ENGADINE DRAGONS FIRST ANNUAL MEETING

It is with great pleasure, and a certain amount of pride, that I present the First ever report of Engadine Dragons, and I am quite sure it is only a fore runner of many more Annual Reports in years to come as this club grows with the District. We have surmounted our greatest hurdle, namely our initial year in which we started from scratch without any funds or gear. I am very happy to report that we have finished our first year with all our sporting equipment paid for, and a credit balance in our bank account. A full account of our income and expenditure will be presented in the Treasurers report. We now own \$150.00 worth of football gear and \$80.00 worth of cricket gear. Properly maintained this gear has many more years use, and we can go into our second year as a well established club. It is all the more remarkable when one looks back just on 10 months to our inaugural meeting, and remember that we had to borrow \$20 from Mr Bill Coates to pay a deposit on our football gear. The above results have been achieved with a ridiculously small, but very active committee, and the good support of the people of Engadine, and also the work of the boys themselves who ~~helped~~ represent this club on the playing fields. Touching on the Committee, first, an average attendance at monthly meetings would not exceed six persons. I sincerely hope that we can

This was a great performance for first year in and we can look forward to highly successful season this coming season.
