## Foreword

What do we know about the game of cricket and its early formation? During the last two hundred years the conduct of the game of cricket has been governed by a series of codes of laws. These codes were established approx. 1700—the Marylebone Cricket Club was formed in 1757 and was recognised as the sole authority for drawing up the code and all subsequent alterations. The earliest known code is that drawn up in 1744 by certain noblemen and gentlemen who used the artillery ground in London. These laws were revised in 1755 by several cricket clubs, particularly that of the star and Garter in Pall Mall. In our own country, Saturday, January 28, 1856, the two feuding States, New South Wales and Victoria, staged the first interstate match, now Sheffield Shield. Players at that time had mutton chop whiskers and wore top hats in all inter-colonial games. These matches were played in Hyde Park, Sydney Domain and Albert Park. Many years passed before the Sutherland Shire Boys' Competition was formed. This was in August, 1957. The first elected President was Leo Ticehurst; Hon. Secretary Nick Tredenick and Recorder Jack Moodie. That year we had 9 teams; season completed 1962-63 we had 90 teams. Since its formation and to the present day, cricket is a good game and played by good people. You and I can always keep it that way, thus paying full tribute to the people who established the game.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Again it affords me great pleasure to submit to you a concise report during the season 1962-63, our Seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet. The achievements of the various clubs have been very good and I feel proud indeed to record them for you.

**REGISTRATIONS**

The 1963-64 season saw the introduction of a book register in which the name of the player was entered alphabetically. This register, coupled with the transfer form (also introduced in 1962-63), was an attempt to prevent the occasional problem created when a player registers with two different clubs or transfers from one club to another, and neither club notifying the Association of the transfer. The executive feel that these problems have been solved and it is anticipated that a modified form of transfer will be introduced for the coming season.

With our card system we have a season by season history of the performances of each boy playing under our Association, which is available to the selectors of the representative teams.

There are thirteen hundred and three players registered to play during the season just completed. These players were distributed throughout 13 clubs and 59 teams.

It is anticipated that with the growing population of the area, more teams may be entered for the coming season, although lack of suitable playing areas may force the Association to restrict nominations.

It is a pleasure to acknowledge the co-operation of the various clubs during the past season and in particular the new club, Jannall.

**AFFILIATIONS**

Ninety teams affiliated with the Association in 1962-63, a record for any association. St. George and Sutherland together had 180 cricket teams playing each Saturday morning. With the possibility of an Under 8 next year this could be well passed the 100 mark for Sutherland.

**GROUNDS**

The Sutherland Shire Council had growing seasons. We had growing pains. With the loss of 14 grounds in one hit we didn't know which way to turn. The Shire President and his councillors did try to assist us. We sincerely hope if the council want to work on the grounds next year they don't only pick on cricket, and start the work at least two (2) months earlier than last year.

As can be seen by the above table, the 1962/63 season experienced a jump of 28 per cent. in the number of lads playing. If this rise should continue, then next season will really put the pressure on the Executive and it is to be hoped that the Sutherland Shire Council will foresee these complications and do all in its power to have more playing fields available. It is also to be hoped that many more parents will find time to help the various clubs, so that their children will be able to enjoy their game. Parents are assured they will find happiness, pride and friendship if they will only come along to the game.

A growth like this next season will mean more action and more work more active workers for the Executive Committee, Management Committee, Umpires and the various Club Committees, more finance, more trophies and many more grounds.

There were only four teams undefeated during the season and these were the ultimate winners of their divisions, Miranda Magpies 16A, Boys Town 16B, Miranda Magpies 12A and Caringbah Sports 10 Div. 1, whilst Cronulla R.S.L. (2) under 10 Div. 2 were beaten in their first game and won all the others outright to eventually amass the highest number of points for any team in the whole competition. In the 14A Competition there were six teams that could have been the winners right up to the last day and Caringbah Sports eventually came from behind to win.

