SECRETARY'S REPORT

The best news to come out of the 2005-2006 season was that we were able to defend our title and win the hotly contested Club Champions trophy for the second year in succession. Every now and then I hear comments from less informed persons that this is not such a big deal, but to us, this coveted crown is the defining difference that makes our club special. And it's not just about winning or securing some kind of bragging rights, it simply means that collectively, we, as players, parents and officials, are doing most things right both on and off the field of play.

During my tenure as Secretary it has been my pleasure to observe and work alongside some of the most dedicated and enthusiastic club administrators I have ever seen in any similar organization. I congratulate them all for making available their valuable time as well as their considerable energy and expertise.

The Dragons actually fielded 9-competition junior teams plus 4 under 8 sides in 2005-2006, an increase of 4 teams over last season. But the significant difference in the club team make-up was that we were able to attract those 4 under 8 teams. This may not seem all that significant to the casual observer, but to us it is one of the most gratifying things of the year because in about 5 or 6 short years, these little guys will have become the backbone of the club team structure, they will probably be taller than their fathers, they'll be playing 16A's, and, quite possibly, in contention for Emerging Blues selection.

The Senior cricketers branch of our club saw registration match last season's record numbers, with 8 teams taking the field to represent the Royal Blue, Sky Blue and Red colours of our 47 year old club, which, incidentally, is probably older than most people reading this article.

Premiership honours were confined to our junior teams this year with 5 of our 9 teams reaching the Grand Final with ultimately victories to our 14A, 12A and 12D teams and meritorious performances by our 16A and 16C sides who played well but missed out on this occasion. Our C1 and C3 Senior teams both fought their way into the "Big One" and gave a very good account of themselves, but had to settle for the runners-up title this time around.

Our club was once again well represented in the higher levels of the game with a record 20 of our players gaining selection in district rep teams. Our club also produced three NSW Emerging Blues in Daniel Ward, our 16A vice-captain, Sam Newman from our Premiership winning 14A team and Joel D'Imperio vice-captain of our victorious 12A side. Additionally, Ben Marciante, our Junior Club Champion, narrowly missed selection being among the final candidates.

But over-all I would like to think that every one of our players enjoyed the challenge of playing the game with what I honestly believe is the most progressive cricket club in the whole of Sydney. No other club in Sydney and possibly anywhere else in NSW, has their own indoor practice facility, provides a Bradman Scholarship to our two most promising under 12 players to attend a Coaching Camp at Bowral, or provides an end of season trip to Bowral for our under 16 boys to play a match on Bradman Oval right alongside the home of The Don.

Our all-important financial status is, I am pleased to say, sound of wind and limb. There were many who contributed throughout the year in a variety of ways to bring about this most favourable position, but I must give special credit to several club officials for their outstanding efforts. Firstly to Robbie Knight who tirelessly walked the streets of our shopping center and beyond to drum-up team and club sponsorships, to Bob Price and Bill Knowles who not only offered their considerable ticket selling talents but were able to secure an astonishing array of gifts and donations to assist revenue raising whenever the need arose, and to Ken Newman for his outstanding master of ceremonies wheeling and dealing performance at our financially very successful Trivia Night.

Our club President Gordon Scott is retiring from duty this year after 4 meritorious years as President and two as Vice President, he has presided over some of the biggest and most radical changes in the club's history. Fortunately for us we have a ready-made replacement in Steve Jones whom you all saw hold up the Club Champion trophy at our Grand Final Barbecue in the Anzac Oval Recreation Centre.

But I could not end this annual summation without giving a special mention to a guy who has been an inspirational club motivator for more than ten years. I refer to Ian Latham who was not only club secretary for 10 years, but he was also the driving force behind a multitude of innovations, new directions and creativity the likes of which we may never see again.

I took on the roll of secretary this year to allow Ian to progressively detach himself from his decade of duty and allow a younger person to emerge from the ranks to take on this responsibility and whenever the need arose where I found myself floundering, Ian made himself instantly available to assist me.

