 teams) were playing in the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association (SSCA), the senior association. They played in a "C Grade" competition. It was this, which led to the creation of a specific boy's association in 1957/58 to cater for all players under the age of sixteen. Engadine was not part of this body at the outset but joined in 1959.

Barry McManus (Snr) was a local roof tiler and bricklayer who loved his rugby league and cricket. Barry formed the Cricket Club in 1959 with support from Alan Hemmett and Reg Lingard, coached two teams of youngsters in the local Aussie Rules Competition in 1958. The following winter season the boys decided to play Rugby League, which led to the birth of the Engadine Dragons Rugby League Club.

To keep the boys together in the summer of 1959/60, Barry decided to enter three teams U10, U12 and U14 into the Sutherland Shire Boys Cricket Association. The U/10 side coached by Danny Carroll was graded into the Division 2 competition and the U/12 coached by Barry McManus (Snr) and U/14 coached by Bob Bain teams were both graded into the Division 1 competition. All three sides finished the season as runners up.

In the first Engadine Dragons Annual Report Barry stated, "We now own 150 pounds of football gear and 80 pounds worth of cricket gear. Properly maintained this gear has many more years of use, and we can go into our second season as a well established club". He also made reference to the contributions of his wife Ada in her role as U/12 team manager, Mrs. Carroll as U/12 team scorer, Ken & Marie Binner who would go from ground to ground to distribute drinks and a band of fathers that would umpire each week, Dave Moss, Jack Shanahan, Fred Terone (Snr) and George Cranston. George went on to coach for the Club for the next decade.

The structure of the Engadine Dragons has changed over the years, from 1959 to 1968, cricket activity was part of the Engadine Dragons Rugby League Club. In 1967 due to the growth of teams in both rugby league and cricket it was decided to form two separate committees to run each individual sport. The first members of the separate cricket committee were, President – Ken Horsnell, Secretary – Barry Blanchard & Treasurer – Warren McPhee. In 1969 cricket became part of a larger "Engadine Dragons Sports Club" organization, which comprised many sporting bodies (Soccer, Netball, and Hockey to mention a few). Then subsequently, in 1974, following the dissolution of the former body it became what it is today, Engadine Dragons Cricket Club.

The title "Dragons" originated from the famous St. George Rugby League Club and the original colours of the club were red and black. The Dragons first home ground "Engadine Oval" was located in the National Park about 800 metres east of the Railway station. The pitch is still there, but the playing area is overgrown with shrubs and long grass. Vic McGarigle, the Stationmaster, allowed the club to store the cricket kits and mats in the Lost Property Office. As there were no facilities such as dressing sheds, toilets and fresh water, it was decided to support the construction of a new oval (now known as Anzac Oval) alongside Forbes Creek; the oval was first used for a cricket match in 1960.

The decision to form senior teams came in 1967 and culminated from a series of events that created a lot of controversy and ill feeling amongst the members of the two local senior clubs, Engadine Hotel and Southern United. In the previous three seasons these two clubs consisted of the Shire's top players, with both clubs finishing either first or second in the A1 competition.

Seven of these players that represented in Sutherland's Martin Shield team decided to have both Engadine Hotel and Southern United hold separate meetings in an attempt to dissolve both clubs and form a combined club to be named "Engadine United", enabling them all to play together. Their other aim was to develop and advance younger players through the grades giving them the opportunity to play in the A1 competition and if capable play for the Sutherland District Grade Club.

The majority of members in each club agreed to the merger, but because of the objections from a small minority it decided to continue as two separate clubs. With this decision Harry Robbins and Barry Blanchard, together with Col Keenan then decided to approach Engadine Dragons for permission to form senior teams within the existing (junior) club.

In 1967/68 season the Club fielded its first senior team in the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association (SSCA) competition. The club applied for the A1 competition, but were graded A2's, they finished the season as undefeated premiers.

① PRESIDENTS REPORT

ENGADINE DRAGONS FIRST ANNUAL MEETING

It is with great pleasure, and a certain amount of pride, that I present the First ever ^{ANNUAL} report of Engadine Dragons, and I am quite sure it is only a fore runner of many more Annual Reports in years to come as this Club grows with the District. We have surmounted our greatest hurdle, namely our initial year in which we started from scratch without any funds or gear. I am very happy to report that we have finished our first year with all our sporting equipment paid for, and a credit balance in our Bank Account. A full account of our income and expenditure will be presented in the Treasurers report. We now own £150.0.0 worth of football gear and £80.0.0 worth of cricket gear. Properly maintained this gear has many more years use, and we can go into our second year as a well established club. It is all the more remarkable when one looks back just on 10 months to our inaugural meeting, and remember that we had to borrow £20 from Mr. Bill Coates to pay a deposit on our football gear. The above results have been achieved with a ridiculously small, but very active committee, and the good support of the people of Engadine, and also the work of the boys themselves who ~~play for~~ represent this Club on the Playing fields. Touching on the Committee first, an average attendance at monthly meetings would not exceed six persons. I sincerely hope that we can

get more active support from Parents of the boys playing and any other interested persons. We have been inundated with requests from lads wanting to play in our teams, but unfortunately finance to procure gear, and also lack of managers to look after boys restricted our activities. This coming year we hope to double our number of teams in both cricket and football, but this can only be done with more active help from the adults of Engadine. The present Committee has been grossly overworked to raise finance and provide transport and supervise the sport itself. We hope this position can be alleviated this coming year. To the people of Engadine who have supported us go our many thanks. This includes the house holders who have bought raffle tickets from our youngsters at their door, and to the customers of Mr Harry Lynch's Hostelry, who have donated to a weekly contribution list in a really amazing fashion. Our boys appreciate their great support. We have had a lot of individual donations, which were greatly appreciated, but it would not be a true report unless several persons were mentioned. To the Engadine Chamber of Commerce for their substantial donation early in our activities, many thanks. To Messrs Harry Lynch, Bill Melrose, Harry Trinder and Herbie Lamb, go our thanks for their very substantial donations to buy trophies for our football teams and help towards cost of gear. Ourselves and the

boys really appreciated their generosity. Last, but not least, thanks to Mr. Tom Jamieson who has been a regular donator, and has given a great amount of money towards the Engadine Dragons. Many thanks Tom. The boys themselves have not been idle in the matter of raising money. They have been very keen workers in selling raffle tickets for the Club. To the actual sport itself, the boys of Engadine have made quite an impression on rival clubs, not only in their ability on the field of play, but also in their behavior on and off the field. We entered four teams in the Rugby League Schoolboys Competition and two of them made the Semi-Finals. These were the 1st 7½ team, 1 6-7 team. These two teams also made the Grand Finals of the Knock-out competition, and were both beaten in finals. This was a great performance for first year in, and we can look forward to highly successful season this coming season. The boys showed great potential to do so well, but the main credit must go to our coaches Messrs. S. Wellman and H. Heene. ~~and~~ Both these gentlemen put in a lot of hard work with the boys during week to prepare them for their week end matches and must have derived a lot of satisfaction at end of season when they saw the results of their many hours put in with these boys. ^{able} assistance was given to coaches by

Messrs. ^{ADRIE CROSBY} Col. Sheenan, Col. Grimwood, and Arthur Bruken, Two boys who showed a touch of class were Warren Harries and Robert Walker, and we should see some really good football from these lads this year. In the cricket sphere our boys have done equally as well, all teams being near the leaders in respective divisions. Many thanks to Messrs. George Cranston, Dave Moss, Jack Shanahan and Fred ~~Reore~~, who have given a certain amount of time to assist in umpiring on Saturday mornings for our boys. Jack and Fred travel from Waterfall to do this job, and it is much appreciated by Engadine Dragons. The boys are well looked after in cricket. Mr. Danny Carroll has not missed a Saturday morning with the under 10 team and is really wrapped up in them. In the under 12 team we have the unique position of two ladies looking after boys. Mrs. McManus is manager and at times has umpired, and Mrs. Carroll is the scorer. Both these ladies neglect their housework and husbands, so that the boys can have their sport. Mr. Bob Bain has looked after under 14 team, and the boys are doing well. Mr and Mrs. Ken Binner have done a great job with the drinks, running a shuttle service from ground to ground in

THE PEOPLE WHO FORGED OUR CLUB

In 1999 Harry Robbins wrote “Engadine Dragons Cricket Club – A Proud History in Sutherland Shire Sport” which commemorated the first 40 years of our club. As a tribute Harry wrote about the families & individuals that contributed to the success of the club during this period.

In consultation with Harry I have now written a few lines to acknowledge those that have followed in the next 20 years and have included a revised version of Harry’s original summary for the families and individuals that contributed in the first 40 years and expanded on those that have bridged the two eras.

It is only fitting that the first two tributes go to Barry McManus (senior) the founder of the Club and Harry Robbins the longest and most loyal serving member of the Club.



Barry McManus (senior)

Barry McManus joined the Militia in 1938 and left Australia on February 4, 1941 on board the Queen Mary bound for Malaya. Barry became a prisoner of war in February 1942 and spent six months in the Changi prison camp before being sent to Thailand to work on the infamous Thai - Burma railway, which was completed in 1944. The last twelve months of the war he spent working in the copper mines on the island of Shijoku, just off Japan. Barry’s fortitude and courage enabled him to survive the horrendous hell camps in which he was imprisoned for nearly four years.

Barry married Ada in 1946, moving to Engadine in 1948. Working as a roof tiler and bricklayer until his war injuries forced an early retirement. As the population of Engadine grew, Barry and Ada realised there was a real need for something to be done to give boys an opportunity to participate in playing sport and so began the formation of the Engadine Dragons. Barry was the Club’s President for both Cricket and Rugby League from 1959 to 1963 and was duly honoured with life membership by both clubs.

In 1960 to 1962 he was Secretary of the Boys Committee for the Sutherland Shire division of the St. George Junior Rugby League and also delegate to the St. George Junior Rugby League. Then, in 1963, the Cronulla Sutherland Junior League and the Sharks Grade Club were formed with Barry as Secretary of the Sharks 2nd division team in their formation year. The Cronulla Sutherland Junior League rewarded his services with life membership.

Barry was also a committeeman with the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association from 1960-1963 and also coached Representative teams as well as coaching our club teams, with his wife Ada doing the scoring. Barry was also involved with the RSL movement in which he served with great distinction for countless years.

Some of his achievements were –

- Life Membership of RSSAILA
- Life Membership of Engadine RSL Memorial Club
- Past President of both these bodies.
- Life Membership of Engadine RSL Fishing Club.

Barry was also deeply involved with the welfare and legacy functions of the RSL movement.

In 1997 the ‘Junior Club Champion’ trophy was perpetuated in his name.

Barry (Snr.) passed away on May 25, 1993.

Son Barry (junior) played junior cricket with the club from 1959 to 1965, coached junior teams for a number of seasons and was the club's first "Junior Club Champion" in 1962/63. Barry represented the SSJCA for 6 seasons and in 1964/65 was awarded the "SSJCA Cricketer of the Year" after scoring 578 runs at an average 72.25 and taking 37 wickets. Barry went on to play for the Sutherland District Cricket Club. Barry's sons Kaine and Mark played for the club with Barry returning to play senior cricket with both boys. Barry's grandson Deakin Struthers has just played his first season of cricket for the club.



Harry Robbins

Harry's first cricket involvement within the Sutherland Shire started way back in 1947 playing for the Heathcote Cricket Club. In 1949 Harry took over from his father Phillip as the Club Secretary of the Heathcote Cricket Club. In the early 1950's he joined the North Cronulla Cricket Club and from 1949 to 1953 he captained the SSCA Telegraph Shield Team and continued through the 1950's and 1960's as a regular member of the SSCA Martin Shield team, on many occasions as captain.

In 1964 he joined the Engadine Dragons Cricket Club and in 1967-68 Harry with assistance of Col Keenan and Barry Blanchard was instrumental in establishment of the Club's first senior cricket. Success was immediate with the A2 team winning the premiership in its fledgling season followed by three consecutive A1 premierships. Harry played seniors with the Club from day one before retiring at 52.