Individual efforts worthy of note during the season were those of P. Keehahan, of Miranda Magpies U/16A, with three centuries; B. Longbottom, Miranda Magpies 14A, highest individual score of 155 n.o., from the bowlers R. Larden, of Kirrawee 12C, caused a stir by being the first ever to take all 10 wickets in an innings with his effort of 10 for 26, P. Hyland, of St. Patricks 10 (1), did much better with his 10 for 7, which included a hat trick, L. Pendergast, Cronulla RSL (1) 14C, and L. Taylor, Miranda Magpies 14A, obtained 4 wickets with 4 balls. Taylor also obtained the hat trick and finished with 8 for 17 in that fine bowling spell, R. Houston, Cronulla RSL (2) 14C, in one over took three wickets, a ball and then a wicket, B. Vandenburg, of St. Patricks, must have been awfully disappointed, starting his over with four batsmen to get out he collared two in his first two balls, missed on the next and got the last two batsmen with the next two balls, just missing the hat trick, P. Riolo, of St. Patricks 14A, bowled seven consecutive maiden overs, G. McCaushan, of Cronulla RSL 12A, put up a good effort in getting a hat trick in each innings against Boys Town.

The results of the Umpire schools is showing in the new manner of dismissals appearing in the score books, Boys Town 14B successfully appealed twice for handled the ball and in 10(2) a decision was given for hit the ball twice and whilst in this division it is amazing the number of lads who were given out hit wicket; perhaps they need a little help and advice from the managers, R. Sleeman, of Cronulla RSL (1) 14C, was given out obstructing the field before he had even scored in one of his innings, J. Starling, of Caringbah 16A, scored 7 runs off one ball and it must have caused the ump, a little worry.

The score books this season showed a great improvement, making it so much harder for the best to be elected. In Under 12B seven books were up to excellent standard, Caringbah Sports (1) and (2), Gymea Bay, Miranda Magpies, Cronulla RSL and Kirrawee having small inaccuracies, leaving Caringbah DLS the eventual winner; under 10(1) was the same, Kirrawee, Cronulla RSL (1) and (2), Miranda Magpies, were very good and it was too difficult to select the winner between Caringbah Sports and Caringbah D.L.S.; of course there were some bad books and it is to be hoped that permanent scorers will volunteer to help the clubs and the lads. Three books were not handed in, St. Patricks 14A and 12B and Sylvania 12A, perhaps causing some lad to miss out on getting his name in this report.

**STOKES MCGOWN TROPHIES.** These trophies are donated by this firm for the club scoring the highest number of runs during the season, to batsmen scoring a century, to bowlers who get a hat trick, 10 wickets or more in a match or 7 wickets or more in an innings, to the wicketkeeper getting the most dismissals, providing S.M.G. material was used. The following table shows the number of awards each team could have claimed if they had used S.M.G. balls, etc.

**J. WOODHOUSE TROPHY.** This trophy was donated by the St. Patricks Cricket Club to the perpetual memory of John Woodhouse, who was Treasurer of the Boys Competition at the time of his death. It was awarded for the boy considered by the Executive as the Cricketer of the Year. It is, therefore, fitting that Michael King, a member of the St. Patricks 16A Cricket Club, was chosen as this season's Cricketer of the year. Michael was selected to play in the C. S. Watson Shield rep team this season, and also played in the City and Suburban team selected from Sutherland Boys Competition, and Mr. Killsey, manager of both teams, spoke highly of this lad for his behaviour both off and on the field. He took both bowling honours in the 16A's, most wickets, 57 with an average of 6.14, was fourth in the batting list with an average of 37.50, and took 9 catches during the season, a season certainly full of cricket for him, as he played all day Saturday every Saturday and the representative games during the Christmas holidays and Australia Day.

**MRS. CHATLAND TROPHY.** Best Batting Average was won by R. Sleeman, of Cronulla RSL (1) 14C Team, highest score was 128 n.o., 10 inns. 6 n.o.s. aggregate, 317 average 79.25 (as in accordance with Association Rules).

**ALLAN FALLIN SPECIAL TROPHY.** This trophy was won by P. Keenahan, of Miranda Magpies 16A, with his fine performance in knocking up three centuries during the season and all of them unconquered.

**BEST WICKETKEEPER** Sutherland Shire, K. Jones, Sylvania 14B, with 13 catches, 13 stumpings, allowing 73 byes, 2.88 average.

However, in losing the Shield the team was pleased that it was taken over by our neighbours—St. George—with whom we have had so many interesting tussles during the past few years.

All members of the team behaved in an exemplary fashion both on and off the field, and in the opinion of the writer, is the best team yet entered by the Shire. For this reason, it is recommended that the Boys' Competition continue to support the training of boys of this age group on turf wickets. With the exception of Auburn all of our opponents had considerable "turf" experience.

