"JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

JEFF SMITH

We are very proud to announce our Junior Cricketer of the Year is Jeffery Smith of the Como Club.

Jeffery had an outstanding season in his 1st year of 16A's and whether you look at his performance this year or look at his overall performance at both club and representative levels since his career started as a 7 year old, you could only feel admiration for his achievements and also be pleased that he played for and not against us.

Jeffery captained and Vice-captained many club and representative sides with distinction, leading by example and showing a maturity far in excess of his age. Jeffery is sometimes stern but always pleasant towards members of his sides and gentle and caring for the younger ones.

Jeffery played his club cricket with Como, except for one season with Illawong.

His amazing performance in six years of reps. saw five premierships on the trot and as semi-finalists this last season. In 16A's he amassed 447 runs (Ass. Agg.) at 37.25 (2nd in Ass.) and he took 19 wickets at 18.68 from 138 overs, conceding only 2.57 runs per over.

Jeffery joined the Como Club in the 1977/78 season in 10c's and they came 2nd in the competition - the 1978/79 season saw them take the premiership. As Jeffery was still eligible to play inthe Under 10 competition, we show his career records from :

to be competition recorders. Recording the weekend results involves a considerable amount of paperwork. The result sheets handed in by your team managers are important. The figures show match results and individual performances, therefore they form the basis of records to show competition winners & individual trophy winners.

The sheats should be filled out clearly and accurately, otherwise a club, a team or a player can be penalised, perhaps unfairly. Remember the recorder is not at your particular game.

The assistance received from clubs this year together with our record four recorders made for smooth running of the 745 teams. Competition fines and penalties were less this season than previously. We thank you for your support.

Once again, our association has co-operated with the Men's Association by installing another five synthetic surfaces on pitches within the Sutherland Shire. With such a large number of our wickets now covered, a greater number of our players from A grade through to lower grades are now having the advantage of these surfaces.

The move to more and more wickets covered with artificial turf is making for better cricket. Urge new Dads to come along to the Annual General Meeting &puttheir names down for some duty that will make our 1985/86 season even more enjoyable for boys in the Sutherland Shire.

N.S.W. JUNIOR CRICKET UNION DELEGATES REPORT.

Junior cricket in this State continues to prosper under the guidance of the N.S.W. Junior Cricket Union. There are 19 junior associations affiliated with the Junior Union with a total of nearly 17,000 players. Following Parramatta, Sutherland has the largest number of boys playing Junior cricket. The Junior Union was again headed by George Weblin as President and John Crane as Secretary.

Sutherland Shire Junior Association were again successful in taking out the coveted Shell Company Shield, for the third successive season, but by the barest of margins. This was most commendable considering our representative teams were unable to take out a final. During the season our management committee member and delegate to the Junior Union, Claude Mann, was appointed Manager of an Under 14 junior union team touring the far North Coast of New South Wales. The team returned unbeaten. Claude also was appointed selector for the Northern Territory under 15 touring team.






