TABLOID CRICKET

At the end of the 1979/80 season, a parental survey was carried out to gauge the reactions of various people to the new experimental programme introduced that year. The results of this survey were most encouraging and the parents' recommendations for further improvements were closely examined by the Executive.

The final analysis led to an extension of the average cricket sections with games to be played over two days and with players able to bat for six overs as a pair as against the three overs of the previous season.

The initial tabloid skills section was reduced slightly but still played a vital role in introducing the young boys to the necessary fundamentals of the game.

Only the 10C and 10D grades were allowed to take part in 1980/81, as the Association's original aim was to use this programme for our beginners - not for 2nd or 3rd year players.

The season was a very successful and enjoyable one for all concerned. The managers and coaches worked in perfect harmony, forever conscious of their role in developing the youngster's skills. Mr. Tony Gleeson and Mr. Harry Green were appointed ground managers at Boys Town and Kareela respectively and their efficiency and conscientiousness did much to ensure that the programme ran smoothly throughout the three phase competition.

The improvement in the boys' techniques was very noticeable by the season's end.

Interest in the "Sutherland Experimental Programme" has become immense. Already Western Australia, South Australia, New Zealand, N.S.W. Country and Metropolitan Cricket Associations have adopted our approach to junior participation in their beginning years.

Our Association can feel very proud of being the instigators of this great innovation.