This report could not in justice be closed off without a few words about my Assistant Manager, Mr. Les Gazzard. Mr. Gazzard's support was highly appreciated. He was our scorer and managed the team when I was injured. Although his son was a member of the squad at no time did he criticize his selection or the way in which he was used by his captain.

To the Captain, Peter Keenahan, also goes my thanks for a job well done.

His top all-round performance (see above) as well as his phenomenal fielding made him deserving of the Captaincy. He was ably supported by M. King (77 runs and 13 wickets).

#### HAROLD MOORE SHIELD 1962/63 (B. McManus)

Five games were played in this competition by Sutherland, four being lost on the first innings and one being won on the first innings. This does not look very impressive on paper, however the defeats in several games were not by very great margins. We were often in a winning position, but could not push home the advantage.

The batting and bowling standard was well up to expectations for district cricket, but it was in the fielding department that we lagged well behind the opposition, and it was this shortcoming that cost us matches.

Usually a team can expect one lad whose fielding is not quite on a par with others, and you can place him accordingly, but this year we were burdened with at least five weak fieldsmen every match, with the subsequent results. This was very surprising to me, as all lads good with bat and ball, especially at this age, should be good in the field.

Defeats suffered were at the hands of South Sydney, Canterbury, Bankstown and St. George No. 1, our sole victory being in the last match against St. George No. 2.

We were pitted against some very good teams in this draw, and the experience gained must surely improve the standard of the boys participating. In fact, the improvement in the performances of several of the boys over the five games was remarkable.

The batting award went to Glen Bailey, of Caringbah Sports, who performed consistently over the series. Bruce Drury, of Jannall, took the bowling honours, with Peter Low, of Gymea Bay, winning the fielding trophy.

A special mention for Ross Hopkins of Caringbah Sports. This lad, unfortunately for himself and for the team, missed two games through illness. He was our most penetrative bowler, and quite the equal of any bowler we met from opposing teams. Ross has improved greatly from last year's District series, and could develop into a good opening bowler.

Thanks must go to co-manager Bill Bailey who was keen to the last ball; scorer Eric Hilzinger, umpire Nev Mason, and also George Merritt, who umpired for us against St. George No. 1 when Nev was unavailable. Many thanks also to Mrs. Hilzinger who always had a supply of cold drinks on hand for the boys.

In conclusion I must thank the boys for the pleasure I derived from being associated with them. They took their defeats in good spirit, and were a credit to this district in both their dress in cricket attire and their approach to the game.

#### ARCH CAWSEY SHIELD (Colin Johnson)

Accompanying statistics and analysis of the matches played by Sutherland in this Competition tell their own story. Despite this, I congratulate the boys in lifting themselves within a few short weeks from a group of unco-ordinated individuals to a smoothly efficient team capable of extending any other in their age group.

Of the fourteen (14) boys selected only three (3) had previously attained representative status.

All members of the team displayed an excellent spirit of co-operation and sportsmanship and were a credit to the Shire and the game of cricket generally. My thanks to them and to our Assistant Manager, Mr. Harry Newman — also to the parents of the boys whose help made my job so much easier.

None of the team, I feel sure, would begrudge a word of congratulations to Peter Hefferman. He finished the series with the highest Individual Score, both batting aggregate and average, most wickets, and the bowling average. A grand effort.

All this is now history. What of the future?

Personally I believe that boys in the U/12 years of age group are living through the most important part of their cricketering lives for it is in this period that the groundwork of batting and bowling techniques is laid. If sound principles are taught then the boy has a far greater opportunity to develop into a useful cricketer than if allowed to drift into all manner of batting and bowling styles, which may have to be altered later at a considerable cost to the boy's confidence and development.



Two important things emerged from this Cawsley Shield Competition:—

- (a) Our batting generally was of a lower standard than that displayed by our various opponents.
  - (b) From discussions with their Managers it appears these Districts provide early, competent coaching for their boys and also select their representative teams early enough to allow development of co-ordination and understanding before the series commences.
- The solution to (a) lies in (b) and I have these suggestions to make:—
- (i) Appoint Selectors and commence Representative Trials at least one month earlier than 1962/63;
  - (ii) Include an U/11 years Competition in future seasons, either in addition to the U/10 and U/12 Competitions, or if impracticable then substitute for the U/10 years Competition.
  - (iii) encourage Clubs within the District to concentrate on the coaching of boys under 12 years of age—the Association to help by securing the services of competent Coaches to help Club Coaches.
