TREASURER'S REPORT

Firstly, I'd like to congratulate all the junior players for another successful year on the field where we had 3 minor premiers and premiers and 1 runner up. As for the seniors all 7 teams made the semis. This was a fantastic result, with 4 progressing to the final and 1 winning the premiership.

In my second year as treasurer, we now have a full year of our finances after changing the closure of the accounts to 31st March last year. This provides a more up to date position of the club's finances and will now provide a comparable annual profit/loss position going forward.

During the year the club made an operating loss of \$598.27, however we saw the extension of our clubroom at a cost of around \$13,000. We also received a government grant of a little over \$4,000 to help fund this extension. A big thanks to all those who contributed to the extension of the room and also the submission of the successful grant.

Highlights include;

- Cash balances of \$16,538.88, after allowing for the estimated cost of the presentations (around \$5,000), is expected to be once again over \$11,000, a fantastic result. We still maintain our term deposit at a little over \$7,000.
- Advertising/Sponsorship for the year was a little under \$10,000. To all those who contributed,
 a big thanks, this helps in reducing registration fees and makes it more affordable for the
 average player.
- The trivia night raised around \$3,500, another fantastic result. Thanks to all those who contributed prizes and those who attended. It was a most enjoyable and successful night.
- Our club raffle raised over \$3,600, which I understand is the best ever, again thanks to those who supported this.
- Once again all junior players received a new playing shirt. This is the second consecutive year the club has managed to achieve enough sponsorship to make this happen.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether its sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players or parents. Everyone plays some part towards the success of the club, whether it's on the playing field or financially.

BRADMAN CHALLENGE MATCH REPORT

The 2nd Annual Bradman Challenge Match was played at Bradman Oval, Bowral, on 21st April and was a tremendous success. Since its inception just last year the match has quickly become a major event on the Dragon's calendar, as evidenced by the outstanding support it received this year. The match is played by two teams of Dragon's juniors, primarily Under 16s, with priority given to those players in their second year. As such, it represents a unique opportunity for many of these players to play on a ground with the status and quality of Bradman Oval and is a marvellous way for them to finish their junior cricket careers with the Dragons. The teams are carefully selected by the coaches and captains to ensure an even mix of ability and the match is played using an averages format, which ensures all players have equal involvement with both bat and ball.

This year's match was played in perfect weather conditions and was attended by a large crowd of family and club members, with many staying overnight and having a most enjoyable and sociable time. "Marciante's Maulers", captained by Ben Marciante and coached by Harry Robbins, were victorious over "Ward's Warriors", captained by Daniel Ward and coached by Dennis Pendergast. The match was keenly contested and played in great club spirit, with plenty of runs scored, wickets taken, no shortage of banter and, most importantly, a lot of laughter and fun had by all. Congratulations to all players for the way they played the game and particularly to Jason Gilmore and Dean McMillan who were players of the match. Many thanks to; Ben, Harry, Daniel and Dennis for their efforts in organising and running the teams, Steve Chapman and Paul Bremner for umpiring, Ian Latham for his organisation, Ken Newman our 'official photographer' and all the parents and supporters who assisted on the day with scoring, afternoon tea and supporting the players and the club. It is events such as this which demonstrate the wonderful club we have and will no doubt be something our junior players can look forward to for many years to come.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA

2006/2007 SEASON

Note:

- The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.
- Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations, all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final last played or any other such date as the Committee may announce or publish.
- In the absence of nominations the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.
- The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge special circumstances or to provide encouragement.
- All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

GENERAL CRITERIA:

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the determination of performance awards, the following criteria shall apply uniformly: Where a bowler is competing with a batsman and/or wicket keeper for a Club honour, the following system shall apply:

For each 10 runs scored: - 1 point
 For each wicket taken: - 1 point
 For each catch/stumping made: - 1 point

Where two batsmen or two bowlers are vying for an honour/award the Management Committee will take into account the ratio of runs to innings, and/or wickets to overs noting the strike and economy rates and in each instance make judgment based on its assessment of all circumstances.

The above may also be used for determining "All-rounders" but with respect to the junior, intermediate and senior divisions it is to be read in conjunction with the criteria specified.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS:

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions: For all junior and intermediate teams engaged in SSJCA competition cricket there will be four awards presented. One for batting and one for bowling plus two others to be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager). The Coach and Manager may recommend two awards from the following four categories; - Most Improved Player, Most Consistent Player, Team Player and Best Fielder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. No one person may win more than one of the above awards.

In addition, consideration will be given by the Management Committee to recognizing "all rounder" skills where the efforts of an individual player provide justification for an All-rounder award. As a guide, within the Junior Division, minimum 100 runs scored and 10 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 7 catches/stumpings). Intermediate Division, minimum 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals. The Management Committee will look at situations that parallel these performance levels and take such efforts into account.

