The main costs this year, apart from Association fees, balls and equipment, has been the surfacing of the practice wickets with synthetic grass (\$780) and extensions to the practice wickets (\$1510). A very long and hard season. This team was outgunned by the multi-talented Caringbah Sports and Gymea teams, and put in some disappointing performances against the lesser sides. The statistics show 3 wins, 7 losses, however, there were some fine defensive efforts when outright defeat loomed.

Special features of the season were Glenn Goodman's and Darren McCrea's batting efforts against Caringbah and Gymea, Michael Cameron's two classic catches and Todd Parkinson's unbelievable bowling performances. The fielding was consistent with an "A" grade team, although dropped catches cost this team one or two wins.
