## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year we celebrated thirty years as a community cricket club. Thirty years in which many people have given their time, energy and skills to provide the youth of the community with an opportunity to play competition cricket. This year was not one of our better years, if the criteria for success is winning premierships. However, winning premierships is not the criterion. This club exists to encourage young people to play cricket at varying levels of skill and gain enjoyment from so doing. If through the course of the year these objectives were attained, then the year was a success, with or without a premiership.

No club can please everyone and there will always be players and parents who with their own interest at heart will see the situation differently to those responsible for conducting the affairs of the club. To those people I say, "Come to meetings, make known your point of view and better still, stand for office!"

In similar vein, there is little room in the club for the selfish player, the one who plays only for himself, pleases himself as to whether he'll train or not, and whether he'll play or won't play. A match is played usually over two Saturdays. One-day players who leave the team short the second day are not wanted. Cricket is a team sport and it relies on everyone working on it at all times. Like all worthwhile efforts whether it be at school, work or sport, involvement means commitment and this club is no. different. Without commitment, there is never success! With this club commitment starts with Registration and lasts through the entire season.

It is unfair to Coaches, Managers and Captains to share the season with players with little commitment and parents who place individual preferences ahead and to the detriment of the team effort. It is a credit to the Coaches, Managers and Captains that they cope and I

compliment them on doing so well. Without their dedication we would be stymied. Nevertheless Coaches, Managers and Captains must too be committed. Next season, we will have documented the role of Coaches and Managers, so that everyone will be aware of what the club expects.

This year, the Annual Report includes for the first time explanation of the criteria used to judge the major awards. This is one of a number of initiatives taken by the Committee this year. Others included -

- \* the conduct of a two-tier double wicket competition for junior players, hopefully to be an annual event
- \* financial planning and fee setting based on an annual budget;
- \* the introduction of a new "Batting Dragon" cover for the club's newsletter.
- \* the introduction of new club badges:
- \* preliminary work on the feasibility of formally incorporating the club.

I compliment the Committee on its good work throughout the year. I also note and endorse the appreciations expressed in the other management reports of the efforts made by many.

I was pleased to see Alf Lemmon rewarded with Life Membership for his untiring efforts in support of the club. Alf more than anyone, was responsible for initiatives which have resulted in Thursday night raffles at Engadine Hotel, which have raised §3,000. Engadine Hotel, as well as the Engadine R.S.L. and Citizens Club support the club with much appreciated sponsorship.

The club needs sponsors, now and in the future. And what of the future, after 30 years where are we going?

If the club is to survive, we must look ahead and plan a future.

There are clearly identifiable needs. We need better training facilities - the nets and surrounds at Anzac must be refurbished, we need more specialised coaching to fine tune the skills of the more cutstanding players and those with potential, and last but not least, we need to plan for growth.

Engadine continues to grow. The Woronora Heights area alono is a development where with growing families, there will be a need to provide cricket facilities. We need to take the initiative and respond if we wish to remain the premier club in Engadine. The alternative of just letting things happen is hardly a viable alternative and such a policy will undoubtedly be damaging to a club with 30 proud years behind it.

We must look ahead, plan and achieve! Accordingly, the Committee must remain energetic and enthusiastic. The present committee retires on the 10th June. The Annual General Meeting conducted that evening is an opportunity to all to have a say in how the club is to be run by attending and voting in the new Committee.

The A.G.M. will be held at the Anzac Oval complex, commencing at 7.30 p.m.

To round off this year and see in the new, I hope to see a good attendance. Let us continue to ensure that for the next thirty years Engadine Oragons Cricket Club is a name known and respected throughout the community for sportsmanship, youth support and fair play.