There have been some great men and women who have come and gone in the history of this club, but in my opinion, none would surpass this guy. We owe Ian Latham a very large debt of gratitude.

I extend my heartiest congratulations to the following: -

- * To all involved in the highly successful under 16 End of Year Match at Bradman Oval in Bowral.
- * To Joel D'Imperio and Ben Dwarshuis on their selection for the Bradman Scholarship.
- * To Judy Lofthouse and Bob Price on their selection as joint Club Members of the Year.
- * To our Junior Club Champion Ben Marciante.
- * To our Senior Club Champion Drew Lake.
- * To all our sponsors for supporting us again this year.
- * And especially to all our players who played the game so well and in such a great spirit.

The future will see us extend our indoor facility to full pitch length plus a bit more this year, to allow indoor bowling as well as batting practice and, with Harry Robbin's help, we will continue to pursue the establishment of an under 19 comp with the Sutherland cricket administrators.

As for me, well, I think I see a very capable guy emerging on the horizon so, I think it's time I put my cue in the rack and allow this younger and infinitely more capable young man to take my place.

It has been a pleasure to have been of service. The memories I take with me will all be good.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Firstly, I'd like to congratulate all the junior players for another very successful year on the field where we were able to defend the Club Championship. All players play an important role in achieving this goal. Unfortunately, there was limited success with the senior teams as there were no overall champions but plenty of improvement from the previous year.

As this is my first year as treasurer, I have taken the opportunity to implement a couple of changes. The major change impacting the financial position of the club is the timing of the closure of the accounts. As from this year the accounts are as at the end of March and not the end of May as per previous years. This ensures club members are informed of the financial position the year in which it relates to and not 12 months later, as has been the case in the past.

This has created a greatly improved closing balance as not all the end of year costs are included, the major cost excluded is associated with the presentation nights (mainly trophies). However, even after allowing for this the club had a very successful year financially and is in a great position to fund the expansion of the clubroom in the coming season.

Highlights include:

- Increase in cash balances by \$16,672.40, after allowing for the estimated cost of the presentations (around \$5,000), is expected to be over \$11,000, a fantastic result.
- Advertising/Sponsorship for the year was over \$10,000, to all those who contributed, a big thanks, this helps in reducing registration fees and makes it more affordable for the average player.
- The trivia night raised over \$4,000, the most successful ever, thanks for all those who attended and made it a most enjoyable and successful night.
- Once again our club raffle raised around \$2,000, again thanks for those who supported this.
- All junior players received a new playing shirt, together with 3 senior teams.
- We have also re-introduced photos for the juniors, the final result is unknown but it's estimated to add an additional \$1,000 to the club profits.
- On the field, we maintained our senior teams at 8 and expanded our junior teams by 4, including 4 U/8 teams, the most in the association. Overall, we increased our players by around 40.

Future Costs Outstanding;

- Presentation nights, estimated at \$5,000, including trophies etc.
- Clubroom expansion, around \$7,500, target completion prior to registration days for the 06/07 season.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether it's sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players or parents everyone plays some part towards the success of the club, whether it's on the playing field or financial.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS

PAUL WADDELL CLUB RECORD – 500 WICKETS

Paul Waddell, better known to all as Wal, joined the Club in 1983 as an 11 year old rookie and was graded in the 12E's. That first year he was coached by Peter Clothier and Russ Waddell and took 18 wickets bowling leg spin. Since then, 23 seasons have passed and, having never missed one, he has played at all levels wherever the Club has asked, including filling in for the A1's. He subsequently changed to medium pace line and length bowling and by the start of the 2005/2006 season had taken 496 wickets, the majority bowled.

On Saturday 10th September 2005 at Port Hacking Oval, against Caringbah he broke through the 500-barrier taking 8 for 59. In so doing Wal became the first club member on record to achieve this hallmark.