During the glory days of the 1970's Harry was known to all as "Mr Engadine Dragons" which says it all. Harry's three sons Phillip, Peter and Ken all played junior cricket for the club with Ken representing the SSJCA in their 1973/74 Foster Shield No.2 team and Phil captaining the 1967-68 12B Premiers team. Phil and Ken also played seniors for the Club.

Some of his achievements were –

- Secretary for 7 seasons. (1973/74, 74/75, 76/77, 77/78, 81/82, 82/83, 83/84)
- Treasurer for 1 season. (1966/67)
- Property Officer for 14 seasons. (1964/65 to 1977/78)
- Wrote articles for the local newspaper for 32 seasons commencing 1964/65.
- Newsletter Editor for the first 5 seasons of publication commencing 1964/65.
- Coaching junior teams for 27 seasons. (11 Premierships and 6 Runners Up)
- Club coach for 5 seasons. (2001 to 2006)
- Ran School Holiday coaching clinics for 7 seasons. (2004/05 to 2010/11)
- Club delegate to the SSJCA for 8 seasons. (1973 to 1979) & (1981 to 1984)

After coaching countless premiership teams over the years the 2006/07 10A Premiership victory at the age 76 years showed Harry had lost none of his ability to guide teams at the highest level. In 2008 Harry hung up his coaching boots, but still continued to help out teams where ever he could and was still actively contributing to the Club by writing his “Around the Grounds” column in the Club Newsletter and in the local paper. Ill health in 2014 saw Harry’s 65 years of active contribution to cricket in the Sutherland Shire come to an end.

They say behind every good man there’s a good woman and in Harry’s case that woman was his wife Heather, another staunch worker for the Club typing the Club Newsletter in the early years as well as being a hard working member of the social committee in the 1970’s and 1980’s. Heather sadly passed away July 26, 2016.

Commencing in 1984/85 Brett played 26 years seasons of cricket for our club, which included 8 consecutive seasons playing juniors and represented the SSJCA in their 1984/85 Foster Shield team. Brett coached junior teams for 5 seasons starting in 1998/99 going on to captain the same boys as they entered the senior ranks. In 2019 Brett was awarded Life Membership of the Club.

Alewood

Mick played senior cricket with the club in the 1960’s and was a member of our first A1 premiership team. Mick assisted in coaching our junior teams and his sons Craig and Mike both played for the club with Craig being awarded “Senior Club Champion” in 1980/81. Craig’s sons Daniel and Bryce also played junior cricket for the Club with Bryce awarded the “Junior Division Wicket Keeping Performance Trophy” in 2001/02.

Alterator

Phil coached junior teams for 5 seasons and also managed for 2 seasons as well as being a member of the clubs grading committee for 4 seasons. His son Nathan played junior cricket for the club and went on to captain senior sides. Nathan was awarded ‘The Robert Tickner Encouragement Trophy’ in 1992/93 and the “Barry McManus Memorial Shield” in 1995/96. He served as the Senior Registrar in 2005/06 and coached junior teams for 3 seasons with two of his sides being awarded the “The Most Improved Team” in 2003/04 and on the second occasion in 2006/07 with his father Phil as manager.

Atkins

Warren coached junior teams and captained the “Old Buffer” teams to premierships and was the “Senior Club Champion” in 1973/74. His sons Steven and Bradley both played junior cricket for the Club.

Bailey

Three brothers Alan, Trevor and Mick played for our club in the 1960’s. Trevor was the “Junior Club Champion” in 1967/68 and represented the SSJCA.

Berry

Col is the club’s second longest serving player with 35 season commencing 1978/79 and was awarded “Outstanding Junior in Men’s Cricket” in 1980/81. Col was Vice President for 3 seasons from 2002/03 to 2004/05 and has been Treasurer for 13 seasons commencing in 2005/06. Col was

awarded Life Membership in 2009 with the “Senior Wicket Keeping Performance Trophy” being named in his honour. All three sons Tim, Matthew and Joshua all played junior and senior cricket for the club. In 2015/16 season Tim set a club record for the highest innings with 339 not out and at the same time with brother Matthew set the record for the club’s highest ever partnership of 329. Tim set two more club records as the first Dragon’s player to break 1000 runs in a season with 1083 runs @ 90 and scored the most centuries in one season with 5 and was awarded the SSCA “Batting Aggregate”, “Batting Average” and “Cricketer of the Year”. Tim also received the “Intermediate Wicket Keeper Performance Trophy” back to back 2010/11 & 2011/12, “Senior Batting Performance Trophy” in 2015/16 and “Senior Fielding Performance Trophy” in 2017/18. Josh was awarded “Junior Wicket Keeper Performance Trophy” and “Junior Batting Performance Trophy” in 2010/11 and the “Intermediate Wicket Keeper Performance Trophy” in 2012/13. Tim and Matthew have represented the SSCA in the Telegraph Shield team for the past 4 seasons commencing in 2015/16. The 4 Berry family members have a combined playing service of 85 seasons, the most of any family to play for the club.

Blanchard

Barry along with Col Keenan assisted Harry Robbins to establish the Club’s first senior cricket. Barry captained the club’s first 4 seasons of Senior ‘A’ grade teams to premierships. Barry held positions of President in 1972/73, Secretary in 1967/68 & 1968/69, SSCA Club delegate and coached junior teams for 2 seasons.

Bland

John coached junior teams for 3 seasons and was the winner of the “Most Improved Team” award in 1975/76. Son Peter was awarded “Top Club Batsman” in 1979/80 and in 1981/82 was awarded “Top Under Sixteen Batsman” and “Junior Club Champion”. Peter represented the SSJCA in every age group before going on to play for the Sutherland District Grade Cricket Club, then returning to the Club in our A1 team.

Brownscombe

Craig played both junior and senior cricket for the club and has coached junior teams for 6 seasons. Craig was awarded the “Robert Tickner Encouragement Trophy in 1987/88 and in 1994/95 he was awarded “Top Under Sixteen Batsman”, “Top Boys Club Batsman” and “Junior Club Champion”. Craig represented SSJCA for 6 seasons in their Shield teams and was selected in the Sutherland District Cricket Club Green Shield side in 1994/95. Craig’s three sons Lachlan, Zachary and Mitchell have all played junior cricket for the club with Lachlan also representing the SSJCA in their Moore Shield team.

Carlisle

John was Treasurer for 13 consecutive seasons commencing in 1992/93 and was awarded Life Membership in 2002 with the “Senior Bowling Performance Trophy” being named in his honour. Son Stephen played junior cricket for the club and was awarded the “Top Boys Club Bowler” in 1994/95. Stephen represented the SSJCA for 4 seasons and was selected in the Sutherland District Cricket Club Green Shield team in 1994/95. Matthew is also the club’s most successful spin bowler taking over 500 wickets with the best bowling figures of 9 for 16 in 2005/06.

Graham was one of the NSW leading leg spin bowlers in the 1960's playing with Cumberland, St. George and Sutherland District Cricket Club, scoring 150 runs in his last grade match. He captained our A1 team to premierships and coached junior teams for 2 seasons winning the "Most Improved Team" award in 1978/79. Graham went on to umpiring grade cricket after finishing his cricket career. His son Peter also played junior cricket with the club and represented the SSJCA in their Foster and Cawsey Shield teams.

Cranston

George was one of the original stalwarts in the early years coaching for 7 seasons and captaining senior sides. George's wife Pat was a regular scorer in both junior and senior cricket. Son Ian played 13 seasons for the club and represented the SSJCA in every age group. "Crano" was the first example of a "True Blue" Dragon cricketer, coaching junior teams for 4 seasons with great success, playing senior cricket and was awarded "Junior Club Champion" in 1972/73. He represented the Sutherland District Cricket Club in their 1973/74 Green Shield team, then going on to play grade cricket. Ian returned to the club to play in our A1 teams and was awarded the "Senior Club Champion" in 1984/85.

Croker

Neil joined our committee in 2009/10 and has served as Club Secretary (current) for 9 seasons commencing in 2010/11, held the role of Treasurer in 2014/15, coached junior teams for 6 seasons and was awarded "Club Member of the Year" in 2011/12. During his time as secretary he has been our delegate to the SSJCA as well as also serving the junior association on their Grading Committee and as a representative selector for 5 seasons. Neil's term as secretary has navigated our club through the biggest changes in SSJCA history. Both sons Dylan and Bailey played junior cricket for the club. Dylan represented the SSJCA for 5 seasons as well as playing Green Shield for the Sutherland District Cricket Club in 2015/16. He was awarded "Junior Rookie of the Year" in 2008/09, "Junior Division Batting Performance Trophy" 2009/10 and "Intermediate Fielding Performance Trophy" 2015/16. Bailey was a member of the SSJCA U10 Development squad in 2016/17. In 2019 Neil was awarded Life Membership of the Club.

Ron captained our Premiership B3 team in 1969/70 and in the same season had the "Club Sportsman of the Year Trophy" named in his honour. Wife Betty was a member of the club's first Ladies Auxiliary which was formed in 1962/63. Sons Neil and Scott both played junior and senior cricket for the club with Neil's claim to fame being dismissing Australia's future test opener John Dyson twice in the one match. Scott won several club team awards.

The Duncan's have a combined total of 43 seasons of playing service for the club with father Peter 10 and son's Jordan 16 and Jaryd 17 seasons. Jaryd was awarded the "Senior Division Wicket Keeping Performance Trophy" in 2011/12 and "Senior Club Champion" in 2014/15 & 2016/17.

Dwarshuis

Gerry played junior and senior cricket for the club as well representing the SSJCA Watson Shield team in 1977/78 as a leg spin bowler. Gerry also managed many junior sides. Son's Ben and Jack played junior cricket for the club and were both recipients of the Bradman Scholarship. Ben was awarded the "Junior Division Batting Performance Award" in 2005/06, "Intermediate Fielding Performance Award" in 2007/08 and "Junior Club Champion" in 2009/10. Jack was awarded the "Sutherland Medal" for being the 2014/15 "16A Player of the Final" taking 5 for 34. Son Rodney played junior cricket for the club as well as representing the SSJCA in the Moore Shield

John played with and captained our senior sides as well as coaching junior teams. His two sons Dean and Brett both played junior cricket for the club and both represented the SSJCA. Dean was awarded the "Club Sportsman of the Year" in 1973/74 and "Top Under Sixteen Batsman" & "Junior Club Champion" in 1974/75. Tony's wife Trish assisted with the production of the club's newsletter. Tony oversaw the planning, council applications and construction of the Dragon's Club Rooms and spent many an hour fitting out the room's interior so that the club's history could be displayed. Tony was the "Club Member of the Year" in 2004/05 and was awarded Life Membership of the club in 2011. Sons James and Michael played junior cricket for the club as well as representing the SSJCA. Michael was awarded the "Top Boys Club Bowler" in 1983/84 & 1984/85.

Geoff played senior cricket and coached our junior teams for 6 seasons winning the "Most Improved Team" award in 1982/83. Trevor played in our A1 teams and assisted in coaching junior teams. Trevor held the position of President of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Umpires Association and was honoured with Life Membership for his service. His wife Sheila was a team scorer for many years and was one of the mainstays in running the club’s Ladies Auxiliary. Son Graham played in our 1981/82 A1 premiership team.

Jones

Steve managed junior teams and initially joined the committee in 2001/02 and was the Minutes Secretary from 2002/03 to 2004/05 before going on to serve as Vice President in 2005/06 and President for 9 seasons from 2006/07 to 2014/15. Steve was our club’s delegate to the “Anzac Youth & Recreation Centre’s 527 Committee” for 13 seasons commencing in 2006/07. For the past 12 seasons Steve has been the MC of our junior and senior Presentations, as well as all our club’s social events after taking on the role in the 2007/08. Steve was Awarded Life Membership of the club in 2015. His son Andrew played junior and senior cricket for the club and was awarded the “Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy” in 2000/01 and was the inaugural recipient of the “Bradman Foundation Scholarship” in 2001/02. Bill's brother Ross known to all as "Doc" coached junior teams with the club for 4 seasons, Club Secretary for 3 seasons 1988/89 to 1990/91 and Junior Registrar for 4 seasons 1988/89 to 1991/91. Ross was "Club Sportsman of the Year" in 1991/92 and made a return to cricket in the 1998/99 to play alongside his son Beau who was "Senior Club Champion" in the same season.

