

16A TEAM REPORT

AWARD WINNERS - ALL ROUNDER: ALAN BIDDLE BATTING: DEAN HASLEHURST BOJLING: ADAM MACKRELL FIELDING: DAVID HINE COACH'S: BRAD GLENNAN

The 91/92 season could best be described as "frustrating". Although we finished 3rd in the competition, we were involved in 3 drawn matches, the first when defending 231 runs against St. Patricks and the latter two against Gymea Bay and Caringbah Sports when chasing moderate totals. All three games were washed out on the second Saturday.

Frustrations aside, the boys performed splendidly during the remaining matches, suffering only 2 losses (rounds 2 and 3) and winning 5 matches. As all but two of the boys were in their final year of junior cricket, I would like to take this opportunity to wish them all the best in their future cricketing careers.

The following is a brief resume of each boys' season.

DAVID HINE: The team captain, who enjoyed only moderate success with the bat, but led by example in the field and handled his bowlers and fieldsmen very professionally.

ADAM MACKRELL: The leading wickst taker with 18 wickets, who bowled his off spinners very accurately and apart from one innings of 52 runs, would rather not be reminded of his batting efforts.

DAVID CLISSOLD: Bowled his left arm leg spinners very accurately and economically, and was rewarded with 10 wickets. Had a mixed season with the bat, although his opportunities were limited.

BRAD GLENNAN: Can be well satisfied with his season's BRAD GLEINING opened the batting with reasonable success efforts. and towards the season's end, bowled his leg spinners and towerfully, snaring 10 wickets in all.

BEAU KNOJLES: Played only half the season due to work commitments after the Christmas break. Had little chance to impress with his batting due to lack of opportunities.

ADAM JONES: After a slow start to the season, he bowled impressively on several occasions capturing 10 wickets for the season. Only batted 3 times during the season and did so with gritty determination.

TRENT STEWART: A very disappointing season for Trent, although he managed to show a glimpse of his potential in the last round. Available for Under 16's again next year, he will no doubt have benefited from his experience.

GLEN GOCDMAN: The other first year boy who showed he will be a force to be reckoned with next year. He played a couple of gritty mature innings during the season to be the 3rd highest runscorer with 121 runs.

ALAL BIDDLE: Enjoyed a most successful season with 10 catches and 4 stumpings behind the wickets and several hard hitting innings, which produced 233 runs with a top score of 64.

PAUL McDCNOUGH: Another successful all rounder who captured ll wickets and scored 117 runs which could, with better concentration, have been a considerably higher aggregate.

DEAN HESLEHURST: Scored a mammoth 412 runs at 68.66, Including consecutive scores of 114 not out, 79 run out and 115 not out. Showed concentration and maturity beyond his years and managed to capture 6 wickets as a bonus. (25)

NEIL ANSCEMBE: Bowled with fire on most occasions and NEIL ANSCCMBE: bounded with the success he deserved. wa's not always rewarded with moderate deserved Only batted on three ocasions with moderate success but had a very strong arm and a safe pair of hands in the field.
