Ladies and Gentlemen,
This being my first year as Secretary, I hope you will bear with me for any mistakes I make in this, the Seventeenth Annual Report and Financial Statement for the 1972/73 season which you have entrusted to me and which I submit for your approval and adoption.

SUMMARY OF THE SEASON.

The 1972/73 Season could be called one of our most successful seasons to date, in as much as we saw such an increase in Teams and players which should put the game of cricket back in its true perspective. The general swing back to cricket augers well for our future.

Wet weather played havoc with the season and it must surely be a record that so many games were completely washed out on successive Saturdays after Christmas. Apart from wet weather there were no major upsets during the season.

Most Clubs responded to delegates meetings which were well attended and many interesting points, in regards to competition, were brought to the attention of the Executive and adequately dealt with at Executive Meetings.

OUT OF THE PAST.

On reading an old Annual Report from the 1968/69 season, it was interesting to note under the heading 'Teams' written by Mort Edson, and I quote "areas such as Heathcote, Sutherland, Woolooware, Menai and Kurnell are devoid of organisations and these areas must be explored" and further on "Kirrawee did not re-enter, a sad happening for this once prominent club". Many of these avenues were explored at the start of this season and we saw Kirrawee come back to the fold with one under 16 Team this season with the promise of more teams in the next season. Heathcote entered the competition with two teams in the 12C and 10C grades and Kurnell entered three teams in the 14E, 12E and 10C grade. Many other areas will be explored prior to the start of next Season.

GROUND AND WICKETS.

Grounds and Wickets once again posed a problem at the start of the season, but as no problem is ever too large to tackle this was quickly overcome and sufficient grounds were made available to accommodate our large number of teams.

We were however, due to one of our wettest seasons of cricket, faced with bad draining grounds which became unplayable very easily.

We must here thank Mr. Ray Thorburn M.I.R., who during his term as Shire President, showed us many courtesies throughout the season as we feel sure our incoming President, Clr. Kevin Skinner, will be a big help to our Association. Thanks also to Mr. Dennis Walker, for his co-operation through the season. During the season we regretfully saw the retirement of the capable Shire Engineer, Mr. Bill Wood who was always ready with help and advice.

FINANCE.

Many extra expenses were experienced through the season, with the purchase of a rebuilt Gestetner, new mats and repairs to matting, which is always costly. Our Trophy and Annual Report expenses will be much higher owing

to the extra divisions which were necessary to accommodate all boys registered for cricket.

With the many donations we received and our Social Functions we finished the season with a favourable bank balance.

TROPHY COMMITTEE.

The decisions of the Trophy Committee after careful consideration on special Trophies were as follows:-

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR. "JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

Bruce Handley of the Gynea Bay Club was selected for this coveted honour, Bruce was a worthy nominee winning it for many fine performances in both Saturday morning competition and Representative Cricket. He is a dedicated cricketer and puts a lot back into the game, he has played for the Gynea Bay Club for seven seasons and has still another year in the U/16. He is a hard hitting right hand batsman, right hand opening bowler and very useful fieldsman. A good all round sportsman both on and off the field. Congratulations Bruce on your selection.

Worthy of Mention.

The Committee spent some time in looking and deliberating on the many performances of some of the boys who included, Laurie Axford, Garry Pattinson and George Gazy of the Miranda Magpies, and Mark Ridge and Rick Francis of the Gynea Bay Club who are to be congratulated for their performances throughout the season and are a credit to the clubs they represent.

Ken is a useful bowler and good fieldsman in all a very reliable player.

Another cause for concern was that fieldsmen and wicket-keepers were continually talking to the batsman while he was trying to bat or follow the call of the batsman at the other end. This is most distracting. Do you call this Cricket? Let us be fair and give all boys a fair go on the field.

CAP PRESENTATION.

Cap Presentation to the Representative Teams was held in the Administration Building at Caringbah Oval, due to rain, on Sunday, 3rd December, 1972. Many parents and friends crowded into the hall to watch the Presentations being made by our Official Guests. Two players took 60 wickets or more and sixteen took 50 wickets or more. All told, 41 players took 40 wickets or more during the season.

CATCHES: Once again Caringbah Junior Sports Club was well to the fore in this department, with four teams taking well over 60 catches; 14D, 64; 12C, 65; 10A, 69; 10B, 63.

The leading team in this phase of the game was St. Patrick's 16C (1) who took 74 catches, closely followed by Engadine 10C who took 72 catches.