Drew will be remembered as the Dragon's greatest ever clubman and has just completed his 40 consecutive season of playing for the club. Drew has won 3 "Senior Club Champion" awards in 1995/96, 2005/06 & 2011/12 and was a member of our A1 team that won back to back Premierships in 1999/00 & 2000/01. Drew also served as Senior Secretary in 1994/95. In 2004 Drew was awarded a Life Membership of the club with the "Senior Division Batting Performance Award" being named in his honour. Chris was arguably the club's best ever junior batsman scoring 2801 runs for the club and represented the SSJCA in every age group. He was awarded the "Top Boy's Club Batsman" in 1990/91, 1992/93 & 1993/94, "Top Boy's Club Bowler" in 1992/93, "Top Under Sixteen Batsman" in 1993/94, "Junior Club Champion" in 1992/93 & 1993/94, SSJCA "Best Performance 12A" in 1989/90 & 1990/91, SSJCA "Best Performance 14A" in 1992/93 and was the SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year" in 1993/94. Chris was selected in the NSW U/15 team to tour the Northern Territory in 1993/94 and represented in the Sutherland District Grade Cricket Club's Green Shield team for 2 seasons where he scored a record 490 runs in the 1993/94 season. He also played 4 seasons in the Poidevin-Gray team between 1995/96 & 1997/98 before making his 1st Grade debut for Sutherland District Cricket Club 1998. Alf played senior cricket for the club, coached junior teams for 2 seasons, Senior Registrar for 11 seasons 1987/88 to 1996/97, Senior Secretary for 7 seasons 1984 to 1989 & 1995 to 1997, President for 1 season in 1989/90 and Vice President for 4 seasons 1990 to 1994. Alf was the clubs regular delegate to the SSCA and led the group known as the "Magnificent Seven" who for three years regularly ran meat tray raffles at the Engadine Hotel raising funds for the club. Allan captained senior teams for the club playing 28 consecutive seasons from 1985 to 2013. For a further 15 years they collated the newsletter to be collected from their front door step. Ken served as Vice President for 10 seasons, in two stints from 1986/87 to 1989/90 and then again from 1994/95 to 1999/00 with 3 seasons of President from 1990/91 to 1992/93. Ken played an invaluable role for the Club as its delegate to the Anzac Youth Centre 527 committee since its inception. In 1994 Ken was awarded Life Membership of the club with the "Junior Rookie of the Year Trophy" named in his honour. Val was involved in running our Ladies Auxiliary Committee and was awarded "Clubman Sportsman of the Year" in 1989/90 and then awarded Life Membership in 1994 with the 'Club Member of the Year Trophy' named in her honour. Paul Waddell played 26 consecutive seasons for the club taking over 600 wickets and was the "Senior Club Champion" in 1996/97. Paul also coached junior teams for 4 seasons and served as the club's Property Officer in 2007/08 & 2008/09. Paul was awarded Life Membership in 2008 with the "Junior Fielding Performance" trophy being named in his honour.

Ward

Peter was the Junior Registrar for 3 seasons from 1997/98 to 1999/00, Assistant Secretary for 8 seasons from 2000/01 to 2006/07 as well as being the Club Delegate to the SSJCA during this time. Peter managed and coached junior teams for 4 seasons and was awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 2008. Son Jonathan played 18 seasons of junior and senior cricket for the club and represented the SSJCA in their President's U/12 & U/14 teams. Daniel played 10 seasons of juniors for the club and was awarded "Junior Division Bowling Performance Award" in 2000/01 and represented the SSJCA for 7 seasons including being a member of the 2000/01 Foster Shield Premiership team. Daniel played Green Shield for the Sutherland District Cricket Club in 2005/06 & 2006/07.

Warner

Wally Warner and his wife Nellie were Property Officers for both the cricket and rugby league clubs for several seasons 1961/62 to 1967/68. Nellie Warner looked after junior cricket teams in the early 1960's when no coaches were available and help start the Women's auxiliary in 1962. Their sons Phillip and Larry played junior and senior cricket for the Club with Larry a member of the 1978/79 A1 Premiership team. Phillip was awarded the club's inaugural "Club Sportsman of the Year" trophy in 1969/70.

Westlake

John has played 22 seasons for our club commencing in 1974/75. As a player he was awarded "Top Boy's Club Bowler" in 1976/77, "Top Under Sixteen Batsman" in 1982/83, "Junior Club Champion" in 1982/83 and "Outstanding Junior in Men's Cricket" in 1984/85. He has coached junior teams for 8 seasons, our Equipment Officer (current) for 10 seasons commencing in 2009/10 and was our "Club Member of the Year" 2013/14. Sons Matthew and Cameron played cricket for the club with Cameron representing for the SSJCA as well as playing Green Shield for the Sutherland District Cricket Club. Cameron was awarded "Junior Wicket Keeping Performance Trophy" in 2012/13 and the "Intermediate Fielding Performance Trophy" in 2016/17. In 2019 John was awarded Life Membership of the Club.

Wishart

Alan was a member of the clubs committee and assisted with coaching our junior teams with both sons Steve and Wayne playing for the club. Steve was awarded "Club Sportsman of the Year" in 1973/73 and "Junior Club Champion" in 1971/72 & 1973/74. He represented the SSJCA for 5 seasons in their Cawsey, Moore and Watson Shield teams and also represented the Sutherland District Cricket Club in their Green Shield team in 1972/73 and Poidevin-Gray Shield team in 1977/78 & 1978/79. He went on to play 2nd & 3rd grade for Sutherland and in the 1977/78 season Steve scored 697 runs, including 3 centuries, which is the record for the highest season aggregate by any Sutherland 3rd grade player. Wayne played both junior and senior cricket for the club playing a leading role in three Premiership teams – 16A, A3 & A1 and was awarded "Top Boys Club Batsman" in 1975/76, "Top Under Sixteen Batsman" in 1977/78 and "Junior Club Champion" in 1977/78. In 1971/72 he set a SSJCA 10A record of 83 wickets in a season and in 1973/74 was awarded the SSJCA "Best Performed 12A Player". He represented the SSJCA for 5 seasons with the best bowling figures of 7 for 6 in the 1973/74 Cawsey Shield and 8 for 27 in the 1975/76 Moore Shield. In 1980 at the age of 17 Wayne was selected in 4th Grade for the Sutherland District Cricket Club and within 7 matches debuted for 1st Grade. He also played Poidevin-Gray Shield in 1979/80 & 1980/81.

Woodhill

Bob captained senior teams, coached junior teams for 2 seasons, Assistant Secretary in 1983/84, Secretary in 1984/85 & 1985/86 and Publicity Officer in 1987/88. His son Trent was an outstanding leg spin bowling all rounder that represented the SSJCA in every age group, selected in the NSW PSSA team in 1983 and was awarded "Junior Club Champion Award" in 1986/87. Trent represented the Sutherland District Cricket Club Green Shield team in 1985/86 & 1986/87, Poidevin-Gray Shield team from 1989/90 to 1991/92 and 1991 made his 1st Grade debut for the Sutherland District Cricket Club.

HISTORY IN REVIEW

"The 1960's was to be a decade of establishment, growth and the finding of identity"

1959/60 – Engadine Dragons entered three teams U/10, U12 and U/14 into the Sutherland Shire Boys Cricket Association. Our first home ground was 'Engadine Oval'. The Engadine Dragons Foundation Committee was – Barry McManus (Snr) (President), Danny Carroll (Secretary), Ron Chapman (Treasurer), Ken Binner, Bernie Howard, Laurie Crosby, Bill Coates, Kel Keene, Bill Hadfield, Harold Barker, Bill Melrose, Harry Emptage and Claude Pollard. The following players became the Club's first representative players – Barry McManus (Jnr) (Cawsey), Trevor Hodgkinson (Cawsey) and Robert Bain (Moore).

1960/61 – Saw the construction of a new oval alongside Forbes Creek (now known as Anzac Oval), the oval was first used for a cricket match in 1960. Barry McManus (Snr) takes on his first role at Association level managing the Shire's Cawsey Shield side in which son Barry (Jnr) is a member.

1961/62 – Saw long standing coach George Beames come to the Club. In the early days George would pack up the kit, mat and the team and travel to the match by rail. The Boy's Association introduce the "Cricketer of the Year" award named after John Woodhouse. The first recipient is Ray Tozer from the Miranda club.

1962/63 – This season saw the formation of the Ladies Auxiliary that became the cricket and rugby league club's main source of income. The first auxiliary members were – Lorna Gardner, Judy Membrey, Heather Robbins, Norah Morrison, Irene Carter, Norma Horsnell, May McStay, Nellie Warner, Pauline Johnson, Glad Keenan, Carrie Macken, Linda Snell, Betty Long, Elaine Hinton, Betty Dudman, Barbara Woodbridge and Noreen Blewitt. This season also saw the first club perpetual trophy introduced with the inception of the "Joe Weymouth Trophy" to be awarded to our "Junior Club Champion". Barry McManus (Jnr) was the first recipient.

"Junior Club Champion" was – Barry McManus (Jnr) 14A – 274 runs & 47 wkts

1963/64 – After consistent growth over the first few seasons, player numbers peaked with the Club fielding 8 teams and 98 players. With the Club facing such an influx of new players we were fortunate to gain the services of John McPhee who became the corner stone of coaches for our Club into the seventies. This season saw our original black and red cap replaced by a royal blue baggy with red piping.

“Junior Club Champion” – Peter Doherty 12C – 276 runs & 60 wkts

1964/65 – With record registrations of 114 teams and 1594 players the SSBCA were forced to increase the number of grades to cope with the influx. 1964 marked the introduction of the first weekly magazine called the “Dragons News”. This season also saw Barry McManus (Jnr), son of Club founder become the first player from our Club to be honoured as SSBCA “Cricketer of the Year” 578 runs @ 72.25 and 37 wickets @ 14.51. Our Junior Presentation was held at the Institute Hall in Engadine from 1964/65 until 1970/71.

“Junior Club Champion” – Robert Carroll 14B – 478 runs & 70 wkts

1965/66 – The Club was finally rewarded with its first premiership. Our 14B side coached by Reg Spiers and managed by Mick Williams had a great season thanks to outstanding performances by Wayne Headley (59 wickets) and Russell Skuse (417 runs). The players in the 14B team were – Mick Williams, Colin Warn, Les Ledwidge, Russell Skuse, John Carlson, Barry Rose, Norm McGee, Peter Doherty, Neville Spiers (v/capt), Wayne Headley (capt), Jeff Ahearn and Mark Johnson. On the 30th June 1965 the Sutherland District Cricket Club was formed and first participated in the NSW Cricket Association grade competition in the 1965-66 season. Robert Bain was the first Dragon’s junior to play first grade for Sutherland debuting September 25, 1965. This season heralded the introduction of the SSBCA “Club Championship”.

“Junior Club Champion” – Wayne Headley 14B – 191 runs & 59 wkts

1966/67 – Barry McManus (Snr) is awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1966. Our newsletters and yearbooks took on a new look with the introduction of covers. The covers were designed by Gordon Alley and Neil Carter, with Harry Robbins canvassing local businesses and shops to advertise in the magazine. Also this season Heathcote entered their first junior sides, which had a direct impact on our own numbers.

“Junior Club Champion” – Mike Fordyce 16B – 365 runs & 38 wkts

1967/68 – This season the Club fielded its first senior team in the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association (SSCA) competition. The club applied for the A1 competition, but were graded A2’s, they finished the season as undefeated premiers. The team was as follows – Barry Blanchard (capt), Harry Robbins (v/capt), Col Keenan, Mike Fordyce, Robert Rushbourne, Fred Terone, Warren McPhee, John Barnes, Phil Heffernan, Peter Doherty, Ted Russell, Warwick Sheehy, Ron Lovett, Gordon McElroy and Cliff Hams. In 1967 due to the growth of teams in both rugby league and cricket it was decided to form two separate committees to run each individual sport. The first members of the separate cricket committee were – Ken Horsnell (President), Barry Blanchard (Secretary) and Warren McPhee (Treasurer).

