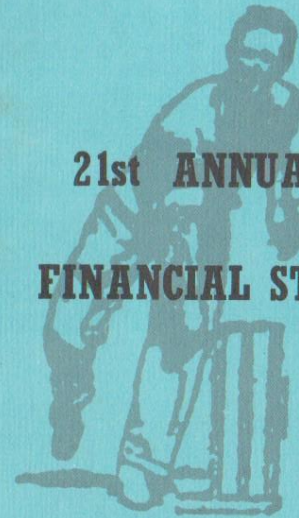

To all members of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, Boys' Competition: It is with pleasure I present to you the twenty first Annual Report and Financial Statement for the 1977/78 season for your approval and adoption.

#### SUMMARY OF THE SEASON

There was a dramatic increase in teams this season, in fact it was an Association record. This was probably due to the publicity cricket received before and during the season.

Weather for the season was really good but unfortunately rain did spoil a very good finish on the final days play of the season, with most of the early games being washed out and it was found necessary to call off the late games.

Once again most clubs were represented at the Delegates meetings, however some clubs were fined for non attendance. We cannot express too strongly the important role delegates play in the association. Being a delegate is not a difficult job as all members of the executive are there to assist at all times. The same old complaint still remains, delegates are not taking all important information back to their clubs and this creates a problem.

#### GROUNDS AND WICKETS

This was probably one of the driest season for some time but problems were created when some people who water the fields left the hoses on overnight, particularly on Friday nights and rendered the grounds, on a few occasions, unplayable on the Saturday. A little thought on the part of these people is needed.

The grounds have improved generally over the years but some grounds remain the same with little or nothing being spent on them, however, some grounds have had a great amount spent on them.

Thanks are extended to the President of the Council, Councillor M. Tynan, Cnr. A. Andrews, Chairman of Parks and Playgrounds and Mr. E Hirst, Shire Engineer, for his co-operation and understanding. To Mr. D. Walker, for his co-operation and assistance at all times. A special mention to the staff who assisted to make the grounds more suitable for the boys.

#### CAUSE FOR CONCERN

With the large amount of teams we had complaints were small in comparison. It must be pointed out that the manager and captain are responsible for the flags being put out, the best suggestion would be for each team to carry a length of string so they can measure the distance of the flags. The flags should be of a reasonable distance so that boys learn to run between wickets and the scoring of fours should not be given as a gift.

Declaring teams should be done before the start of each game on a sheet of paper and handed to the manager, captain or scorer. If a team wishes to field a substitute, he should consult the opposition manager or captain as to whether he has any objections to the boys fielding or to the position in which he is to field.

Once again in the area of umpiring, it should be made known to all clubs that the Umpires association is at your disposal for any instruction nights you may wish to hold.

#### PRESENTATION NIGHT

The Presentation Night was held in the auditorium of the Gympie High School once again and was well attended. We held most of the crowd to the finish with the only disappointment being some of the players from the representative teams who did not stay until the end of the night and this is not a late night bay any means.

The highlight of the evening was the presentation of the 'Cricketer of the Year' award to Peter Bishell, of the Gympie Bay Club. Peter was truly a real winner of this award as his sportsmanship over the years has proved. Also on stage was Garry Whitley the previous who paid tribute to Peter's performance and received his replica of the award.

Another highlight of the evening was the presentation of 'Life Membership' to

Mr. Lance Handley, a cricket stalwart from way back, father of the first boy in the association to receive the 'Cricketer of the Year' twice, Bruce Handley, and well known for the encouragement he has always given to the boys of the shire in all phases of cricket.

Our thanks must be given to the Official Guests who were present to assist in the presentations and to Mr & Mrs Handley for the use of their home once again to entertain the Executive and Guests at the conclusion of the evening.

#### CAP PRESENTATION

Cap presentation was held at Caringbah Oval in weather that seemed to be ordered specially for the day. Once again there was a good roll up of both invited guests, parents and supporters. After the presentation the boys had their photographs taken and then left to play their matches against Georges River-Penshurst for the Executive Shield.

#### FINANCE

Once again I must state that this section is handled by the treasurer and detail is given in the latter part of this report.

The association have remained quite steady in spite of the rising costs and we aim to keep expenses down to a minimum in the coming season. This report is typed by my wife, Irene, from cover to cover and so saves the association a huge cost in production of this report.

#### TROPHY COMMITTEE

#### CRICKETER OF THE YEAR "JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

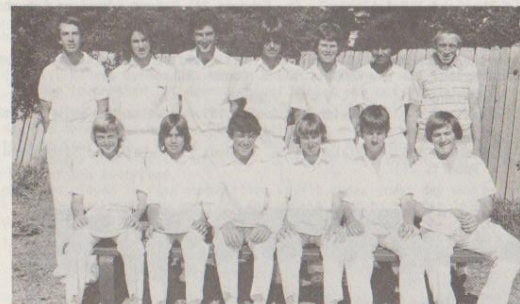

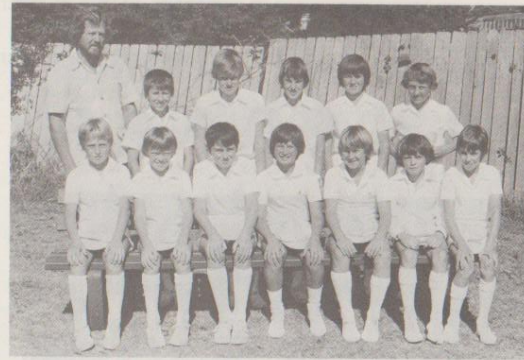
