- Our players continue to be strong in representing the shire in their respective age divisions.
- Introduction of Split Innings in Junior Cricket (greater involvement and participation)

Congratulations to our 16A, 14E & B5 teams for being crowned premiers for 2011/12 season. Peter Schofield and Ian Latham took responsibility for the development of our talented 16A team and the boys excelled in every way. It is our clubs remarkable history of competing in nine of the last eleven 16A finals and winning six. What an outstanding effort. Our 14E side was coached by a pair of rookie's in James Stone & Paul Bremner. Both had successful junior careers at our club and I am sure the players in this team along with the parents appreciated the time, effort & enthusiasm both James & Paul brought to this team. Our B5 team had a strategy of old & new which blended well over the season under the watchful eye of Allan & Judy Lofthouse who continue to support our senior team's year on year. There were many worthy individual & team performances which have been acknowledged throughout this year book and highlight the efforts of all players & officials.

I am so grateful for the support and efforts of my committee this year. Neil Croker undertook his secretary duties with great affection and even stepped into other roles to fill gaps. They played for the Harry Robbins shield and the match was played in good spirit and friendship. The Illawong club was successful in a very close encounter. The opportunity for players to play on a world class venue, steeped in tradition and have access to the recently renovated Cricket Hall of Fame is something that some cricket players only dream of. My gratitude to the Bradman Trust for allowing us to hire this venue annually is greatly appreciated. I am also sure that our two recipients for the Bradman scholarship and training camp will enjoy the improvements to the facilities in Bowral.

Our fortnightly newsletter was archived this year, replaced by the internet & website. As with any change, players and supporters will take some time to embrace these new beginnings. We are always on the lookout for new people to our committee who can assist us with fresh ideas or new ways of doing things so please come forward and let yourself be known. Alternatively attend our Annual General Meeting on Wednesday 6th June at the EDCC Clubhouse.

Fundraising this year was well supported and an enjoyable. For the first time we held a sausage day a Bunning's Kirrawee and the day was such a success (profitable too) we had to send for more sausages & drinks. A great initiative Jim Lee! Thank you to all teams & parents for sharing the load. Our Trivia night was a light hearted way for club supporters to enjoy a drink, nibbles and some quirky questions delivered by our new MC, who was a hit. SECRETARY’S REPORT

Another season completed with The Dragons having 4 Junior and 3 Senior Teams making the finals with the B5’s, 16A’s and 14E’s winning their respective grades.

Our Junior numbers were steady which was a great result for the club considering there was a drop of 200 players across the association. The challenge for the Committee next season is to increase our player base in the U8 & U10’s to ensure the club remains strong in the future.

Whilst our Senior numbers were slightly down we were able to field 11 teams – The most by any club in the Association.

The success of our Club is due to the dedication and commitment of our Committee, Coaches, Managers, Scorers and Helpers in making sure that each team gets on the field every weekend – A big Thank You to everyone.

The contribution of the following sponsors allows the club to keep our fees to a minimum,

Off the field, we were able to upgrade the nets at Engadine West Public School with the help of the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association providing \$5000 in funding. We also held our first “Bunnings” BBQ which was a great success with every team assisting on the day.

I would like to thank everyone that has helped make this a successful season and if you are interested in joining the Committee please come along to the AGM on the 6th of June.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This year we saw 4 junior teams make the finals, we had 2 winners the 14Es and the 16A's. We also had 3 senior teams compete in the final with the B5's as the only premierships winning team. Congratulations to those winning teams.

During the year the club made an operating profit of \$526.52 compared to last season of \$9,625.76 a decrease of \$9,099.24.

Highlights include;

