In a quite even competition, we did reasonably well to finish in equal fifth position. However, if our batting had performed anywhere near up to expectation, we should have finished in third position at least, but unfortunately, our batsmen struggled all season managing a top score of only 136. Only 3 batsmen scored more than 100 runs.

If our batting was disappointing, our bowling and fielding were quite good. We dismissed the two finalists for only 106 and 133, which shows the potential the team had.

DAVID CRANE was our best all round performer, taking 21 wickets and scoring 147 runs. David is the type of cricketer I admire the most, determined to make the most use of his abilities whilst enjoying the game to the fullest.
