## To all Members of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association Boys' Competition

Ladies and Gentlemen,

On behalf of your committee, the 9th Annual Report and Balance Sheet is submitted for your approval and adoption.

### THE SEASON ("In Retrospect")

Season 1964/65 will go down on record as one of achievement, a record number of clubs, teams and players, a record in finance and the largest representative season yet conducted. Although rain interfered with two rounds early in the season, the summer will go down as being the "long dry summer", one of the driest of all time and one which will be remembered by all who participated, as one of hot, dry days on flint-hard grounds with plenty of dust.

114 teams were entered from 16 clubs and with 115 from our neighbours St. George/Penshurst, some 229 teams competed in the St. George/Sutherland District, surely the largest boys' cricket competitions in the world.

It was pleasing to welcome new clubs, in Taren Point, Caringbah Leagues Club, and Como, who each entered one team for the first time, with a promise of more to come. It is also of interest to note that the St. Patrick's club entered 16 teams with almost 250 registered players, a notable achievement. Caringbah De La Salle also had 16 teams.

To note the growth of the Association 1962/63 had 89 teams and 1,374 players, 1963/64 had 97 teams and 1,362 players, whilst 1964/65 had 114 teams and 1,594 players.

Congratulations are extended to all winners and for the losers, some of them very narrowly, "better luck next time".

### OUR PATRONS

Tom Dalton (M.L.A.) and Allan Fallins (President N.S.W. Umpires' Assn.) again fulfilled the role of your patrons.

Tom Dalton was successful in again retaining the seat of Sutherland in the recent State elections. Allan Fallins had life membership bestowed upon him by the N.S.W. Umpires' Assn., indeed a great honour.

Our thanks are extended to both for their continued support and our congratulations on their successes.

### ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES

One of the major changes introduced for the first time was the team nomination form, on which every club was requested to define their exact team, for grading purposes, and every player was thoroughly checked as to team composition and date of birth of each player. Most clubs co-operated splendidly but several clubs can be thankful that the committee was considerate and used flexibility in assessing unregistered players. However, all clubs are warned that the caution stage is over.

Another major change was the alteration of playing times and three hours' play was brought back in some grades, namely: 16a, 16b, 14a, 14b, 12a; 2½ hours for 10a; and 2 hours for 14c, 12b, 12c, 12d, 10b, and 10c.

This met with general approval as it is generally realized that the

older groups, particularly A grades, need more playing time than some of the lower grades.

Perhaps the 14c grade was unfortunate, but ground limitations make it a hard task to please all. Perhaps some of the teams may be willing to play until 1.30 p.m. next season?

### WET WEATHER

The delegates' council adopted the committee's suggestion that playing cricket is the prime concern and if play was at all possible on any wicket, it should go on. Perhaps this did not suit the "trophy seekers", but, after all, why deprive hundreds of players of their game if a certain few wickets were unfit?

Fortunately, rain only interrupted two rounds but certain confusions existed solely because clubs did not obey instructions in having only one official ring the controller. Consequently our controller, Col Harwood, could not cope with the calls, nor could several of the special committee get through to him. Our thanks are extended to Col Harwood for again accepting and fulfilling the difficult post of controller and to the committee, Neil Drury, Colin Johnson, Barry McManus, Maurie Hart and Pat Thorpe.

### GROUNDS

Unfortunately, Council did not live up to their promise on new grounds and repairs to existing ones, and so, yet another season has passed with our cricketers playing on the worst possible collective cricket areas in the metropolitan area. Two new wickets were brought into play, namely Oyster Bay and Gray's Point, but the "pill" lost much of its "sugar coating" when Jannall, Gymea and Woolooware were withdrawn for the full season despite Council assurance that the delay would be only temporary, and Heathcote (part time). All this happened before the start of the season, so the dry summer cannot be blamed. Perhaps Deputy Chairman of Council, Dick Harrison's unfortunate illness had an effect on certain assurances but after repeated attempts by letter to Council had no avail, Shire President, Keith Bates, arranged a special interview with the Parks and Playground Committee. Your association was represented by your President, Secretary, and Mr. Rex King, but the meeting was not a success, only 30 minutes being given to the deputation, and little headway was gained. We were assured of at least six new areas for next season. It is to be hoped that in 1965/66, cricket will receive the same ground consideration as did the winter codes for they have yet not had a ground withdrawn for resting purposes.

We were sorry to lose the co-operation of George Nelson from Council. George took an appointment at Koorah Council but our thanks are extended to Eugene Morris who replaced George, for his willing co-operation. Our thanks are extended to Council for allowing the use of the practice wickets on both Tonkin and Sutherland ovals, also for the use of both ovals for representative matches.

The Association was unsuccessful in the tender for Tonkin Oval for the season. This went to the N.S.W. Cricket Association but the Association, through Mr. Allan Barnes (Secty.) allowed us use of vacant dates free of charge and this was appreciated. The 16a grade fixture, Gymea v Caringbah Sports was played on the turf and also both the Cronulla R.S.L. and Taren Point clubs staged a practice match, many boys being thrilled to play on turf for the first time.