- Cash balances of \$31,436.35, up \$526.52 on last year but a reduction in and our profit from on last season. The reduction was mostly due to the concreting of the Cricket Nets at Engadine West Public School (Net cost \$4,311.50) and payment of Rent/Clubroom costs related to the prior year.
- Income was up \$8,101.83, contributing factors include receipt of \$5,000 from SSJCA for assistance with the concreting of Engadine West Public School Cricket Nets; sponsorship money received from Engadine RSL; Fund raising from Bunnings BBQ \$2,834; and receipt of 10/11 club photo's \$960.
- Sponsorship/Donations for the year were around \$8,759.70, up \$7,423.7 from last year. The increase is mostly due to \$5000 received from SSJCA for extension of concreting of Engadine West Public School Nets. Also contributing \$1,500 from Engadine RSL and \$300 from AUSGRID. Once again our public relations officer position was vacant during the season. If anyone is interested going forward simply express your interest to an existing committee member or attend the AGM. This is an essential form of fund raising to the club and keeps the fees for the players down. To all those who did contribute during the season a big thanks, this helps in reducing registration fees and makes it more affordable for the average player.
- This season we participated in the running of a Bunnings BBQ, this provided an increase to our revenue of \$2,834 (or net profit of \$1,741.83). Well done to Neil and Jim for this initiative and thank you to all those who helped during the day to make it a success. We look forward to having this as an annual event during the seasons ahead. Please support this going forward.
- Our annual trivia night was once again a success; we raised a net profit of \$1,522.58, while this was down on prior seasons. The reduction was mostly due to an increase in costs associated with the event which was primarily related to payment of some raffle prizes. A big thanks to all those who assisted on the night and those who attended who made the night a success.
- We also participated in the McGrath Foundation (Pink Stumps Day) which was held on the 18th February. We saw our U16's field in the pink caps and play with the Pink Stumps. We utilized the Trivia Night to raise money for the cause. In the end we donated \$359. Thank you to all those who contributed.
- Our Expenses were up significantly by \$17,201.07 compared to last season.
- Umpire fees were up by \$1,218 mostly due to increased junior umpire fees. This year the junior umpire fees includes 10/11 season (\$297) and 11/12 season (\$1,026). Our 11/12 season junior fees are significantly higher due to our U16A team this season and the association contributing 33% in 11/12 rather than 66% in 10/11. In 12/13 all junior umpire fees will be paid 100% by the clubs, there will be no subsidy from the SSJCA. The senior umpire fees remained steady during the season following similar number of senior teams.
- Our Rent and clubroom costs increased by \$3,001.72, this is primarily timing as our 10/11 payment was paid during 11/12
- Other Sundries costs are up \$10,772.06, due to the concreting of Engadine West Public School Nets, total cost \$9,311.50, net cost to the club was \$1,311.50, after allowing for the contribution from the SSJCA and utilising the money from Weet Bix competition from last season.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether its sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players or parents. Everyone plays some part towards the success of the club

BRADMAN CHALLENGE MATCH REPORT

Bowral April 23, 2011

The conclusion of another successful season was marked with our annual U16 Bradman Challenge Match on the picturesque Bradman Oval at Bowral. This season the game saw our 16A Premiers play against Illawong Menai for the Harry Robins Trophy.

The match is a reward for our boys who are in their final years of junior cricket and is played using the modified format where each player bats for 8 overs and bowls 4 overs, thus giving all the players the opportunity to maximise their experience.

The match was very competitive, but played in good spirit with the game coming down to the last over. Engadine batted first scoring 194 runs, with an average of 16.17 losing to Illawong who scored 239 runs with an average 17.07.

The boys also had the opportunity to tour the Bradman Museum in the lunch break.

A great afternoon tea provided by the Illawong was appreciated by all the players and parents.

The Umpires award winners were Dane Fisher (Engadine) and Daniel Grant (Illawong).
The Coaches award winners were Dylan Rae (Engadine) and Nathan Lang (Illawong).

PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA

2011/2012 SEASON

Note:

- The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.
- Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations, all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final last played or any other such date as the Committee may announce or publish.
- In the absence of nominations the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.
- The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge special circumstances or to provide encouragement.
- All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

GENERAL CRITERIA:

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the determination of performance awards, the following criteria shall apply uniformly: Where a bowler is competing with a batsman and/or wicket keeper for a Club honour, the following system shall apply:

- For each 10 runs scored: - 1 point
- For each wicket taken: - 1 point
- For each catch/stumping made: - 1 point

Where two batsmen or two bowlers are vying for an honour/award the Management Committee will take into account the ratio of runs to innings, and/or wickets to overs noting the strike and economy rates and in each instance make judgment based on its assessment of all circumstances.

The above may also be used for determining “All-rounders” but with respect to the junior, intermediate and senior divisions it is to be read in conjunction with the criteria specified.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS:

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions: For all junior and intermediate teams engaged in SSJCA competition cricket there will be four awards presented. One for batting and one for bowling plus two others to be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager). The Coach and Manager may recommend two awards from the following four categories; - Most Improved Player, Most Consistent Player, Team Player and Best Fielder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. No one person may win more than one of the above awards.

