TEAM REPORTS - BOYS

10A TEAM REPORT

Season 1990/91 was a very successful one for the Under 10A's, perhaps not in terms of matches won or lost, but most definitely successful where enjoyment and improvement are concerned. Our season started with 8 of our 13 players not having played competitive cricket before, and to be graded in A grade, appeared at the time to be rather a harsh move. Not so. The boys performed magnificently, being a competitive unit in each match, with every aspect of their game improving weekly.

Likewise, the parental support was equally good, encouraging the boys week by week and acknowledging their efforts both on the field and at practice. The following is a short comment on each boys efforts throughout the season.

RICK GEORGE: Our most successful batsman. Rick showed a remarkably mature attitude towards his batting, always waiting for the loose ball to score runs from and defending the good ball with a straight bat. A useful slow right arm bowler and a reliable fieldsman.

CHRIS KINGMAN: Showed glimpses of his batting potential mid-season, with a couple of hard hitting knocks, but was unable to maintain this form after the Christmas break. A handy right arm medium pace bowler, who on more than one occasion broke through the top order batsmen.

TIM MORELAND: One of our two specialist wicket keepers. Performed splendidly behind the stumps allowing very few byes and missing few, if any, chances. A steady left handed batsman with an elegant stance at the wicket and defensive strokes to match. Available for the 10's again next season, his batting will blossom as he gains height and strength.

MICHAEL GORE: A good left handed batsman with a nice technique, another whose strokeplay will flourish

with another year's growth. Bowls right arm spin very capably, with good flight and variation and a very safe catcher and good fieldsman.

AARON JONES: After a slow start to the season, he blossomed with bat and ball from mid-season onwards. For a slight lad, he strikes the ball very hard, particularly on the leg side and his left arm inswingers troubled most opposition batsmen.

TROY GLENNAN: Our other specialist "Stumper". He also conceded very few byes and accepted all chances to come his way. Selected to represent the Association in the Foster Shield side, who were beaten finalists. A right handed batsman who only began to show his worth towards the season's end. A good medium pacer who bowled some accurate spells.

RYAN DODSON: A very hard hitting left handed batsman, who, as the season progressed, curbed his tendency to smash every ball he faced and started to be more selective with his attacking strokes. A steady left arm medium pacer and a very safe catcher.

KEVIN STEWART: An aggressive right handed batsman who, on too many occasions, lost his wicket due to his tendency to loft the ball both in attack and defence. A good left arm medium pacer whose flat accurate deliveries troubled many opposing batsmen. A safe catcher and ground fielder.