Senior Division: To each team there shall be available awards for batting, bowling, and, where earned, All-rounder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. To qualify as an All-rounder the recipient must have achieved in the season, no less than 200 runs scored and 20 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 15 catches/stumpings). A player who represents the club in more than one team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE DIVISIONS PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Six (6) trophies awarded.

<u>Batting Award:</u> Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

<u>Wicket Keeping Award</u>: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of two keepers or more having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

Note: In all cases above, in the event of a tied aggregate, the award will be determined on average.

SENIOR DIVISION PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Three (3) trophies awarded.

<u>Batting Award:</u> Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

<u>Wicket Keeping Award</u>: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of two keepers or more having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

Note: In all cases above, in the event of a tied aggregate, the award will be determined on average.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS:

Senior Club Champion: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who, through efforts with bat or ball has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

<u>Club Champion</u> (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding cricketer in either the junior or intermediate divisions, who through efforts with bat or ball has proved him/herself competitive at the higher levels (A or B Grade) of the SSJCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club All Rounder (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in either the Junior or Intermediate Divisions. As a guide a minimum of 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as a combination of wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. For the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and run out (the Thrower). While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

JUNIOR & INTERMEDIATE CLUB AWARDS:

<u>Most Improved Team</u>: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager) Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be taken into account.

Bob Price Encouragement Shield: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee. The award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will take into account age, performance, level at which played, years of experience. Commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricketer to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded specifically for fielding effort. The number of catches taken is a factor but for a wicketkeeper allowance is made for the advantages of gloves. Considerations include alertness, speed and accuracy of returns, determination, and encouragement of fellow players, in particular bowlers.

Rookie of the Year: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player who has completed their first ever year of competitive cricket and has displayed potential and enthusiasm for the game.

SENIOR CLUB AWARDS:

Senior Rookie of the Year: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player in the first full year ever of senior cricket who displays a high level of skill, ability, and potential.

EDCC SERVICE AWARDS:

<u>Club Service Awards</u>: Introduced in 1996/97, the Service Award acknowledges continuous club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards are in periods of five years, ie: five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

Club Member of the Year: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Awarded to a club member who gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Club Executive shall determine the recipient.

<u>Life Membership</u>: While any club member may nominate any other club member to be a Life Member such nomination is to be in writing with reasons in support. The Management Committee is not bound to accept nominations or give reasons for rejection. In considering any such nomination it will be guided as follows.

- The basic merits of each nomination.
- The years and nature of service to the club rendered by the nominee.
- Generally, but not exclusively, no less than ten years club service is seen as a minimum.

EDDC BRADMAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP:

This scholarship is to select two players eligible to compete in the under 12 age group, preferably from the highest graded team, and send them to attend the Talented Player Coaching Camp conducted by the Bradman Foundation. The course is conducted at Bowral during school holidays. The Club will cover all player costs associated with the camp.

Preference will be given to selecting A grade players with special consideration directed towards those in their second year in that age group, although the grade is not the sole factor. Primarily the scheme seeks annually to identify two keen cricketers within the club, who will benefit from this experience and are deemed to have potential. At the same time they must be seen to be interested in pursuing cricket at the higher levels.

The Management Committee with input from relevant coaches will make the selection at the end of each season. Selections are subject to informal acceptance by players and parents prior to places being reserved, funds committed and a formal decision being announced. Recipients of this award must be registered members of the EDCC as of the time the camp is to be conducted. The selection process and actions taken in the case of the applicants not meeting the above criteria is at the discretion of the Management Committee and no correspondence will be entered into.

WESLEY ADAMS MEMORIAL TROPHY: (Junior and Intermediate divisions):

(Perpetual trophy & personal trophy). Nominations are sought.

This award seeks to reflect values that Wes held dear. It seeks to recognise a spirit of endeavour and pride in effort taking into account fair play, teamwork and sportsmanship. It is meant for the aspiring player who shows preparedness to put in the hard work and commitment which one may expect will lead to accomplishing the goals for which he or she aims.

What a great year we had! Lots of fun, achievements and an undefeated season. Firstly, I would like to thank Mark Parsons for his tireless efforts managing the team, and being on hand each week to do the scoring. The parents really appreciated it. Also to Shannon for assisting in the coaching of the kids and providing them with your depth of knowledge.

The year started off like many others, full of hope and determination to be the best team we could be. The team was a mixture of 3 players from both U8A teams of last year plus 4 new players. We had assembled a strong team with experience and skill, plus the new players bringing in enthusiasm.

10 games over 20 weeks and never once did I believe this young batch of cricketers couldn't win the game. We were never once in difficulty, and it was well deserved that we ended the season undefeated. Pulling out the stats which many bored train trips to work helped to compile, every team which faced us had their biggest defeat when playing us. We ended up with a quotient of 4.27, which is the highest for the Engadine club and the seconded highest out of all teams in all clubs. We scored a massive 1100 plus runs off the bat, while conceding only 410 runs off the bat when bowling.