“Junior Club Champion” – Trevor Bailey 12B – 181 runs & 51 wkts

1968/69 – This season Ray Noakes the Shire’s leading all rounder decided to leave Engadine Hotel Club and join the Dragons. Other outstanding players followed – Trevor Jones, George Cranston, Ray Dunn, John Ferguson, Dennis Pullen, Ron Dudman, Graham Morrison, Ray Monaghan, Graham Chudleigh and Gordon Beames. This season Dragons won their first A1 premiership and 7 of the next 14. In the junior ranks U/10 leg spinner Peter Noakes recorded the Club’s best bowling match figures taking 9 for 37 and 8 for 27 against Gynea. Peter also formed a formidable partnership with wicket keeper Brett Johnson in Sutherland’s Cawsey Shield side. Noakes captured 22 wickets, nine with Johnson.

“Junior Club Champion” – Lance Howes 14B – 338 runs & 39 wkts

“For the Dragon’s the 1970’s were to be the glory years and under the guidance of Club Secretary Harry Robbins the Club prospered winning 39 premierships (27 junior & 12 senior) and 7 SSJCA Club Championships”

1969/70 – Saw the formation of the “Engadine Dragons Sports Club”. Dragons also won its first junior “A Grade” competition thanks to our 12A side coached by Ray Noakes and Gordon Beams. In 1970, Anzac Oval complex expanded from one oval and a rubbish tip to three ovals to accommodate the needs of Rugby League and Soccer thus providing a second larger cricket ground at the Achilles Road end. For the first time our Club adopted the current royal blue, sky blue and red baggy cap with the Dragon emblem. The cap was designed by Graham Morrison and only presented to premiership teams. The royal blue caps with the red piping were still worn by all other players. This season also saw the inception of the “Les Johnson Trophy” for the “Senior Club Champion”. Robert Rushbourne is the first recipient.

“Club Champions” Senior – Robert Rushbourne A1 & Junior – Malcolm Haynes 16A

1970/71 – This season saw us win our first SSBKA “Club Championship”. The SSCA introduced Finals for the first time with Dragon’s A1’s victorious in their Final. Previously the Premiers were decided by first past the post. In 1970 Harry Robbins was honoured with a Life Membership of the SSCA. This season sees Terry Humphries awarded the Association “Best Performed 12A Cricketer” 233 runs @ 33.20 and 70 wickets @ 4.60.

“Club Champions” Senior – Barry Blanchard A1 & Junior – Jim Shooter 16A

1971/72 – We made it two SSBKA “Club Championship” in a row. We won the 14A competition for the first time. Ray Noakes and George Cranston were the coaches. Six of these players were also members of the champion undefeated Sutherland Moore Shield team. The players were – Brett Johnson, Stephen Wishart, Graham Beames, Peter Noakes, Ian Cranston and Terry Humphries. Our Junior Presentation was held at the Senior Citizens Community Centre in Engadine from 1971/72 until 1978/79. Our Senior Presentation was held at the Engadine Bowling and Recreation Club from 1971/72 until 1972/73.

“Club Champions” Senior – Col Keenan B2 – 443 runs & Junior – Steven Wishart 14A – 323 runs & 23 wkts

1972/73 – This season saw the introduction of joining and match fees. The men’s joining fee \$2.50 and \$0.80 match fee. The boy’s joining fee \$0.60 and \$0.40 match fee. Steve Gorry set an Association record in the 10C’c by taking 70 wickets @ 2.14. This team also held 72 catches.

“Club Champions” Senior – Ray Noakes A1 & Junior – Ian Cranston 16A

1973/74 – Won the SSBKA “Club Championship”. This season saw the first of 5 consecutive “Club Championships” between 1973/74 and 1977/78. From this season until 1995/96 the Senior Presentation was held jointly with the Junior Presentation.

“Club Champions” Senior – Warren Atkins B3 – 500 runs & 29 wkts & Junior – Steven Wishart 16A – 334 runs & 20 wkts

1974/75 – Won the SSBKA “Club Championship”. In 1974, following the dissolution of the “Engadine Dragons Sports Club” Engadine Dragons Cricket Club stood as a separate entity for the first time. Harry Robbins became the first club member to serve on the SSCA Management Committee. This season saw the passing of Club stalwart Alan Wishart. The father of Steve and Wayne passed away on 21st July 1974.

“Club Champions” Senior – Clem Heffernan A1 – 414 runs & Junior – Dean Ferguson 16A – 447 runs

1975/76 – Won the SSBKA “Club Championship” Due to the ongoing expense involved in providing mats and the cost of repairs the Boy’s Association introduced plastic balls and the concrete pitches were painted green. At a meeting at the end of this season delegates from our Club spoke in support of retaining mats and leather balls for the 16A and 14A competitions but this proposal was rejected. Sees the inception of the “Outstanding Junior in Men’s Cricket” trophy, Brett Johnson is the first

recipient.

“Club Champions” Senior – Ernie Price A3 – 55 wkts & Junior – Brett Ferguson 14A – 224 runs & 44 wkts

1976/77 – Won the SSBCA ‘Club Championship’ The royal blue cap with the red piping was phased out this season and replaced by the current royal blue, sky blue and red cap. The SSJCA introduced the use of plastic cricket balls across all age groups and grades. Matches were played on green painted concrete pitches.

“Club Champions” Senior – Peter Royle B2 – 62 wkts & Junior – Brett Martin 14B – 480 runs & 40 wkts

1977/78 – Engadine came of age winning its first 16A premiership. This team was coached by Ian Cranston and Harry Robbins. This season also produced record junior association registrations with 2028 players and 152 teams. Engadine provided 184 players and 16 teams. Both records still stand today. Our A1 side won the “Knockout Endeavour Cup” thanks to the efforts of “Player of the Series” Graham Chudleigh.

“Club Champions” Senior – Brett Johnson A1 – 350 runs & 34 w/k dismissals & Junior – Wayne Wishart 16A – 347 runs & 28 wkts

1978/79 – Harry Robbins is awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1978. The Club wins its seventh SSBCA “Club Championship”. For the first time match fees were abolished and were replaced by a one off registration fee of \$16.00 for junior players and \$24.00 for senior players. Ray Noakes was honoured with a Life Membership of the SSCA. This season also saw the reformation of the Ladies Auxiliary. This band of mothers continued on the hard work of their predecessors in providing a valuable source of income and social activity for the Club. Most popular venues for these social events were Miranda RSL and the Engadine Palace. The auxiliary members were – Vi Noakes, Di Lovett, Val Tever and Deidre Forshaw.

“Club Champions” Senior – Jeffrey Huyben B3 – 292 runs & 33 wkts & Junior – Glen Anderson 16A – 276 runs & 22 wkts

“The 1980’s was to be a decade of change in the way we played the game and what we played it on”

1979/80 – Was the first season that the junior competition was played under the banner of the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association (SSJCA). Tabloid cricket was developed by Barry Davison and introduced to provide an alternative for the players in the lower age group. This form of the game consisted of a three-phase competition. 1. Competitive skills. 2. Series of average cricket. 3. Series of traditional cricket. This season saw the introduction of the six ball over. Our Junior Presentation was held at the Bosco Hall in Engadine from 1979/80 until 1980/81.

“Club Champions” Senior – Steven Gorry B1 – 70 wkts & Junior – Glen Anderson 16A – 379 runs & 45 wkts

1980/81 – Ray Noakes is awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1980. The 1980’s started off as the last decade finished with good player numbers and plenty of premierships. A review of Tabloid cricket resulted in the concept of “Average Cricket”. This form of cricket was to be played over two days with 12 players able to bat for six overs as a pair. The match was determined by dividing the runs by the total of times dismissed, thus the name “Average

“Club Champions” Senior – Craig Alewood C2 – 451 runs & Junior – Dean Russell 16A – 295 runs

1981/82 – This season further reforms were brought in by the SSJCA to increase player involvement. “Rotating batting” was introduced for E & D in the U/12 and U/14 competitions. Our Junior Presentation returned to the Senior Citizens Community Centre in Engadine from 1981/82 until 1985/86. The practice nets at Anzac Oval were constructed in 1982. The Club grieved the loss of Life Member Ray Noakes, who passed away on 14th May 1982.

"Club Champions" Senior – Steven Wearne B1 – 255 runs & 32 wkts & Junior – Peter Bland 16A – 328 runs & 19 wkts

1982/83 – Col Keenan is awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1982. This season brought the introduction of the synthetic covered wickets and more importantly the reintroduction of the leather ball. The 16As are the first grade to use the new wickets at Lincoln, Gwawley Nth, Woollooware and Port Hacking rugby.

"Club Champions" Senior – Greg Heffernan A3 – 626 runs & Junior – John Westlake 16A – 242 runs

1983/84 – This season saw Nathan Morando awarded the SSJCA "Best Performed 10A Cricketer" 479 runs @ 59.88 and 32 wickets @ 7.22. The 12As joined the 16As in playing on synthetic covered wickets using leather balls.

"Club Champions" Senior – John Richardson A2 – 50 wkts & Junior – Trent Woodhill 14A – 246 runs & 18 wkts

1984/85 – Mike Fordyce is awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1984. Our A1 side captained by Clem Heffernan defeated Minor Premiers Sylvania by the narrowest of margins to win the Final. Engadine 9 for 192 defeated Sylvania all out 191. This increased our A1 record to 8 premierships and 4 times runners up in 17 seasons.

"Club Champions" Senior – Ian Cranston A1 – 37 wkts & Junior – Craig Parsons 16A – 302 runs & 19 wkts

1985/86 – Alf Lemmon is awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1985. Craig Parsons named SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year" 343 runs @ 57.16 and 19 wickets @ 14.63. Nathan Morando was selected in the NSW PSSA Team and also was awarded the NSWJCU Cawsey Shield Batting Award scoring 379 runs @ 42.1 as well as taking 37 wickets in Sutherlands winning team.

"Club Champions" Senior – Mick Price B1 – 159 runs & 39 wkts & Junior – Craig Parsons 16A – 343 runs & 19 wkts

1986/87 – The Club introduced the first set of criteria as used to determine award winners. Since then the criteria has been constantly reviewed. Greg Rowe (C1) set the record for the best senior bowling figures in an innings by taking 9 for 15. That same year saw a young lady by the name of Fiona Kark draw the Club's batting dragon which has been featured on the Club's Newsletters, Year Books and other publications ever since. Our Junior Presentation was held at Engadine High School from 1986/87 until 1994/95. Alf Lemmon as Secretary for the senior club led a small team of hard workers who every week could be found at the Engadine Hotel raffling meat trays. These used to be purchased from the butcher located at the end of Kingswood Road. That year alone saw Alf and his band raise \$3,000.

"Club Champions" Senior – Anthony Lovett B2 – 407 runs & Junior – Trent Woodhill 16A – 224 runs

1987/88 – Saw disappointment for the Ladies Auxiliary members – Cheryl Morando, Val Tever, Denise Pearson, Judy Lofthouse, Jill Vaughan and Adrienne Tindall as the meat raffle at the Engadine Hotel and the dinner dance were poorly supported and only raised \$500 for the season. A special thanks went to Vi Noakes for co-ordinating the junior results and phoning them through to the Association. In July 1987 Russ Waddell's revised constitution replaced the Club's original 1969 version written by Harry Robbins and Fred Gardner. Russ Waddell also took on the roll of MC at the Club's Presentation Night, a roll that would span the next twenty seasons.