Some of his better efforts have been, - in 1986/1987 (16D) he took 7 for 29 against St Pats, in 1987/1988 (16C) he took 7 for 10 against Caringbah, in 1995/1996 (B7) 8 for 19 against Miranda, then 1996/1997 (B6) 7 for 11 v Miranda, 1999/2000(B2) 7 for 31 against Cronulla. In 1996/1997 (B6) against Caringbah he took a hat trick in figures of 6 for 37.

As a junior he took 93 wickets in five seasons. In the following 18 seasons of senior cricket he has taken a further 441.

He was EDCC Senior Club Champion in 1996/1997 following his season haul of 48 wickets at 10.25. In 1998/99 he took out the SSCA B6 bowling aggregate and average awards with 36 wickets at 10.4.

At the end of the 2005/2006 season his tally stands at 534 wickets. As a measure of his consistency his last five seasons have yielded 136 wickets at an average of 27.2 per season and a cost of 12.36 runs per wicket.

He has passed on his enthusiasm and bowling knowledge to many young players in the Club having coached a number of junior teams notably, under 10s (3 times) and a joint 16C Engadine/St. Patrick's team.

Always a willing worker when the Club needs a hand it is with pleasure we congratulate him on his achievement and his contribution to the sport and the Club's rich history.

We wish him continuance of his efforts and look forward to him reaching 600 wickets in the not too distant future.

VAL TEVER & BOB PRICE HUGHES COMMUNITY AWARD

Congratulations to our Life Members Val Tever and Bob Price who have been awarded the "Hughes Community Award" for their services to our local community. Val received her award for services to the Sutherland Shire Region Girl Guides and Bob for his services to sport in Engadine.

Val and Bob awards were presented to them by Danna Vale, Federal Member for Hughes on February 5 at Club Menai. Mrs Vale expressed her thoughts by saying "It was truly an honour to meet with these selfless volunteers, who give so much to their local communities and seek no reward for their efforts."

They are both tireless workers for our Club and we are very proud of their achievement. Val and Bob join fellow Life Members Harry Robbins and Russ Waddell as recipients of this prestigious award.

BRADMAN CHALLENGE MATCH

What is hoped to become an annual fixture on the Club's Calender proved to be a resounding success with all involved. Twenty four players, a multitude of relatives and friends, were treated to a postcard setting, a perfect autumn day, 500 plus runs and a swag of wickets.

The format of the match saw the first year U/16's challenge the second year U/16's in an entertaining match that went down to the wire. In the end the old boys captained by Ryan Croom and coached by Harry Robbins narrowly defeated the young boys captained by Daniel Ward and coached by Dennis Pendergast. Congratulations to all the players on way they presented and conducted themselves as representatives of our Club, you did us proud.

The Club would like to thank the Committee members and official umpires Robbie Knight and Stephen Chapman for their contribution on the day. Also thanks to Jenny Ward, Barbara Pendergast, Patricia Croom, Jodi Latham and Kim Herne for organising and setting up the afternoon tea. PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA

2005/2006 SEASON

Note:

- The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.
- Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations, all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final last played or any other such date as the Committee may announce or publish.
- In the absence of nominations the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.
- The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge special circumstances or to provide encouragement.
- All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

GENERAL CRITERIA:

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the determination of performance awards, the following criteria shall apply uniformly: Where a bowler is competing with a batsman and/or wicket keeper for a Club honour, the following system shall apply:

- For each 10 runs scored: - 1 point
- For each wicket taken: - 1 point
- For each catch/stumping made: - 1 point

Where two batsmen or two bowlers are vying for an honour/award the Management Committee will take into account the ratio of runs to innings, and/or wickets to overs noting the strike and economy rates and in each instance make judgment based on its assessment of all circumstances.

The above may also be used for determining "All-rounders" but with respect to the junior, intermediate and senior divisions it is to be read in conjunction with the criteria specified.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS:

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions: For all junior and intermediate teams engaged in SSJCA competition cricket there will be four awards presented. One for batting and one for bowling plus two others to be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager). The Coach and Manager may recommend two awards from the following four categories;- Most Improved Player, Most Consistent Player, Team Player and Best Fielder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. No one person may win more than one of the above awards.

