This season was certainly played in two different halves. In the first half only 2 matches were lost and things were looking good. However, in the second half we lost every match. That just goes to show how tough it is in "A" grade cricket. However, we were proud of each member of the side, as they gave 100% effort at all times.

The team members are:

PAUL BELL: Paul had a lean year with the bat only scoring 49 runs, however has the ability to score a lot more runs. He is still nervous before each innings and will have to overcome this. His fielding was top class again this season and he finished with 4 catches.

MITCHELL HEALEY: Mitch played some gutsy knocks this season, as being the smallest boy in the team, often found the ball rising head high. Like Paul, he is nervous before each innings, but he is a very determined batsman. Finished with 162 runs at 16.2 and in the field he was an asset. taking 8 catches.

GREG KING: This was Greg's first season with the club and it was a pleasure to have him. He only scored 59 runs, but that did not reflect his ability with the bat. He saved many runs in the field throwing himself at everything and took 2 catches.

GLEN LANGSTON: Glen was the spinner of the side and even though he only collected 7 wickets at 22.43, has the ability to become a better bowler when he can

master the leg and off spin to add that extra variation to his bowling. This season, he mainly bowled his top spin and batsmen got used to the one type of ball being bowled. He still needs to get behind the ball when he bats. Took 2 catches for the season.

DARREN LEES: Darren once again proved to be one of the backbones of the team with his all round ability. He ended up with 196 runs at 16.33, but should have scored plenty more but for a very lean second half of the season. He tended not to play himself in, however, he will be well aware of this. He finished with 3 wickets and took 8 catches. He also finished with the highest score of 61.

ANTHONY LOVETT: Anthony was the captain of the side and did a fine job. Once again this season, wicket kept very well, as he only conceded 11 byes. Took 5 catches and 1 stumping. With the bat, he has the ability to destroy any bowling attack with aggressive batting. He finished up with 194 runs and 19.4, his top score for the year being 57 n.o.

GEOFF MACDONALD: Geoff was our opening batsman for most part of the season. Had a good first half with the bat, however, he fell away after Christmas finishing with 117 runs at 10.67. He is quite capable of a lot more runs and feel sure he will do so next season. Fielded very soundly taking 6 catches and his top score with the bat was 32.

RICHARD MORGAN: This was Richard's first season with the club and he proved useful with bat and ball. He bowled very tightly with his medium pace, taking 12 wickets at 13.25. However, I feel he should be able to obtain more pace with his bowling. He scored 77 runs with the bat, but also more runs should have been scored.

MARK NOAKES: Mark is a medium pace bowler and hard

hitting batsman, however, did not have the season he was hoping for. Finished with 61 runs and took 7 wickets.