"Club Champions" Senior – David Perritt A3 – 44 wkts & Junior – Nathan Morando 14A – 332 runs & 47 wkts

1988/89 – The club only fielded nine junior teams as against fifteen the previous year. The junior double wicket competition introduced in 86/87 was dropped for lack of support and the Club did not award a Sportsman of the Year award for failure to find someone who fit the criteria. In addition the year saw the demise of the Ladies Auxiliary after many years of fund-raising for the Club. A victim of the "recession we had to have" and a downturn in cricket interest generally, meant that this long

standing and hardworking band of mums and wives, faded away from our cricket scene. Nathan Morando was named the SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year" 354 runs @ 39.33 and 30 wickets @ 12.76
"Club Champions" Senior – Craig Tever B3 – 411 runs & Junior – Nathan Morando 16A – 354 runs & 30 wkts

"The 1990's was to be a decade of reform and new direction that would pave the way to future success"

1989/90 – Was a watershed year. Alf Lemmon stood up and as reliable as ever took over the role of President to ensure the club survived. He guided the club through a rocky twelve-month period where it was down on numbers and though not facing extinction was not progressing either. This season saw Chris Lake awarded the SSJCA "Best Performed 12A Cricketer" 442 runs @ 44.20.
"Club Champions" Senior – Not Awarded & Junior – Greg Goodman 16A – 354 runs

1990/91 – Saw the introduction of Finals for juniors as distinct from "first past the post" competitions. This season the Club embarked on its first major attempt to raise funds through an M & M Sales drive and were successful in raising \$1100. The season also saw the acquisition of our storage room at the Anzac Complex, the first time we had had a central storage location close to the nets. This season saw Chris Lake again awarded the SSJCA "Best Performed 12A Cricketer" 576 runs @ 51.50.

"Club Champions" Senior – Not Awarded & Junior – Greg Goodman 16A – 281 runs

1991/92 – Saw player numbers hover at the lowest level since the Club's inception and accordingly results reflected the times with only two premierships in four seasons (since 1988/89). Under Ken Tever's guidance as President the club continued to hold firm and as Ken pointed out himself in his annual report, "we need new blood, new ideas". This season the SSJCA changed the junior competition rules as follows: – from time limit to an over limit game, with restrictions on individual bowlers, the number of competition rounds were set at ten. Consequently, it meant a new approach to setting records and the "old" records were, ruled off, and from thence a new set of records introduced.

SSJCA Annual Report extract –

"Recent changes to our competition rules have resulted in the move from time limit to an over limited game, with restrictions on individual bowlers. The number of rounds are now limited to 10 per season. Because of these alterations it is almost impossible for the old individual competition records to be broken. Accordingly it has been decided to move the "old records" to a separate section and to quote only records achieved in restricted cricket in the general competition results." As a result our Club also decided to move our records to a separate section.

"Club Champions" Senior – Greg Heffernan & Junior – Dean Heslehurst 16A – 412 runs

1992/93 – On the 25th April 1993 the Club grieved the passing of Club founder Barry McManus (Snr). Clem Heffernan is awarded with a Life Membership of the Club in 1992. Under Eight cricket is introduced by the SSJCA. Ken Tever continued as President in the absence of "New Blood". Under his leadership money was raised to upgrade the practice nets at Anzac Oval with concrete poured to provide bowling run-ups and synthetic grass laid for the first time. Adrian Vannan as Assistant Secretary took on the responsibility for guiding the Club through the processes of Incorporation to provide a better legal base for the club and to offer the Management Committee members a measure of protection against the likelihood of legal claims should a misadventure occur. He also

rewrote the Club's Constitution to bring it in line with the terms of the Incorporation. This season saw Chris Lake awarded the SSJCA "Best Performed 14A Cricketer" 643 runs @ 71.44 and 19 wickets @ 9.21. Daniel McLauchlan of the 16A team was selected in a NSW U16 team to tour the Northern Territory in June-July 1993.

"Club Champions" Senior – Jason Crimlisk A2 – 42 wkts & Junior – Chris Lake 14A – 643 runs & 19 wkts

1993/94 – This season the SSJCA introduced semi finals for the first time and our 16A team was successful in winning the premiership after finishing the season in fourth position. This format was scrapped after only one season. Chris Lake was named "SSJCA Cricketer of the Year" 510 runs @ 63.75 and 19 wickets @ 11.47. Chris was also selected to tour the Northern Territory with the NSW U/15 team. This season also saw our first Under 8 team take the field. Shaun Mealing coached the team of twelve, which included our first female player, Christina Cuddy. The other players were – Brett Bullock, Nathan Bullock, Justin Champion, Timothy Greenway, Mitchell Hatch, Craig Lowe, Peter Mealing, Chris Moreland, Matthew Newman, Sunil Patel and Kurt Ridley.
"Club Champions" Senior – Anthony Stanley B3 – 41 wkts & Junior – Chris Lake 16A – 510 runs & 19 wkts

1994/95 – Val Tever, Ken Tever and Bob Vannan were awarded Life Memberships of the Club in 1994. This season showed early signs of resurgence with Russ Waddell once again taking over the reins of President. Although player numbers stayed low the Club produced a further three titles with the A1 side finishing runners up, a feat that they would reproduce the following season. Matthew Barnes (12A) set the record for the best junior bowling figures in an innings by taking 9 for 22. This season was the start of a long standing commitment from one of the Club's greatest supporters, Jim Emerian, owner of Cosmo Lighting. Jim's longstanding sponsorship has provided the financial backing to undertake major developments. Jim was introduced to the Club by long time hard working member, Bob Price.

"Club Champions" Senior – Anthony Stanley B2 – 244 runs & 34 wkts & Junior – Craig Brownscombe 16A – 417 runs & 18 wkts

1995/96 – Saw a new positive direction taken by an enthusiastic Management Committee led by Russ Waddell and ably supported by new Club Secretary Ian Latham. A number of creative initiatives were taken including a social event being held for the first time in a number of years, the inaugural Club Trivia Night organised by Steve Bourke and Laurie Daly. Steve and Laurie went on to run this successful evening from 1995/96 until 2000/01. Sponsorships were sought to help finance the improvement in facilities and equipment. This was a defining season for the Dragons and set the high standard that has been carried through to the present day. This season also saw the introduction of the Dragon's royal blue baseball cap. The Junior Presentation night was held at Heathcote High School for the first time. This season saw the SSJCA introduce bowling restrictions in compliance with standards laid down by Cricket NSW. Bowlers were restricted by age in the numbers of overs they could bowl in a spell and in an innings.

"Club Champions" Senior – Drew Lake A1 – 359 runs & Junior – Not Awarded.

1996/97 – Russ Waddell was awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1996. This season player numbers soared with fourteen junior teams and 158 players taking the field and although senior numbers were still low signs of improvement were evident. The season saw the reintroduction of the Senior Presentation Night, held at the Engadine Bowling and Recreation Club. Thanks to the efforts of the State Member for Heathcote Ian McManus funding was granted for the upgrading of our practice nets at Anzac Oval (\$8000). Service awards were introduced and following a review of older trophies new perpetual trophies were purchased and awards introduced to perpetuate the efforts of Life Members over the years. 1996 saw Daniel McLauchlan, a Dragons' junior selected in the NSW U/19 team to compete in U/19 National Carnival in Adelaide. In the match against South Australian Daniel recorded the best bowling figures in an innings with 9 for 11 and the most wickets in a match with 14 for 15, a record that still stands today. As a result Daniel was selected in the Australian U/19 Team to tour India and Pakistan.

“Club Champions” Senior – Paul Waddell B6 – 48 wkts & Junior – Not Awarded.

1997/98 – At the start of this season President Russ Waddell, following a request from the Junior Association, took up the position of SSJCA Secretary/Public Officer. He became the fourth Club Member in 40 years to occupy a position on the SSJCA Management Committee following in the footsteps of Col Keenan, Mike Fordyce and Ian Latham. The Senior Presentation moved to the Engadine RSL and Citizens’ Club.

“Club Champions” Senior – Marcus Loxley B5 – 230 runs & 32 wkts & Junior – Not Awarded.

1998/99 – Bill Knowles was awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 1998. Harry Robbins received a Hughes Community Award for his service to sport. This season saw a number of new developments take place including the establishment of a cricket pitch (\$5500) and an upgrade of practice nets (\$2500) at Engadine West Public School. Our 10C and 10E teams were the first to use the facilities. The SSJCA introduced compulsory “Level O Coaching Certificate” for all junior team coaches.

“Club Champions” Senior – Beau Knowles C1 – 194 runs & 45 wkts & Junior – Michael Lavallee 12A – 339 runs & 9 wkts

“The Noughties, the new millennium was to be a return to the glory days of the seventies. During this decade the Club would win 10 senior premierships including back-to-back A1 titles. The Club would also win 25 junior premierships including the 10A’s three times, the 12A’s twice, the 14A’s five times and the 16A four times. During this time, the Club won 4 SSJCA “Club Championships” and produced 4 SSJCA “Cricketers of the Year”. Also set was the record of contending 7 of the 9 16A Finals played, the “pinnacle of junior cricket”

1999/2000 – Bob Price and Greg Heffernan were both awarded Life Memberships of the Club in 1999. In the Chinese calendar the year 2000 is the year of the dragon. How apt! It certainly was our year with five Premierships including our first A1 competition for 17 seasons. “Mr. Engadine Dragons” Harry Robbins wrote the Club History Book, (Engadine Dragons Cricket Club – A Proud History in Sutherland Shire Sport), a comprehensive history of the first forty seasons of our Club. At the AGM in June the Club Constitution was replaced with the updated version by Russ Waddell and Ian Latham. The Senior Presentation was once again held at the Engadine Bowling and Recreation Club. In 1999 the SSJCA (Peter Risby) launched their first website through the ‘Isport Internet System’. This season saw Ryan Shepherd awarded the SSJCA ‘Best Performed 14A Cricketer’ 665 runs @ 95.00 and 22 wickets @ 10.00.

“Club Champions” Senior – Andrew Hine B2 – 394 runs & Junior – Ryan Shepherd 14A – 665 runs & 22 wkts

2000/01 – The Sydney Olympic year saw the restructure of the junior competition to cope with the late start to the season. Juniors played six two day and four one day fixtures. Due to the increase in junior numbers Sunday cricket was introduced to a great deal of opposition. The Club won its first SSJCA ‘Club Championship’ in 21 years. And our A1 team win back-to-back premierships. All players in that side were former Dragon juniors and were again captained by Brett Johnson. On Sunday 22nd October 2000 Harry Robbins and Russ Waddell were awarded Australian Sports Medals by the Governor General for services to cricket. In the same year Russ received a Hughes Community Award and a Mayoral Volunteer Recognition award, again for cricket activities. The Senior Presentation returned to the Engadine RSL and Citizens’ Club. Ryan Shepherd was named SSJCA ‘Cricketer of the Year’ 481 runs @ 96.20 and 7 wickets @ 18.14.

“Club Champions” Senior – Will Wooster B5 – 295 runs & 24 wkts & Junior – Ryan Shepherd 16A – 481 runs

2001/02 – Marked the inception of the Bradman Foundation Coaching Scholarships. These scholarships came about from an inspiration of Harry Robbins who having visited Bowral the home of the Foundation suggested the Club follow up on his visit. Accordingly, through the combined efforts of Harry, Russ Waddell and Ian Latham consultations and correspondence with the Foundation resulted in the establishment of what is known as “The Bradman Foundation

Scholarships". Each year two promising U/12 players are sent to Bowral for coaching under the guidance of the Bradman Foundation. Andrew Jones and Bryce Daenell were the first recipients. The season saw the Club receive a Commonwealth Government Grant applied for by Ian Latham to purchase a bowling machine (\$3900) a piece of equipment that has benefited players greatly.

"Club Champions" Senior – Greg Goodman A1 – 286 runs & 10 w/k dismissals & Junior – Ryan Shepherd 16A – 533 runs

2002/03 – John Carlisle was awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 2002. This year also saw Club stalwart Russ Waddell honoured with a Life Membership of the SSJCA for his work as Association Secretary. A number of firsts evolved during this season. For the first time in SSJCA history Dragons registered an entire team of females and entered them into the 14D competition. Paul Marsh was their coach. We combined with St. John Bosco and together entered two joint teams into the SSJCA Competition; they were known as the (14C & 16B) Bosco Dragons. We also teamed up with Bosco to run the first Engadine District "Have 'a' Go" Cricket Centre. The centre coordinators were Ian Latham and Steve Mulally (St. John Bosco). After a break last season the Club Trivia Night was reintroduced with Ken Newman taking over the reins of MC. Russ Waddell completed his total of 11 years as President and this saw the finale of the Waddell/Latham team as players in pursuing high standards for the club in its endeavours. Jay Davis was named SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year" 525 runs @ 58.34 and 18 wickets @ 11.89.