### MATTING

Great progress was made in respect to matting improvements, and due to the registration fees of 2/- per player, some £130 was donated to the S.S.C.A. to augment their matting expenses.

Matting is expensive, and much still has to be accomplished, but your committee will leave no stone unturned to ensure that every boy in the near future has the benefit upon matting which is in good condition.

### S.S.C.A.

Once again the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, through its secretary and lifelong friend Rex King, showed us the utmost in consideration in matting, tendering of grounds and general understanding. Rex was a regular attender at our meetings and your committee announces with pleasure that it is nominating Rex for Life Membership at the Annual Meeting for his services to cricket.

#### SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CLUB

An open invitation was extended to all boys to try out with the District Club and every opportunity was given to those lads who availed themselves of this splendid gesture. Unfortunately, all too few neglected the golden chance to play on turf. Five lads, all from the Jannali Club, tried out and were graded and played the whole season. Glen Bailey and Paul Lennon rose to the A grade side, Bruce Druery in B grade, and Allen Merritt and Keith Edson, after starting in the City and Suburban, completed the season as members of the premiership C grade team.

Glen Bailey and Bruce Druery each won trophies.

At their successful annual dinner, the senior club officials spoke very highly of these lads. Other boys who played prominent roles with the Shire Club included Robert Wade, Lindsay Erickson, Geoff Major, John Gillam, Ross Hopkin and David Gazzard.

We congratulate the Shire Club on its successful promotion of the "single wicket competition" and with grade status very very close, your committee urge the wholehearted support of all cricket-minded people in the Shire to get behind officials such as President Don Stewart, Secretary John Smythe, A grade captain Brian Hazell, and many others. Their future is possibly your own boy's future, so give them encouragement.

#### OTHER ASSOCIATIONS

Our thanks and congratulations to the St. George Boys' Association for their neighbourly co-operation and on winning the Rob Allen Shield for the third occasion, and also the Watson, Cawsey and Under 16 Shields. The Under 16 rep. games were again conducted by St. George through the Junior Union and Bill Whalley as usual did a perfect job (doesn't he always?).

We understand Bill is resigning his position as secretary and his loss will be felt by all connected with cricket. George Moss, Secretary of the St. George Cricket Association, has also tendered his resignation, and to both Bill and George we say many thanks and best wishes to you both for your co-operation over many years.

Thanks are also extended to the Manly, South Coast and Bankstown Associations for the arranging of practice matches. Our Under 11 matches with Bankstown have become an annual event and are played in the utmost of cricket spirit and sportsmanship.

#### CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

Barry McManus of the Engadine Club was selected as the Association's "Cricketer of the Year".

Barry has been captain of Engadine Club in various grades for many seasons and was captain of this season's Watson Shield team.

He has represented the Association in each division of representative sides for many years. He won the 16A Grade Batting Average with 72.25 as well as the aggregate (578 runs) and also captured 37 wickets.

A forceful opening bat, excellent runner between wickets, slow off-spinner and brilliant fieldman as well as a good sportsman, Barry has proved a fine all-round cricketer and will hold the John Woodhouse Memorial Trophy.

All will wish him every success in his cricket future.

#### OUR PLAYERS "FAR AND WIDE"

Scanning the press, both local and city, many products of our Boys' Competition are performing with credit in many clubs and associations, and it is indeed pleasing to know they are furthering their cricket careers. In addition to those lads mentioned with the Sutherland Club, names which come to mind are Mick King, Barry McManus, Geoff Hilzinger, Allan Humphries, Phillip Morris (S.S.C.A.), Ray Tozer, Gordon Shrubsole, Ian Hart, Lindsay Joyce (St. George), and with other grade clubs—Peter Cooke, Bruce Hopkins, Kevin Killey, Peter Keenahan, Robert Bain, Barry Davison, Brian Stephen and many others.

#### TEAM MANAGEMENT

The control of individual teams through the clubs was generally satisfying and our thanks are given to all those adults who carried out their duties as umpires, managers, scorers, etc. Congratulations also to former players, David Gazzard (Cronulla) and Sterling Hamman (Kirrawee) for each looking after a team of youngsters.

There is still, however, a tendency amongst a few (and fortunately it is only a few), to forget they are in control of young lads learning both cricket fundamentals and sportsmanship. These people regard the game as a battle of tactics amongst themselves and regard defeat as a personal affront and go to any lengths to prevent it. Deliberate time-wasting and late starting must be eliminated. The old axiom of believing the other team are too good a bunch of sportsmen to complain or claim a forfeit is "cricket blackmail" and your committee will do their utmost to stamp out this unnecessary evil. There is a vast difference in playing the game to the rules and not playing the game.

#### COMMITTEES AND ATTENDANCES

##### DELEGATES' COUNCIL

Council delegates meetings were, in the main, well attended, and the general standard of debate and constructive legislation was of high quality.

