The 16A competition this year saw a big change from recent times with a new playing surface and the failure of Engadine to finish in the first three places. These two events were not unrelated, as our team failed to adjust to a synthetic surface more suited to batting and rather cruel on spin bowlers.

Our big problem this year was lack of depth in the batting department, and the failure of our more senior players to contribute much to our totals. Nevertheless, some good results were achieved and some excellent and entertaining cricket was produced. I don't think any of our supporters will forget the game against St. Pats when, whilst their coach tried to stop the game, or at least slow it down, our last two batsmen snatched victory in the final over. Nor will they forget the game against the second placed Caringbah Sports when, after crashing through their batting to have them eight for ninety-odd, we let the game slip through our fingers to lose by just a few runs.

A pleasing aspect of the season was the tremendous support from the parents of the team, particularly from our scorer, Ken Tevor, handyman Ray Entwistle and our regular supporters, Val Tevor, Keith Hughes, Joy Nelson, the Cranes and the Westlakes. Generally, when all the parents were there the standard of our play increased fifty per cent, so to all of our supporters, a big thank you.