"Club Champions" Senior – Paul Cameron A1 – 206 runs & 30 wkts & Junior – Jay Davis 16A – 525 runs & 18 wkts

2003/04 - Ian Latham was awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 2003. Cameron Turner set the record for the Club's highest junior score with 162 not out in a 16A match against Illawong/Menai. This season saw the Club win its third successive 16A premiership with one of the Club's best ever coaches Stuart Slack at the helm for all three. In July 2003 the SSJCA (Peter Risby) launched the www.ssjca.com.au website. After the initial approaches to the Anzac 527 Committee by Ian Latham and Bob Price our new club president Gordon Scott led the way as EDCC was given permission by the 527 Committee to build within the upper level of the Anzac complex, Stage No.1 of our clubrooms, the indoor practice nets. With funding required for the new project Ian Latham applied for a Grant and thanks to the assistance of State Member for Heathcote Paul McLeay we received a Department of Sport and Recreation Grant (\$7400) towards the cost of work. Dragons again in conjunction with St. John Bosco ran the Engadine District "Have 'a' Go" Cricket Centre. This season was the last due to poor returns in registrations from the program. After a great deal of opposition Sunday junior cricket is abandoned. Another big move this season was the introduction of the compulsory use of helmets in all grades from Under 10 to Under 16.

"Club Champions" Senior - Jim Bonser B2 – 345 runs & 20 wkts & Junior - Cameron Turner 16A – 482 runs & 11 wkts

2004/05 - Drew Lake was awarded a Life Membership of the Club in 2004. We win our ninth SSJCA 'Club Championship'. September 2004 saw Stage No.1 of our clubhouse completed (\$19,000), an indoor practice net, incorporating a bowling machine. Thanks to work of Tony Gleeson co-ordinating the planning, construction and fit out the facility it was completed in time for the start of the season. Ken Newman brought the Club into the world of the Internet by designing and administrating the Club's first Website. Robbie Knight became the Club's first ever Promotions Officer, a roll that would see him raise countless dollars for the Dragons over the following seasons. Robbie also went onto be one of the Club's most successful and long standing coaches. Nicole Dowd became the Club's first female coach (10C) in almost four decades as she followed in the footsteps of Nellie Warner and Pauline Johnson who a coached in the mid 1960's. The conclusion of this season marked the end of two of our longest serving committee members. John Carlisle retired as Treasurer after thirteen consecutive years of guiding the Club's financial interests. Ian Latham completed his tenth consecutive year as Club Secretary to take on the role of Equipment Officer. At the June AGM our Club Constitution was amended to bring it into line with present day issues. The SSJCA (Tom Croucher) further updated their website featuring a computer generated file for each team.

"Club Champions" Senior - Greg Heffernan A1 – 508 runs & Junior - Chris Reeves 16B – 494 runs & 14 wkts

2005/06 - With new Club Secretary Tony Gleeson at the reins we win our tenth SSJCA 'Club Championship'. Team photos are reintroduced but for this season only. This season sees a record four U/8 sides registered and eight Dragon's senior teams entered into the SSCA Competition. Club Life Members Val Tever and Bob Price are presented Hughes Community Awards for their service to the Engadine District. The Senior Presentation this season moved to St Moritz Room at the Engadine Hotel. Committee member Brad Loder joined the ranks of the SSJCA as the Associations Vice President. In September 2005 Paul Waddell captured 8 for 59 to be the first player in our Club to reach 500 wickets. Permission was given by the Anzac Oval 527 Committee to build stage two of our clubrooms, the administration and meeting room. The first Annual U/16 Bradman Oval Match was played in Bowral in April 2006.

"Club Champions" Senior - Drew Lake A2 – 394 runs & Junior - Ben Marciante 16A – 265 runs & 21 wkts

2006/07 - Under the enthusiastic leadership of our new look committee led by President Steve Jones and Club Secretary Craig Rice Stage No.2 (\$13,000) of our clubrooms, the administration and meeting room, was completed with the assistance of a second Department of Sport and Recreation Grant (\$4000), which Ian Latham was again successful in gaining. The completion of this project initiated and overseen by Ian Latham ensured that Club Members not only had a place to call "home" but the best training facilities of any cricket club in the Shire, if not Sydney. In tribute to the greatest Engadine Dragon the rooms were named "The Harry Robbins Rooms". Glenn Caukill set the record for the Club's highest senior score with 231 not out in a C1 match against Illawong/Menai. Dennis Pendergast completed a rare coaching feat this year. He started with a bunch of boys in the under 10A's way back in 2000 and every second year won an "A Grade" premiership culminating in the ultimate prize of the 16A title this year. Ian Latham received a Hughes Community Award for his services to cricket. On the 28th May 2007 the Club grieved the sad passing of Life Member Ken Tever. Dragon's junior Daniel McLauchlan makes a sensational debut for the Western Warriors in the Pura Cup Competition and wins a contract for the 2007/08 season. Russ Waddell roll of MC at the Club's Presentation Nights conclude this year after twenty continuous seasons. The SSJCA (Tom Croucher) launched the "Cricket Online" internet program to manage all player, club, team and match results. Not to be outdone the SSCA launched their website www.scca.asn.au. Ben Marciante was named SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year" 464 runs @ 58.00 and 19 wickets @ 13.74

"Club Champions" Senior – Stewart Vella B2 – 903 runs & 30 wkts & Junior – Ben Marciante 16A – 464 runs & 19 wkts

2007/08 – Greg Knowles, Allan Lofthouse, Paul Waddell and Peter Ward were all awarded Life Memberships of the Club in 2008. Life Member Mike Fordyce received a Hughes Community Award for his selfless and sustained contribution to the youth of the area, through his work with the Engadine Church of Christ, Engadine Dragons and other camping ministries. We won our eleventh SSJCA "Club Championship" and three junior and three senior premierships. Allan Lofthouse became only the second member of our Club to take a position on the SSCA Management Committee. Harry Robbins was our first. "Club Member of the Year" Andrew Mazurkiewicz took over from Ken Newman the roll of Club Webmaster and rebuilt the Club website www.engadinedragonscc.org.au. Thanks to the assistance of Jan Forshaw and the Sutherland Shire Council our practice nets at Anzac received a much need upgrade including new netting. Also with the assistance of the Engadine Sporting Complex 527 Committee we were able to extend the concrete run-ups in the practice nets at Anzac Oval. This season through the efforts of Club Secretary Craig Rice all teams were provided with sunshades and scorebook holders. President Steve Jones took over the role of MC at our Presentation Nights from Russ Waddell. The SSCA introduced sixes for the first time into the senior competition. Ryan Marlow became the eighth Dragon to be named SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year" 358 runs @ 29.83 and 12 wickets @ 18.75. 16A captain Mark Rice had an outstanding Green Shield season scoring 334 runs @ 55.67 and as a result was awarded by the Sutherland District Grade Club

the “Ken Gardner Memorial Award” as the U/16 Player of the Year. Mark was selected into the Combined Green Shield Team and the Provisional 2008/09 U/17 NSW City Squad.

“Club Champions” Senior – Stewart Vella B1 – 466 runs & 17 wkts & Junior – Mark Rice 16A – 405 runs & 28 wkts

2008/09 – Col Berry, Glenn Hickey and Bill Ziegler were all awarded Life Memberships of the Club in 2009. In 2009, our club celebrated its 50th year which saw us return to our original colours of black & red for this year only. Culmination of the celebrations was a luncheon held at the St Moritz Room, whereby close to 200 people attended the function, which was hosted by Ex Australian cricketer Len Pascoe and we were entertained by another Ex Australian cricketer, Rodney Hogg and singer Dave Prior. It was great to see that all 18 of our life members were able to attend, and family representing our 3 “retired” life members made it such a special day to acknowledge the services of players, administrators and supporters over many eras. Russ Waddell & Ian Latham must be congratulated for their efforts in organising this event & they also found time to compile the book “50 Years of Cricket – A history of a community club and the people who make it 1959 – 2008.” This year we introduced our U/10 development squad to assist our up and coming U8’s make the transition to traditional cricket that little bit easier. Renowned coach Peter Schofield put the boys through their paces with an army of helpers. Fab Floors provided sponsorship for the initiative. The SSJCA introduced sixes into the junior competitions and our 10A, 12A, 12E & 16A teams were crowned premiers for 2008/09 season. Both the 12E’s and 10A’s went through undefeated. Our Men’s teams found it a little tougher this year and although three teams made the final series all were defeated but not before putting in sterling efforts. Ryan Almond was named SSJCA Cricketer of the Year, 507 runs at 58.11, 15 wickets at 12.93. This is our ninth cricketer of the year, and the third in succession. Jonathan Haslam, broke the club’s highest innings record with an amazing 167* off 48 overs. In addition he won the SSJCA Best Performance 14’s, along with club mates, Nathan Marciante – Best Performance 12’s and Jarrod Mazurkiewicz – Best Performance 10’s. This is the first time one club has been awarded all 4 performance awards. Former Dragon, Ben Marciante was awarded the Margaret Mann Memorial Award (U21 Player of the Year) at the Sutherland District Grade Club. Ben also made his 1st Grade debut, the first Dragon to do so since Chris Lake, 10 years prior.

2009/10 – Dennis Pendergast was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 2010. In 2010, our club was awarded the Club Championship by the SSJCA, after all 4 “A” grade teams made the final, with the 10A and 12A being undefeated, along with the 10C’s. On the day, only the 12A’s brought home the silverware with a convincing win in the final. In the Seniors, the A2’s won the competition, while the B5 & C1’s were runners up. In the juniors, we fielded an all girls team who played in our U8 division, had a fantastic year developing their skills and continuing friendships from their winter sport. We were runner up in the “Australia Wide Weetbix Competition”, where individuals show their support for their club, collecting \$3000 along the way.

The Club continued its success under the watchful eye of our new Club Secretary Neil Croker with the winning of back to back SSJCA Club Championships, and Premierships in the 12A, 14A and B7 competitions. Our 12A’s (right) were also crowned the 2010/11 Weetbix 20/20 Champions after clinching a well fought victory on the SCG. Andrew Mazurkiewicz was recognised for all his hard work in junior cricket as recipient of NSW Cricket “South East Cricket Volunteer of the Year”. This season saw the last “Club Newsletter” roll off the presses as the great club man Bob Price called it a day after twenty five years as Publicity Officer.

2011/12 – The pre-season saw the upgrade of our practice nets at Engadine West. With the assistance of a \$5000 grant from the SSJCA and money raised from our inaugural “Bunnings BBQ” the Club was able to lay concrete run ups. This season saw the introduction of “split innings” matches in the U/10 and the lower U/12 competitions, an initiative by the SSJCA to provide a greater involvement for the players. The SSCA followed in the footsteps of their junior counterpart with the launching of online recording of match scores. This season we were successful in winning the B5, 14E and 16A (left) Premierships and Dane Fisher was awarded the SSJCA “Cricketer of the Year”. Jack Dwarshuis was selected in the PSSA NSW Team and ex-Dragon James Bills made his first grade debut for Sutherland. This season saw the end of the printed Annual Report with future Reports being published online.

2012/13 – Brad Moreland was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 2013. The 2012/13 season saw declining playing numbers especially in the senior competition, but our Club remained strong fielding 24 teams, 14 junior and 10 senior, which was the same amount of teams as the previous season. Allan Lofthouse took on the role of SSCA Competition Manager and along with Tony Marciante completed their final season as our Club’s senior and junior registrars. Our Annual Bradman Oval Match was unfortunately washed out. This season we had 10 of our teams competing in the final series of their respective competitions with the B6, C1, 16A, 16C and 14A teams going on to win Premierships. Our 16A side (left) were also successful in winning the Weet-Bix T20 Metropolitan Cup and then going on to be crowned the Weet-Bix T20 at the SCG. In a remarkable 12 months ex-Dragon Ben Dwarshuis was selected in the NSW U/19 team, Sutherland 1st Grade followed by been given a rookie contract with the NSW Speed Blitz Blues. Nathan Marciante became the Club’s 11th SSJCA “Cricketer of the Year” and was also selected in the Combined Green Shield team.

