TREASURERS REPORT

This year we saw 5 junior teams make the finals, we had 3 winners the 16A's, 16C's and 14E's. We also had 2 senior teams compete in the final with both the B6's and C1's finishing up as premiers. Congratulations to those winning teams. Also a special congratulations to the 16A's who won the metropolitan T20 competition and then progressed to the SCG and won the state T20, well done a fantastic year boys, you represented the club throughout the competition with great distinction.

During the year the club made an operating profit of \$526.52 compared to last season of \$9,625.76 a decrease of \$9,099.24.

Highlights include;

- Cash balances of \$33,049.34, up \$1,612.99 on last year up by \$1,086.47 on last season.
- Income was \$56,124.08 down \$5,898.65, due to receipt of \$5,000 from SSJCA for assistance with the concreting of Engadine West Public School Cricket Nets in 2011/12.
- Sponsorship/Donations for the year were \$4,980.00, down \$3,759.70 from last year. The decrease was due to \$5000 received from SSJCA for extension of concreting of Engadine West Public School Nets in 2011/12. Our major sponsors include Engadine RSL, A1 Metaltech, Sutherland Credit Union, FAB Floors, AUSGrid and GNP Marine Trimming. To all those who contributed during the season a big thanks, this helps in reducing registration fees and makes it more affordable for the average player.
- This season we once again participated in the running of a unnings BBQ, this provided an increase to our revenue of \$2,755 (or net profit of \$1,385). Well done to Neil and Jim and thank you to all those who helped during the day to make it a success. We look forward to continuing to have this as an annual event during the seasons ahead. Please support this going forward.
- Our annual trivia night was once again a success; we raised a net profit of \$1,544, which was in line with last season. A big thanks to all those who assisted on the night and those who attended who made the night a success.
- Our Expenses were \$54,511.04 down by \$7,187.82 compared to last season.
- Presentation Trophies and general presentation costs were down \$2,190.04 which was driven by a lower number of premierships in 2011/12 and lower attendance to the Senior Presentation night (this was offset by lower income)
- Umpire fees were up by \$532 mostly due to increased senior umpire fees, generally more games were covered. In 2012/13 all junior umpire fees will be paid 100% by the clubs, there will be no subsidy from the SSJCA. Currently we've paid for the first 6 rounds and we still are required to pay for rounds 7-10.
- Our Rent and clubroom costs decreased by \$1,761.58, this is primarily timing as our 10/11 payment was paid during 11/12. Our costs during 12/13 reflect the annual costs for the year.
- Other Sundries costs are down \$8,968.52, due to the concreting of Engadine West Public School Nets, total cost \$9,311.50 during 11/12. The costs included under Other Sundry relate to Junior Grading Day BBQ, Senior Finals Drinks and Junior Finals BBQ.
- We also saw a fantastic effort for the Green and Gold day where we raised around \$1,080. A special mention to the 12A's who raised around \$600, a terrific effort.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether its sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players or parents. Everyone plays some part towards the success of the club.
