PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This season saw a downturn in the numbers playing cricket, while not restricted to our club, nevertheless, impacted on this club to the extent that we fielded six teams less than the previous year.

By comparison with 1987/88 it was a disappointing year. Not one of the three senior teams made the finals, although all proved competitive and capable of beating those teams which did ultimately contest the finals. In the junior competition, the club slipped from second to fifth and unlike last year, no junior team achieved a premiership.

Perhaps it's a sign of the times, but the year was marked by lack of support and apparent disinterest. Evidence of this can be found in the absence this year of a junior double wicket competition, with no one responding to the Management Committee's overtures to stage such a day. Likewise, regrettably, the Executive has determined that the club's major award - The Sportsman of the Year trophy - will not be awarded this year. The Executive could not find a player who had given freely of his time and efforts to support the club over and beyond playing cricket. As the Award has to be earned, not given, there is no award.

The abysmal attendance at meetings, beyond the faithful few, and the obvious failure of Coaches and Managers to read the club Newsletter, all attest to a lack of enthusiasm and support.

To those who gave of their time, I express the Executive's thanks. To those who played and gave of their best, I hope the season provided its own rewards. To the band of consistent supporters, and it is only a small band, which in itself is a sad commentary, I hope that you retain your enthusiasm and come back next year. Cricket, as well as the club, needs you.

As I conclude this report, I admit it is not the most cheerful nor the most positive report. Indeed, in three years of Presidency, it is the most gloomy. However, the facts speak for themselves and I reflect the comments and views of many who love cricket and have expressed concerns to me.

The answer is of course in the hands of all club members and cricket lovers. This club and all similar clubs need more than the silent majority. We need people who, putting personal interests aside, will work for the good of the club and the promotion of cricket. I hope that they still exist within our Community to-day, that they have not all faded away, and they will front up in their numbers to the AGM in support of the club.

With 32 years of demonstrated commitment to cricket, the Engadine Dragons is a well known and respected club within the Sutherland Shire Community. I am confident, despite the current trend that the club will prosper and with support of all members next year and those after, that this season will be no more than a slight setback.