We started strongly and we didn't stop till the end. By the end of the season we had developed a little strategy called, "Unleash the fury". This involved bowling our best six bowlers during one set of batters. We picked out their best batters and the results speak for themselves. During the 3 games we unleashed the fury, the opposition scored 4 for 19, 5 for 11 and 6 for 17 off their set of 6 overs.

During the year the overwhelming comment from opposition coaches was that we had the fastest bowlers in Under 8's. Sometimes you have 1, maybe 2 really quick bowlers – we had 5 bowlers who were express pace. In fact, one of the coaches called me after the game to congratulate the players on their level of skill and he noted what a pleasure it was to see an U8's team play with such skill. It gave him something to aim for with his own team. I would like to think it was the coaching, but we all know this is an exceptional bunch of cricketers who will make the red and blue cap of the Dragons proud for many years to come.

But it wasn't just the speed we bowled at – our bowling accuracy as a team improved over the year from 68% to 82% across the team, with the big improvers being Lachlan, Lucas and Nathan. We had plenty of wicket takers, with Jack taking 14, Jarrod M taking 13 and Dylan getting 12. Jarrod T, as a first year cricketer, took an amazing 9 wickets. Everyone during the year took a wicket, which is a great achievement, including Lucas taking a 4 for 4 and Jarrod M taking a 5 for 5.

Our batting stood out as well. We had 4 players score 150 runs or more with 5 players scoring at better than a run a ball over the course of the year. As a team we averaged an amazing 88% strike rate. Even our newcomers had days where they knocked the opposition around, with scores like 15, 13 or 10 being scored often. Our average across the team was 17.1 runs, with Jack, Jarrod M and Dylan leading the way.

The way to stop the runs was to field well, and we had a number of great fielders with bullet throws. Run outs came thick and fast and Joshua B, Jack and Lachlan had some of the best. Lucas and Dylan took many catches, Lucas even caught out one of our players when he was filling in for the other side.

But all the above means nothing if we didn't follow one simple rule – The Spirit of Cricket. The boys were exceptional in their behaviour and never once let their dominance turn to arrogance. They congratulated the other teams when they performed well, showed concern for the opposition players when they were hurt and never once spoke back even though the other teams were trying to bait them. This is the part of the season I will remember the best – their exceptional attitude to cricket and to its ideals

So... who made up this team of champions? In alphabetical order, the under 8A Blue's were:

JOSHUA BERRY: Josh had another great year in under 8's. Josh is an all round cricketer, able to bat, bowl and field with skill. In Round 9 he cleaned up a bowler hitting 14 in a single over. Josh's bowling was quick and straight, being on a hat trick ball in Round 9 as well. Josh's greatest attribute is his enthusiasm in the field, chasing the ball down and whipping the ball in over the bails more often than not. Well done Josh.

<u>LACHLAN COLDWELL:</u> This was Lachlan's first year playing cricket and he did a great job. He was a quick learner picking up in all aspects of cricket. Lachlan took great joy in achieving, whether it was scoring a run, taking a wicket or getting a run out, you could tell he was enjoying it. In fact, it's a shame the season ended when it did, as in the last game he got his top score for the year and you could tell the game of cricket was starting to click for him. Well done Lachlan.

JACK DWARSHUIS: Jack was an outstanding cricketer throughout the year. He scored 33 three times and ended the season with an average of 110 and a bowling average in the 3's. DYLAN SMITH: Dylan has a big bat and Dylan has a big shot to go with it. Dylan was our power hitter and top scored with 37. On days when the grass is long, you could rely on Dylan hitting over the top to reach the boundary. He scored an amazing 207 runs in only 9 innings including a great 6. Dylan also bowled fast and straight, being our quickest, taking 12 wickets. Dylan was always active in the field, being our top catcher and run out merchant. Great season Dylan.

Wade joined his good mate Spencer in the centre needing to consolidate to give us any hope of posting a decent total. Spencer's net session during the week leading up to the match was nothing short of abysmal, getting cleaned bowled numerous times. Mind you big Stu was nipping them around everywhere with an oldish ball so you could hardly blame him getting out, the other boys bowled OK as well.

Can you believe we made 7/237 with the out of form Spence making 129no his highest score? What a match to do it in an extraordinary partnership with Wade worth 80 odd. Nabeel chipped in with 30 odd to give us the total.

Unfortunately Joff followed soon after for 2, caught behind, with once again replays showing he was nowhere near it.

I must say our opening partnerships in the early rounds were excellent, batting for 12 to 15 overs and getting the team off to good starts, but both struggled to put the big runs on the board in the second half of the year.

Getting back to the match, again early wickets cost us and at drinks we were 5 for about 40 odd. Spencer again came out and looked good but unfortunately hit one on the splice and got caught for 26 from memory. Our highlight from the batting department was certainly Tubba and Robbie's 9th wicket partnership of 37 which gave us all some encouragement watching from the sidelines. Robbie was out caught behind for 16 and quite clearly didn't hit it and boy did he erupt letting the umpire know what he thought of the decision in more ways than one.
