PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to inform all club members of the success of the 14A and 14C teams and I extend congratulations to the Coaches, Managers, supporters and in particular, the players of both teams. Your success is well deserved and a fitting reward for your efforts.

These two successes crown a successful year in which we fielded 15 teams and provided competitive cricket for some 200 players. The club improved three positions in the Junior Association competition, to finish second, our best year since 1979/80. The five senior teams (A1; A3, B4, B7 and C1) were competitive, with the A3 team making the final, only to see the minor premiers force a draw and thus gain the honours. I consider the A3 team to have been a touch unlucky not to win.

Due to the continuation of the meat tray raffles at Engadine Hotel and the efforts of the Ladies Auxiliary, club finances are in a reasonably healthy state. However, due to the poor support for the Ladies Auxiliary raffle and the Dinner/Dance, both of which yielded less than reasonable returns for the effort expended, a levy may now have to be imposed next year to offset the lack of revenue and ensure we have sufficient capital to maintain our financial position.

I thank the committee for its efforts during the year, but note with concern vacancies in the committee and the absence of volunteers to aid in the running of the club and the sharing of the work load. There is a real risk of the club becoming inoperative and no longer a viable influence as a community sporting body if some of the younger parents and senior players do not participate in the administration of the club. All positions will be vacant at the Annual General meeting and nominations are welcome.

I am particularly pleased to report to all members that the standard of coaching this year was of a high order and reflects the commitment, enthusiasm and patience of

all Coaches, both old and new. Our second place in the Club Championship attests to their efforts and they are all to be congratulated. In similar vein, Managers and Scorers (those so important people) did well and contributed to our success.

A special thanks goes to Vi Noakes, one of our most reliable behind the scenes workers. Every Saturday, Vi co-ordinates results and rings them through to the Association. Without her efforts, every team would lose points and the club incur fines. Other behind the scene workers - Val and Ken Tever, produce the fortnightly newsletter and are deserving of special thanks, while the efforts of the Ladies Auxiliary cannot be overlooked. In the category of key, but little seen workers, is Bob Vannan. Bob has been the club's major delegate to the Senior Association. The club owes all these people a vote of thanks for they do what needs to be done in the interests of the club with regularity, good-will, and a sense of duty.

In concluding this report, I express the hope that all players who took part enjoyed their season. While I congratulate the recipients of honours and awards tonight, I also congratulate equally those who were not recipients. Cricket is a fine game, a team game where the individual can shine, but no player ever wins a match on his own. To have played, tried, given your best and failed is no failure at all - it's practice for the next time around, and I hope that the next time around for all players is next season.