Leo Flynn was unable to devote as much time to the committee as he would have liked due to business commitments. He was elected to the Board of Management at the Cronulla R.S.L., and it is understood he is not standing for office next season.

The Association was again fortunate in having Eric Hilzinger as Treasurer. It is sufficient to say that no Association could be better served than officials of the calibre of Eric, who controlled your finances with the utmost of efficiency.

Wally Croucher completed yet another season as Recorder. Wal's work grows more and more with the ever increasing teams and many hours are spent by him on Result Cards, Score Books and the Draw. He was elected Secretary of the Umpires Association. Your committee will be recommending him for Life Membership at the Annual Meeting for services excellently rendered.

Individual performances in each division are listed in the pages to follow. Many of our boys possess a wonderful cricket future, but naturally only time will tell as to whether they reach the long hard road to the top which will have to be in A Grade.

Barry McMannus has already been spoken of earlier in this report. Another lad who possesses great potential is Glen Bailey, of Jannali, who was also a close contender for "Cricketer of the Year". Bailey has a wealth of talent, forceful hard hitting stroke maker, good swing bowler and excellent fieldsmen. He scored over 500 runs, won the Association bowling average, was the leading batsman in the C. S. Watson Shield and rose to A Grade with the District Club on turf. He scored over 1000 runs in the season in all cricket and in the writer's opinion is the best equipped batsman on turf in the Association.

Ian Hart, of the Sylvania Club, had a remarkable season and his 842 runs, including four centuries, set an Association record. An aggressive left hander his future will be watched with interest.

Tony Chellow, of Miranda 12A, scored three centuries, and his all-round effort with bat and ball speaks well for next season.

David Monk, of Sutherland-Grays Point 12D, broke the Association's record by taking 86 wickets, a great effort. Some other remarkable efforts came from Allan Humphries (Woronora 16B), Chris Hillman (Cronulla 12B), and Steve Edmonds (Taren Point 12C). The last two lads will no doubt be in A Grade next season.

Other interesting feats included a century by Allan Read (Gynea 14C) in 62 minutes, and a partnership between Allan Gray 115 n.o. and Peter Crammond 102, of Gynea 16B, whose total was 3 for 325 in 3 hours. Glen Bailey, Jannali 16A, took 4 wickets in 4 balls against Cronulla.

Fortunately many parents are helpful and sympathetic realizing that only 11 players can be selected in each game, that the best players must receive preference and that the individual merits of the players are of

secondary importance to that of the team. Parents and supporters who think otherwise are a menace and have a damaging effect on team morale.

## SOME INTERESTING FACTS

During the season several records were broken. Most runs in a season: I. Hart of Sylvania 16B, with 842 runs, broke the record set by R. Davison of Miranda 16A, with 647 in 1963/64. Most wickets in a season was broken by two players — D. Monk of Sutherland-Grays Point 12D, with 86 wickets, and S. King, of Cronulla RSL 10C, with 83 wickets, broke the record set by S. Stewart of Miranda 16A, with 81 wickets, in 1961/62. Most catches by K. Carpenter of Engadine with 26 catches, who broke the old record set by K. Edwards of Cronulla RSL 12C, of 20 catches in 1963/64. G. Marston of Miranda 14A cleared away with the most dismissals by a wicketkeeper in securing 40 victims, to break the old record set by R. Slater of Miranda 14A of 27 victims in 1960/61.

Also during the season 38 centuries were scored and 58 hat-tricks were performed.

Whilst I was checking a scorebook from 10C I glanced at the sundries and saw that 64 no-balls were bowled during one innings. This rather interested me and I decided to check a little further and here is what I found from this one book: Players of this team recorded 45 ducks whilst their opponents recorded 24; this team bowled 279 overs with 360 no-balls whilst their opponents bowled 277 overs with 314 no-balls. In one match a boy scored his team's total with two hits in one over, a 4 and a 2. The team's total was 6. In another match it took three overs to dismiss a team for four runs. Three players scored one each and one no-ball was bowled.

These facts are not printed to discourage any boy for the senior teams of this club have performed very well and a lot of credit must go to the managers of all the Under 10C teams for the outstanding work they do and the patience they must have.

## Competitions and Individual Performances

### 16A

This proved one of the closest contested 16A grade yet experienced with three teams all having a chance of the premiership right up to the final day. Miranda continued their winning way and although their side lacked the batting strength of previous years, their teamwork, fighting spirit and strong bowling combinations won the day. Slow bowler John Brayne proved a match-winner, well supported by Laurie Taylor. Albert Mahony their manager-coach did a fine job.

Engadine and Jannall were strong contenders, both had powerful batting combinations and as with Miranda each had two losses. Bowling was perhaps Engadine's weakness and reliable catching that of Jannall. All in all a good even competition with Gymea being the big weakness in not fielding a full side on several occasions and being an easy target.