2013/14– Harry Tattersall became the Club’s twelfth ‘SSJCA Cricketer of the Year’. Playing numbers remained strong with the Club fielding 23 teams, 16 junior and 7 senior consisting of 304 players. This season saw the grandson’s of Life Member’s Bob Price and John Carlisle represent the Club with Laythen & Balin Carlisle and Will Price playing their first season of cricket. Our Annual Bradman Oval Match was washed out for the second consecutive season.

We had 7 of our teams competing in the finals of their respective competitions with the 16A and C2 teams going on to win Premierships. Club junior Ben Dwarshuis received another rookie contract with the NSW Blues and was also contracted to the Sydney Sixers. Our 2007/08 Junior Club Champion Mark Rice made his first grade debut for Western Suburbs. Two 16A players were selected to represent in NSW U/15 school teams with Harry Tattersall named in the NSWCHS team and Dylan Koprivec in the NSWCCC and the NSW All School Team.

2014/15 – Steve Jones was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 2015. Player numbers were steady with the Club fielding 8 senior and 14 junior teams with 307 players registering for the season. We had Premiership success with our B3, C1, 16B-1 and 16A and the Club finished in fourth place on the SSJCA Club Championship. Our Bradman Oval Match was washed out for the third season in a row. At the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association’s 2015 A.G.M. Dennis Pendergast

was awarded a Life Membership of the SSJCA for 11 years of coaching DCA Shell Shield teams. Also in 2015 Dragon's junior Tim Cutler was appointed the first CEO of the Hong Kong Cricket Club a position he held until 2017.

2015/16 – Stuart Slack was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 2016 in recognition of his 25 years of playing service to the Club and 9 seasons of coaching junior teams. This season as Senior Secretary Stuart introduced the ‘Senior Season Launch’ and re-introduced the Senior Presentation Night. This season the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association introduced the ‘Service to Shire Junior Cricket Awards’ to recognize outstanding service to cricket. Harry Robbins and Ian Latham were two of the four recipients along with Errol Gilbert from St. John Bosco and Warren Daley from St. Patricks. Nick Amos had a tremendous season in the 16A competition and was awarded ‘SSJCA Cricketer of the Year’. As a result of his efforts in the Green Shield and Watson Shield representative competitions Nick was the recipient of the Sutherland Grade Cricket Club’s ‘Ken Gardner Memorial Award’ for the best U/16 player of the year and the ‘Cliff Paddy Trophy’ NSWDCR Representative Individual Achievement Award. Nick was selected in the AW Green Shield Merit team as well as the Metropolitan Team. This season saw a record 191 junior players register for the Club with 17 teams entered into the SSJCA Competition. In the seniors there were 135 players registered with 8 teams entered into the SSCA Competition. The Club had seven teams contest the SSCA and SSJCA Finals with our 10A, 10C and C2 all victorious with Minor Premier B2 and 16A teams and B5 and B6 sides finishing runners up. The Club finished 5th in the SSJCA Club Championship. Tim Berry smashed the Club Record for the highest innings with 339 not out and at the same time with brother Matthew set the record for the Club’s highest ever partnership of 329 Scorecard of Innings . Tim finished the season with two more Club records being the First Dragon’s player to break 1000 runs in a season with 1083 runs @ 90 and the most ever centuries scored in a season with 5.

2016/17 – February 26, 2017 saw the passing of one of the Club’s greatest member’s Russ Waddell. Russ was our Club President for 11 seasons and MC’d our Senior and Junior Presentations for 21 years. His contribution to our Club and to cricket in the Sutherland Shire was outstanding and for his efforts was awarded ‘Life Membership’ of our Club in 1996, the ‘Australian Sports Medal’, ‘Hughes Award’ from the Federal Member, a ‘Mayoral Volunteer Award’ in 2001 and ‘Life Membership’ of the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association in 2003 for his work as Association Secretary. He will be greatly missed. This season saw 143 junior players register for the Club with 12 teams entered into the SSJCA Competition. In the seniors there were 119 players registered with 7 teams entered into the SSCA Competition. These numbers were a significant drop from the previous season, but in line with the reduced registrations across the Shire. The Club had four teams contest the SSCA and SSJCA Finals with only our B1/2 victorious and our 16C, B4 and C1 teams finishing runners up. The Club again finished 5th in the SSJCA Club Championship. Two new trophies were introduced this season – Junior Division Fielding Performance Award and Senior Division Fielding Performance Award with the Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy being renamed the Intermediate Division Fielding Performance Award – The Greg Heffernan Trophy. Also the Wes Adams Memorial Trophy was discontinued.

Our 16A player Brad Simpson was selected in the U16 Australian Squad. Brad played in the U17 National Cricket Championships in Brisbane in September 2017 before taking on Pakistan in Perth in January 2018.

2017/18 – Matthew Carroll and Chris Moreland were awarded Life Membership for 25 years of continuous playing service to the Club. On the representative front it was a great year for ex-junior players with Nick Amos debuting in Sutherland 1st Grade and Ben Dwarshuis being selected in the Australian T20 Squad and also being picked up by Kings XI Punjab in the Indian Premier League auction. Brad Simpson was selected in the U17 Cricket Australia XI and from this was selected into the U16 Australian team to play a six match series against Pakistan. After fourteen seasons of using Tom Croucher’s ‘Cricket’ Online both the SSCA and SSJCA officially switched to MyCricket for entering match results. Cricket NSW launched the T20 Blast program to replace the under eight cricket with all teams playing at the one venue, Kareela Oval on Saturday mornings. With only four players registering Dragons formed a joint team with Como-Jannali. Also the first stage of Cricket Australia’s new formats was implemented into our U10 competition with U12’s to follow next season. This season saw the Club win a record equalling 6 Premierships with our B2, B3, 16C, 12A, 10A and 10F teams all victorious. Lachlan Ritchie was the recipient of the NSWDC “Cawsey Shield Cricketer of the Year”. The Senior Presentation was held at the Engadine Bowling and Recreation Club as well as the Junior Presentation, which was for the first time was conducted on a Sunday lunchtime breaking away from a 23 year tradition of a Friday evening at Heathcote High School.

2018/19 – This season the Club awarded Life Memberships to Brett Adams, Neil Croker, Dean Griffith, Jim Lee, Tim Russell and John Westlake. We had six teams contest the SSJCA Finals with our 16A, 12A and 10A teams winning their respective Premierships taking our Club’s tally to 101 junior premierships. Our 16C, 14C and 12D teams finished as Runners Up. In the seniors only our B2 team progressed as far as the Semi-Finals. This season Cricket Australia’s introduced the Stage No.1 playing format, which saw the U10 and U12 playing conditions modified to fewer fielders, restricted batting and shorter pitches. As a result the Club decided to set aside the old Club records. Also as a consequence the Club decided to no longer award team trophies for U10 cricket with all players receiving a participation trophy. U10 players were also made ineligible to receive “Performance Awards” so the Club introduced the “U10 Most Consistent Player Trophy”. On the representative front Ben Dwarshuis was selected in the Prime Ministers XI to play South Africa as well as playing in the NSW Blues and Sydney Sixers. Kobey Freer and Lachlan Ritchie were selected to represent NSW in the U12 Schoolboy Championships in Bunbury Western Australia. Lachlan was also the recipient of the NSWDC “Gee Shield Cricketer of the Year”.

In the season of 1991/92 the junior competition rules were changed as follows: from time limit to an over limit game, with restrictions on individual bowlers, the number of competition rounds were set at ten. In the younger age groups Introductory and Modified rules were introduced. In 2018/19 junior competition rules were changed by Cricket Australia as follows: the U10 & U12 competitions changed from two day matches to one day matches, the length of the pitch shortened, number of fielders reduced and compulsory retirement at a set number of balls faced by the batsman. CURRENT MAJOR CLUB AWARDS

In the 1996/97 season the Committee decided to make changes to our major awards and perpetuals. This season saw the introduction of Performance Awards in the Junior (U10 & U12) and Intermediate (U14 & U16) Divisions for Batting, Bowling and Wicket Keeping. All previous trophies except for the "Barry McManus Memorial Shield" and the "Robert Tickner Fielding Trophy" were archived and replaced with new trophies named after each of the Life Members at that time.

In the 1998/99 season the "Senior Division Wicket Keeping Performance Award" was introduced and the "Barry McManus Memorial Shield" was replaced by the "Bob Price Encouragement Shield". The "Junior Club Champion Trophy" was re-introduced as the "Junior Club Champion Trophy (Junior & Intermediate Divisions)" fittingly bearing the name of Club's founder Barry McManus and the "Robert Tickner Fielding Trophy" was replaced by the "Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy".

In the 2001/02 season the Senior Division Batting and Bowling Performance awards were introduced and the first two recipients of the "EDCC Bradman Foundation Scholarship" went to the Bradman coaching camp in Bowral. 2003/04 saw the introduction of the "Junior Club All Rounder (Junior & Intermediate Divisions)" followed by the "Senior Club All Rounder" in 2011/12. In 2005/06 the "Wesley Adams Memorial Award" was first issued. Wesley was the editor and publisher of the Engadine District News and provided great publicity for our Club for many years. This was the only Club trophy not to carry the name of a Life Member. In the 2016/17 season the Junior and Senior Division Fielding Performance Awards were introduced with the "Greg Heffernan Trophy" becoming the "Intermediate Division Fielding Performance Award". The "EDCC Bradman Foundation Scholarship" and the Wesley Adams Memorial Award" were discontinued in 2014/15 and 2016/17 respectively.

In 2018/19 all Junior Division Performance and Club awards were made ineligible to U10 players due to the changes in the U10 format. As consequents the "Most Consistent U10 Player Trophy" was introduced.

Perpetual Trophies and Awards Criteria

Below is the criteria at this time used to access the awarding of the above Club awards.

GUIDELINES

The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.

Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final match has been played or any other such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

In the absence of nominations the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.

The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge exceptional circumstances or to provide encouragement. The Management Committee may also adjust criteria's from season to season to reflect changed conditions of play.

All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

All perpetual trophies remain the property of Engadine Dragons Cricket Club. All perpetual trophies must be returned in good order to the Club Secretary at such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

ADMENDMENTS

Due to the implementation of Cricket Australia Junior Cricket Stage 1 in 2018/19 and the subsequent changes to the U10 playing format our Club decided to no longer award U10 "Individual Team Awards". Instead all U10 players shall be presented with a participation trophy. It was also decided that U10 players will be ineligible to be awarded "Performance Awards" or "Special Club Awards". The Club has introduced the "Most Consistent U10 Player" trophy to recognise the most consistent performance by an U10 player. The "Junior Division" has been amended to only represent U12 teams and players, while the "Intermediate Division" remains unchanged and still represents U14 & U16 teams and players.

GENERAL CRITERIA

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the determination of performance awards, the following criteria shall apply uniformly. Where a bowler is competing with a batsman and/or wicket keeper for a Club honour, the following system shall apply –

- For each 10 runs scored – 1 point
- For each wicket taken – 1.3 points
- For each catch/stumping made – 1 point

Where two batsmen or two bowlers are vying for an honour/award the Management Committee will take into account the ratio of runs to innings, and/or wickets to overs noting the strike and economy rates and in each instance make judgment based on its assessment of all circumstances. The above may also be used for determining "All-rounders" but with respect to the junior, intermediate and senior divisions it is to be read in conjunction with the criteria specified.

PARTICIPATION AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Master Blasters and U10 Teams

All U8 Master Blasters and U10 players will be presented with a participation trophy.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions

For U12, U14 and U16 teams engaged in SSJCA competition cricket there will be four awards per team presented. The awards are - Batting, Bowling, Fielding (including wicket keeper) and Coaches. For batting, bowling and fielding the awards will be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from the official Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. In the case of more than one fielder/wicket keeper sharing the highest aggregate the player greater number of catches will be awarded the trophy. In the instance of a player winning all three awards priority will be given to the batting and bowling awards with the "General Criteria" used to determine which award, batting or bowling is presented. The other award batting or bowling will be presented to the player with the second highest aggregate. In the case of the batting or bowling award winner also achieving the greatest number of fielding /wicket keeping dismissals the fielding award will be presented to the fielder/wicket keeper with the next highest number of fielding/wicket keeping dismissals. The Coaches award will be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager). No one person may win more than one of the above four awards.

