Chairs Report

A successful season, notwithstanding the challenges, frustrations, and indeed dangers posed by the Covid-19 pandemic. That we were able to proceed and complete the season is a tribute to the outstanding

healthcare professionals, Cricket NSW staff and the army of cricket volunteers throughout our local communities.

For the NSWDCA, season highlights included:

- Continued growth and support for the revamped Youth Championships.
- Particularly pleasing to see the expansion in Division 2 numbers evidenced by strong parental and player feedback.
- Notwithstanding the challenges associated with team formation, it was pleasing that once again Watson, Telegraph and Martin Shields competitions were able to proceed.
- Perhaps the season highlight from the NSW DCA perspective was the outstanding Watson Shield Competition that yielded several nail biting encounters. This culminated in the remarkable grand final between St George and Parramatta that saw the title determined in the last over with a direct hit run out.
- The Watson Shield Competition and the remarkable conclusion to it, highlighted the value and relevance of persevering with representative cricket for this age group.

As NSWDCA Chair, I'm particularly pleased that for season 21/22 Cricket NSW has recognised the merit of Watson Shield which will see that competition take its place among the Youth Championships.

Working with Cricket NSW, the NSWDCA has been able to achieve a common sense and flexible compromise on community cricket formats which will be implemented for the 21-22 season.

At the initiative of Cricket NSW's CEO Lee Germon and staff, the State Governing Body has listened to the concerns raised by member associations in relation to Stage 3 formats. These issues were ventilated through a constructive process of engagement with associations and rep coordinators.

This process culminated in a positive outcome for members, whereby the integrity of new formats has been retained, but with important flexibility for associations in the crucial 14 to 17 year age groups.

The year has also seen a renewed focus by the NSWDCA on its fundamental role of being the peak organization and advocate for member associations in relationships with the State's Governing Body.

To this end, NSWDCA has continued to consolidate its relationship with Cricket NSW, particularly in assisting the governing body in delivering the Youth Championships and performing a crucial link role for members in facilitating cross-association competition.

In conclusion, I wish to thank my colleague Committee Members for their passion, commitment and support throughout the year. A special thank you to the Cricket NSW staff, who support, guide and assist the NSWDCA - Bruce Whitehouse and Jess McMahon.



Shell Shield

In May 1963, the NSWJCU wrote to oil companies seeking sponsorship of the inter-association competitions. In August 1963 the Shell Company of Australia Ltd agreed to provide an annual fee for this purpose. This arrangement stayed in place until 1993, when Shell decided to no longer finance the Inter-Association Competition. This Shield was first awarded to the Association having the best overall performance in the Watson, Moore, Cawsey and Foster Shields. In 2000/01 it was decided to give the shield to the Association which gains the highest percentage of points from the seven junior competitions.

James Searle Shield

In September 1936 Walker and Hall Ltd, silversmiths of George Street, offered to provide a trophy to the value of 10 guineas for presentation as the NSWJCU saw fit. In October, the NSWJCU decided it should be awarded to the Association, which gained "the highest percentage points in the Martin and Daily Telegraph Shields". Following the death in December 1936 of Life Member James Searle, the trophy was named in his honour.

James Martin and Co Shield (Open age male)
