TREASURERS REPORT

This year we saw 3 junior teams make the finals, with our 16A's the only winner. We also had 4 senior teams compete in the final with the C2's finishing up as premiers.

During the year the club made an operating profit of \$2,229.80 compared to last season of \$1,612.99 an increase of \$616.81.

Highlights include;

- Cash balances of \$35,279.14 up \$2,229.80 on last season
- Income was \$55,036 down slightly from \$56,124 due to reduction in the number of senior players. This was partly offset by an increase in the number of our junior players.
- Sponsorship/Donations for the year were \$3,792, down \$1,188 from last year. Our major sponsors include Engadine RSL, A1 Metaltech and Sutherland Credit Union. To all those who contributed during the season a big thanks, this helps in reducing registration fees and makes it more affordable for the average player.
- This season we once again participated in the running of a Bunnings BBQ, we raised a net profit of \$1,194, down slightly on last year. Well done to Neil, and thank you to all those who helped during the day to make it a success. We look forward to continuing to have this as an annual event during the seasons ahead. Please support this going forward.

- Our annual trivia night was once again a success we raised a net profit of \$1,881, which was up from last season by around \$400. A big thanks to all those who assisted on the night and those who attended who made the night a success.
- Our Expenses were \$52,807 down by \$1,704 compared to last season.
- Our fees paid to the association were down \$799.
 This was due to lower number of senior players.
 This was partially offset by an increase to our Junior players
- Presentation Trophies and general presentation costs were up \$1,761 which was driven an increase in the number of premierships in 2012/13.
- Umpire fees were down by \$1,130 from last year mostly due to lower number of senior teams in 13/14
- Our Rent and clubroom costs were relatively steady compared to last year.
- Other Sundries costs were slightly down from last year due to Club Banners purchase last year.
 Other items included within these are the Junior Grading Day BBQ, Senior Finals Drinks and Junior Finals BBO.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether its sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players or parents. Everyone plays some part towards the success of the club.
