PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to report that in reviewing the 1995-96 season, I find many reasons to be impressed with the outcomes achieved.

To move three rungs up the ladder of success in the Junior Competition, by coming in fifth this year compared to eighth last year, is very satisfying. More so, when you evaluate the way in which this was achieved. With only two A grade teams, the high point scorers, the lower graded teams need to perform consistently, to enable the club to be competitive. This we did and my congratulations to all Coaches and players. Not only did we gain three premierships, but all the lower graded teams performed to their potential and scored valuable club points. This is not to say the two A grade teams did not achieve. They did. However, at that level the competition is extremely fierce and the line between success and failure in real terms is marginal. A dropped catch, a missed chance, a poor decision can all be the determinant to swing a match.

Our two Senior teams also did well. The Al team, for the second year running, found the weather a significant factor in denying the team a well deserved success, and the B7 team came in equal second, only to miss out on the final on a countback.

Off the field, the season's success can be attributed to the efforts of a hard working committee, with everyone playing their part. None more so than Ian Latham who, in his first year as Secretary, led by example and not only made my task easier, but set such a high standard that the rest of us lifted our games accordingly.

A consistent turn up of Coaches and Managers at monthly meetings made communications easier and also minimised mistakes. Indeed, so well did team managements attend to their responsibilities that Association fines amounted to only \$15, an all time low. Next year, we'll aim for nil.

BOYS SECRETARY REPORT

Although we lost a lot of boys to Senior cricket from last seasons 16's, we were fortunate enough to have an influx of thirty new players, without previous experience, and six transfers from other clubs. Therefore, we were able to field the same number of teams as last season - nine - eight competition and one Under Eights.

Through the efforts of a dedicated team of coaches, managers and scorers, we were able to have a very successful season, equalling last year's performance of three Minor Premiers and Premiers. We also managed to move up three places in the Club Championship, from Eighth to Fifth position. Of our remaining teams, three finished Third and two Fourth, with our mighty Under Eights winning five of their ten matches, a top effort for such a young team.

During the season, I made quite a few visits to various training sessions and I am happy to say all I ever saw was an enthusiastic group of boys enjoying their cricket, and I think that attitude was reflected in the results.

Successful seasons don't just happen, it takes a lot of hard work and patience, so I'd like to thank all the players for their efforts and hope they enjoyed their cricket, the Coaches, Managers, Scorers and last, but definitely not least, the parents who do all the driving around and give such great support at the matches.

I would like to thank the committee for their support during the season, making my job a lot easier and very enjoyable.

Our newly introduced Operations Manual for Coaches and Managers was a success, and our initial venture into sending Coaches to a clinic for accreditation paid dividends. We shall keep this program up in 1996/7. Our efforts to upgrade Anzac No. 2 paid off and with the financial assistance of the 527 Management Committee, (\$2,500 contribtance of the 527 Management for the best playing grounds in ution), ANZAC is now one of the best playing grounds in the Shire.

Husbanding our financial resources and allocating funds must all be budgetted for. To maintain our financial standing, yet contain charges to the lowest viable level is not easy. Accordingly, I take this opportunity to foreshadow an increase in charges next season. While it will be minimal, it will be essential to offset capital outlay expected.

Finally, but most wholeheartedly, my congratulations to three champion teams, 10Ds, 12Cs and 16Cs on their premierships. To all concerned with the teams, whether player, supporter, coach, manager or "major helper", "Well Done". Ladies please note, the 12Cs were managed by Jillian Hall, our only lady manager. Affirmative Action wins again!

I thank everyone for a most successful season, and I hope to see every 1995/96 player not only return for 1996/7, but bring along a mate. You come, we'll provide.