Senior Division

To each team there shall be awards for batting, bowling, and, where earned, all-rounder. For batting, and bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. In addition, consideration will be given by the Management Committee to recognizing "all rounder" skills where the efforts of an individual player provide justification for an all-rounder award. As a guide, minimum 200 runs scored and 15 wickets taken or minimum 200 runs scored and 12 wicket keeping dismissals (catches/stumpings). In the event of a bowler/wicket keeper qualifying the standard is set as 200 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. All team awards shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team.

In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season playing traditional cricket. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official scorebook and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

Wicket Keeping Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

"The Clem Heffernan Trophy"

Senior Division

"The Col Berry Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of wicket keeping dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined by the lowest average of byes to dismissals.

Fielding Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

Junior Division (U12)

"The Paul Waddell Trophy"

Intermediate Division

"The Greg Heffernan Trophy"

Senior Division

"The Greg Knowles Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the fielder is credited with the greatest number of fielding dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will be the aggregate of all fielding catches and unassisted run outs credited to the fielder as shown in the official score books and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on the most catches taken.

CLUB AWARDS

Most Improved Team

"The Bob Vannan Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager)

Determined by the Management Committee and awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be taken into account.

Encouragement Shield

"The Bob Price Shield"

(Perpetual shield and personal shield)

Nominations are sought and awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee the award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will take into account age, performance, level at which played, years of experience, commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricket to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement

than one coming through the levels.

Rookie of the Year

“The Ken Tever Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Nominations are sought and determined by the Management Committee and awarded to a player who has completed in their first season of competition cricket and has displayed a high level of skill, ability, potential and enthusiasm for the game. There is no weighting for grade, but preference will be given to the younger age groups.

Senior Rookie of the Year

“The Bill Knowles Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Nominations are sought in writing and determined by the Management Committee and awarded to a player who is ineligible for junior cricket and has competed in their first season as a senior cricketer. The award will be determined by the player who has displayed a high level of skill, ability, potential and enthusiasm for the game. There is no weighting for grade.

Most Consistent U10 Player

“EDCC Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks, but be exclusive of Final Series. To be awarded to the most consistent U10 player, who through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved him/herself competitive in the SSJCA U10 competition. In determining the merits relative to a batsman, bowler or wicket keeper the “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing this award.

Player of the Round Award

(Personal trophy)

At the completion of each round/rounds one player from U10, U12, Intermediate and Senior division who has achieved the best performance shall be awarded the “Player of the Round”. No player can receive the award more than once in a season. If two performances in the one division are deemed equal the Management Committee may use its digression to reward both efforts. Management Committee reserves the right to not award a ‘Player of the Round’ if in their assessment the performance in any of the divisions does not deserve recognition.

EDCC Service Awards

(Memento awarded)

Club Service Awards were introduced in 1996-1997. Service Award acknowledges continuous club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards are in periods of five years – five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS

Junior Club All Rounder

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

“The Ian Latham Trophy”

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in U12 & Intermediate Division. As a guide the following qualification apply – U12, minimum 100 runs scored and 8 wickets taken or minimum 100 runs scored and 7 wicket keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 100 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 10 dismissals. Intermediate Division, minimum 150 runs scored and 12 wickets taken or minimum 150 runs scored and 8 wicket keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 150 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 12 dismissals. The criteria shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. Please note: For the purpose of assessing and determining the award the above criteria shall apply with 1 point for each 10 runs scored, 1.3 points for each wicket taken and 1 point for each wicket keeping catch/stumping made. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and unassisted run out.

Senior Club All Rounder (Senior Division)

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

“The Dean Griffith Trophy”

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in Junior/Intermediate Divisions. As a guide the following qualification apply, minimum of 200 runs scored and 15 wickets taken or minimum 200 runs scored and 12 wicket keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 200 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. A player who represents the club in more than one senior team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. Please note: For the purpose of assessing and determining the award the above criteria shall apply with 1 point for each 10 runs scored, 1.3 points for each wicket taken and 1 point for each wicket keeping catch/stumping made. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and unassisted run out.

Club Member of the Year

“The Val Tever Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy & personal gift)

Nominations are sought in writing and determined by the Management Committee and awarded to a club member who gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the Club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Executive Committee shall determine the recipient.

Junior Club Champion

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

“The Barry McManus Trophy”

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. Awarded to the most outstanding cricketer in U14 & U16 through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved him/herself competitive at the higher levels of the SSJCA Competition. In determining the merits relative to a

batsman, bowler or wicket keeper the “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing this award.

Senior Club Champion

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

“The Harry Robbins Trophy”

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who through their efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. In determining the merits relative to a batsman, bowler or wicket keeper the “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing this award.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Life Membership

(Life Membership Badge)

In considering any such nomination the committee will be guided by the Club Constitution, in particular – Membership Part No.2 – 2.7 Life Membership –

(a) A Life member is a club member awarded the honorary title of Life Member for outstanding services to the Club.

(b) There shall be for the purposes of recognising outstanding service two streams of entry to Life Membership, playing service and administrative service.

(c) Consideration for Life Membership may only be exercised when the nominee has given no less than 25 years service to the club as Playing Member (as defined in Rule 2.2) or, no less than 10 years service to the club as a Committee Member, or some other Club support service of a non-playing nature.

(d) Consideration for Life Membership will be undertaken in the first instance by the Management only upon receipt of a written nomination containing reasons in support. Any club members may make such nomination to any member of the Management Committee.

(e) The Management Committee will examine all such nominations and in exercising absolute discretion accept or reject any nomination. Any decision taken is neither subject to explanation nor appeal.

(f) The Management Committee determines for approval that the nominee is worthy of the honour proposed, shall advise members at the next general monthly meeting. That recommendation shall contain details of the service given by the nominee and justification for the action proposed. Approval being a majority vote.

(g) A Life Member whose award derives from 25 years playing service shall henceforth pay no playing fee to the Club beyond that which the Club will impose to cover costs associated with Association registration, insurance and any other like matter.

(h) A Life Member shall pay no fees to the Club (with the exception set out above in Rule 2.7(g)) and

shall be entitled to vote at any club meeting and receive any special consideration as the Management Committee may determine.

(i) Each life member shall be presented with a suitably designed Life Membership badge.

(j) A Life member is subject to the rules and regulations and Code of Conduct of the Club.

It gives me great pleasure as the Watson Shield and Engadine's coach of the 16A's whom Ben both represented in 2006/07 to write of his cricket performances as the recipient of Sutherland Shires' most prestigious cricket award, the junior Cricketer Of The Year.

Ben came to our club as a second year U/12 player in 2002/03. As an aggressive left handed batsman and an off break bowler we were impressed from his initial net trial. I still recall Harry Robbins exact comment upon seeing him the very first time "this boy will get a lot of runs for our club" wise words indeed!

That prediction didn't take long for that same season Ben set a batting average that may never be beaten, 479 runs @ 159.67. That same season Ben scored his maiden century, 108*. Meanwhile his representative career was showing promise but was still one season away from blossoming. In 2003/04 Ben scored his first representative century, 106* against Hawkesbury after Sutherland were in real trouble at 4-27. His century coupled with a great partnership of 223 with Michael Sharkey setting up a great victory for his side.

In the meantime Ben was busy adding an extra string to his bow, as a threatening medium pace bowler. With developing height and strength Ben progressed from a first/second change bowler to an aggressive opener sharing the new ball. His developing skills saw him selected in the Emerging Blues. By 2005/06 Ben's all round talent was such, that as a first year 16A player he was the team's outstanding bowler with 21 wickets @ an average under 10. All the while compiling runs at a steady rate.

This past season was always Ben's. In club cricket his 464 runs @ 58 average was more than a hundred runs clear of anyone whilst he was equal top wicket taker with 19 scalps. Ben scored two centuries, 101 (retired himself) and a murderous 160, an innings which rates as possibly the best I have witnessed in junior competition. His fine form carried over into the districts Green Shield where his powerful batting accounted for 278 @ 46 per innings. With limited bowling opportunities Ben still managed 4 wickets from 15 overs with his best return 3-9. His great form culminated with his inclusion into the 1st Green Shield combined team.

Jay first showed his ability with the bat during the 1996/97 season as a member of the premiership winning Illawong 10A side where he scored 319 runs for the season at an Association record average of 79.75. He scored the only century in 10A's that season (127 not out)

He was selected in the Foster Shield representative team that year and his consistency at this level has been demonstrated by his selection in every SSJCA representative team of his junior career.

He was back in prominence in the 2000/01 season by having the best Association batting average in 14A's (53.17 scoring, again, 319 runs including one innings of 103). This season also saw Jay emerge as a quality "all-rounder" in the Moore Shield representative team.

It is with great pleasure, as coach of EDCC 16A's in 2000/2001 that I have been asked to write about Ryan (also known as and referred to as "Shep").

Although in my first year of team coaching, having been actively involved in cricket at all levels in the Sutherland Shire for over 36 years, I feel confident in my judgment that Ryan is something very special and capable of progressing to the very top.

The 16A's competition was well contested with a host of quality players, many of who would have been worthy recipients of this prestigious award. However, in Ryan not only statistically was he the

best performed, he was easily the most respected opponent of all opposing players and coaches. This is often far more relevant than anything else.

Ryan was the premier batsman in the competition, a model of consistency, only missing out once when he was run out in the final. Suffice to say his impact on any game when at the crease is so great, that it was clearly the turning point of the game. I know all those associated with the eventual premiers Miranda, breathed a huge sigh of relief when Shep walked from the field.

The most significant fact about Shep's batting is the manner in which he scores his runs. Always looking to dominate opposing attacks, scoring quickly, plundering anything loose, whilst accumulating runs all round the wicket through his complete array of strokes. Another key feature of his batting, which is often a weakness particularly with young players, is his excellent running between wickets.

Almost every partnership of note that our team enjoyed involved Ryan. Each player enjoyed batting with him, although it can be hazardous at the non-striker's end when the ball whistles past you at great speed. The team's confidence grew every time Ryan began to dominate.

Ryan plays the game the way it should be played letting his willow do the talking for him. What impressed me most about him was the manner in which he accepted his dismissals whether they are dubious or otherwise. There were no remonstrations, sulking or excuses he simply accepted what occurred.

Most of this report has concentrated on Shep's batting but one should not forget his bowling and fielding. As is the case with many of our shires elite players, they are athletes capable of performing all disciplines. Ryan bowls at good pace, using his strength to maximum advantage. At first slip he took several good snares & even wicket kept on occasions with distinction.

Shep was an integral member of both the Watson & Green Shield teams. Filled in for the Engadine Dragons AI team and Sutherland District 5th grade, again demonstrating everyone's confidence in his ability and temperament to play against those many years his senior. It also shows his love for the game, as boys these days seem to be playing or practicing cricket almost every day of the week. What I failed to mention earlier is that Ryan is in his first season of 16's! One can only wonder what he might do next season.

When you look at the statistics below please remember last season was an Olympic year, meaning 4 of the 10 games played were 30 over a side games. It was also a particularly wet period with grass coverage on fields, presenting an unfair challenge to all of our young cricketer's.

I know everyone associated with EDCC is extremely proud of Ryan and would acknowledge that he is not only a fine ambassador of our club but to cricket as a whole.

Congratulations Ryan, continue to play the game the way it should be played and may you fulfil that enormous potential.

Nathan's first season was with the Engadine Dragons in 1982/83 and whilst not setting the world on fire with bat and ball he did signal that here was a cricketer of some ability by taking 10 catches for the season. His second season saw Nathan unleash his full potential by scoring 479 runs including a century, and taking 32 wickets at an average of 7.22.

Since then there has been no looking back and his year to year statistics tell the story dramatically, that here is a player who is a cut above the rest. His achievements are too many to list in full but some of the best are listed below.

1985/86 took 42 wickets including a double hat trick for his club, scored a massive 379 in the "Cawsey Shield" series at an average of 42.1 and took 37 wickets at an average of 5.4. Captained the Metropolitan East School team at the NSW titles and the NSW team at the Australian titles.

In the past 3 seasons he has more than 300 runs and taken 30 or more wickets on every occasion. In addition to this he has been selected in the Metropolitan Youth Squad in each of the 3 years.
