But I am absolutely of the opinion that if a boy registers to play cricket, then he should fulfil his obligations to cricket all the way to the end of the

If football trials or training occur at the same time as cricket matches or practice, then cricket should, in my opinion, take priority.

I would feel the same if the positions were reversed - that is, I would not like to see boys, previously committed to football clubs, missing football matches just to take part in cricket trials.

12A First of all, let me deal with the recall of the St. Pats. batsman.

I gave the boy out caught behind off his glove. His glove and leg pad were almost in the same line, although at least 12-18 inches apart. The deflection was there, the catch was taken and I gave him out.

Now, if I had done what I usually do and count to 3 before making my decision, I would have realised the deflection was much too late to have touched his glove. Trigger hoppy umpiring.

As the batsman walked past me towards the sideline, I could see he was in obvious distress at my decision, but he did not say one word to me at that time. I walked over to him and said "I'm sorry son, I think I have made a mistake, please return to the crease." And that's it. I believed I made a mistake and as the reles permit, I changed my decision.

You won't see that sort of thing on T.V. Tost Cricket. That's alright. We're not playing Test Cricket. I'm trying to teach you boys more than just the fundamentals of batting and bowling. There is much more to cricket than that.

I'm trying to persuado you all to play cricket in a positive and confident manner and with an attitude of fair play, honesty and good sportsmanship.

I'll give you on example:-