In addition, consideration will be given by the Management Committee to recognizing “all rounder” skills where the efforts of an individual player provide justification for an All-rounder award. As a guide, within the Junior Division, minimum 100 runs scored and 10 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 7 catches/stumpings). Intermediate Division, minimum 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals. The Management Committee will look at situations that parallel these performance levels and take such efforts into account.

Senior Division: To each team there shall be available awards for batting, bowling, and, where earned, All-rounder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. To qualify as an All-rounder the recipient must have achieved in the season, no less than 200 runs scored and 20 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 15 catches/stumpings). A player who represents the club in more than one team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE DIVISIONS PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Six (6) trophies awarded.

Batting Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

Wicket Keeping Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of two keepers or more having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

Note: In all cases above, in the event of a tied aggregate, the award will be determined on average.

SENIOR DIVISION PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Three (3) trophies awarded.

Batting Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the

batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

Wicket Keeping Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of two keepers or more having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

Note: In all cases above, in the event of a tied aggregate, the award will be determined on average.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS:

Senior Club Champion: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who, through efforts with bat or ball has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club Champion (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding cricketer in either the junior or intermediate divisions, who through efforts with bat or ball has proved him/herself competitive at the higher levels (A or B Grade) of the SSJCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club All Rounder (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in either the Junior or Intermediate Divisions. As a guide a minimum of 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as a combination of wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. For the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and run out (the Thrower). While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club All Rounder (Senior division): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in either the Junior or Intermediate Divisions. As a guide a minimum of 200 runs scored and 20 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 15 catches/stumpings). In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as a combination of wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 15 dismissals. For the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and run out (the Thrower). While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

JUNIOR & INTERMEDIATE CLUB AWARDS:

Most Improved Team: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager)

Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be taken into account.

Bob Price Encouragement Shield: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee. The award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will take into account age, performance, level at which played, years of experience. Commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricketer to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded specifically for fielding effort. The number of catches taken is a factor but for a wicketkeeper allowance is made for the advantages of gloves. Considerations include alertness, speed and accuracy of returns, determination, and encouragement of fellow players, in particular bowlers.

Rookie of the Year: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player who has completed their first ever year of competitive cricket and has displayed potential and enthusiasm for the game.

SENIOR CLUB AWARDS:

Senior Rookie of the Year: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player in the first full year ever of senior cricket who displays a high level of skill, ability, and potential.

EDCC SERVICE AWARDS:

Club Service Awards: Introduced in 1996/97, the Service Award acknowledges continuous club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards are in periods of five years, ie: five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

Club Member of the Year: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy) Nominations are sought. Awarded to a club member who gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Club Executive shall determine the recipient.

Life Membership: While any club member may nominate any other club member to be a Life Member such nomination is to be in writing with reasons in support. The Management Committee is not bound to accept nominations or give reasons for rejection. In considering any such nomination it will be guided as follows.

- The basic merits of each nomination.
- The years and nature of service to the club rendered by the nominee.
- Generally, but not exclusively, no less than ten years club service is seen as a minimum.

EDDC BRADMAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP:

This scholarship is to select two players eligible to compete in the under 12 age group, preferably from the highest graded team, and send them to attend the Talented Player Coaching Camp conducted by the Bradman Foundation. The course is conducted at Bowral during school holidays. The Club will cover all player costs associated with the camp.

Preference will be given to selecting A grade players with special consideration directed towards those in their second year in that age group, although the grade is not the sole factor. Primarily the scheme seeks annually to identify two keen cricketers within the club, who will benefit from this experience and are deemed to have potential. At the same time they must be seen to be interested in pursuing cricket at the higher levels.

The Management Committee with input from relevant coaches will make the selection at the end of each season. Selections are subject to informal acceptance by players and parents prior to places being reserved, funds committed and a formal decision being announced. Recipients of this award must be registered members of the EDCC as of the time the camp is to be conducted. The selection process and actions taken in the case of the applicants not meeting the above criteria is at the discretion of the Management Committee and no correspondence will be entered into.

WESLEY ADAMS MEMORIAL TROPHY: (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy). Nominations are sought. This award seeks to reflect values that Wes held dear. It seeks to recognise a spirit of endeavour and pride in effort taking into account fair play, teamwork and sportsmanship. It is meant for the aspiring player who shows preparedness to put in the hard work and commitment which one may expect will lead to accomplishing the goals for which he or she aims.