In addition, consideration will be given by the Management Committee to recognizing "all rounder" skills where the efforts of an individual player provide justification for an All-rounder award. As a guide, within the Junior Division, minimum 100 runs scored and 10 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 7 catches/stumpings). Intermediate Division, minimum 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals. The Management Committee will look at situations that parallel these performance levels and take such efforts into account.

Senior Division: To each team there shall be available awards for batting, bowling, and, where earned, All-rounder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. To qualify as an All-rounder the recipient must have achieved in the season, no less than 200 runs scored and 20 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 15 catches/stumpings). A player who represents the club in more than one team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE DIVISIONS PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Six (6) trophies awarded.

Batting Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

Wicket Keeping Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of two keepers or more having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

Note: In all cases above, in the event of a tied aggregate, the award will be determined on average.

SENIOR DIVISION PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Three (3) trophies awarded.

Batting Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

Wicket Keeping Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of two keepers or more having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

Note: In all cases above, in the event of a tied aggregate, the award will be determined on average.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS:

Senior Club Champion: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who, through efforts with bat or ball has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club Champion (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding cricketer in either the junior or intermediate divisions, who through efforts with bat or ball has proved him/herself competitive at the higher levels (A or B Grade) of the SSJCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club All Rounder (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in either the Junior or Intermediate Divisions. As a guide a minimum of 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as a combination of wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. For the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and run out (the Thrower). While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

JUNIOR & INTERMEDIATE CLUB AWARDS:

Most Improved Team: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager) Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be taken into account.

Bob Price Encouragement Shield: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee. The award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will take into account age, performance, level at which played, years of experience. Commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricketer to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded specifically for fielding effort. The number of catches taken is a factor but for a wicketkeeper allowance is made for the advantages of gloves. Considerations include alertness, speed and accuracy of returns, determination, and encouragement of fellow players, in particular bowlers.

Rookie of the Year: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player who has completed their first ever year of competitive cricket and has displayed potential and enthusiasm for the game.

SENIOR CLUB AWARDS:

Outstanding Junior in Men's Cricket: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player in the first full year ever of senior cricket who displays a high level of skill, ability, and potential.

EDCC SERVICE AWARDS:

Club Service Awards: Introduced in 1996/97, the Service Award acknowledges continuous club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards are in periods of five years, ie: five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

Club Member of the Year: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Awarded to a club member who, gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Club Executive shall determine the recipient.

Life Membership: While any club member may nominate any other club member to be a Life Member such nomination is to be in writing with reasons in support. The Management Committee is not bound to accept nominations or give reasons for rejection. In considering any such nomination it will be guided as follows.

- The basic merits of each nomination.
- The years and nature of service to the club rendered by the nominee.
- Generally, but not exclusively, no less than ten years continuous club service is seen as a minimum.

EDDC BRADMAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP:

This scholarship is to select two players eligible to compete in the under 12 age group, preferably from the highest graded team, and send them to attend the Talented Player Coaching Camp conducted by the Bradman Foundation. The course is conducted at Bowral during school holidays. The Club will cover all player costs associated with the camp.

Preference will be given to selecting A grade players with special consideration directed towards those in their second year in that age group, although the grade is not the sole factor. Primarily the scheme seeks annually to identify two keen cricketers within the club, who will benefit from this experience and are deemed to have potential. At the same time they must be seen to be interested in pursuing cricket at the higher levels, eg. Representative and ultimately Grade.

The Management Committee with input from relevant coaches will make the selection at the end of each season. Selections are subject to informal acceptance by players and parents prior to places being reserved, funds committed and a formal decision being announced. Recipients of this award must be registered members of the EDCC as of the time the camp is to be conducted. The selection process and actions taken in the case of the applicants not meeting the above criteria is at the discretion of the Management Committee and no correspondence will be entered into.
