TREASURER'S REPORT

The 1996/97 financial statements reflect a significant negative cashflow but this was planned and controlled reflecting huge expenditure on upgrading grounds and synthetic wickets - see separate grounds report.

- our sponsorship income fell and this puts more pressure on general funds. We need more
 sponsorships for the upcoming season. Can you help? In this regard we must again pay
 regard to Harry & Carol Peters of Ocean Monarch Premium Seafoods (Marine Product
 Marketing Pty Ltd), and Harry Solomons of Kingsgrove Sports who again, as always,
 provide sponsorship and support to the Association.
- raffle support has waned. This activity was introduced to help both the clubs and the Association (for ground improvements). All expenses are met by the Association and 50% of the value of each ticket sold stays with the selling club. Some clubs have done very well while others have not embraced the concept fully.
- the costs of participating in the Shell Series continue to rise and now are about \$130 per boy
 so it is very disappointing to receive back raffle books from some rep. players with no effort
 made to sell one ticket. Sutherland over the past decade or so has been the best on and off
 the field let's keep it there do your bit.

In our present position it is my intention to recommend no increase in fees for 1997/98 but this will depend on insurance costs which in turn depend on claims. Several clubs and Associations in NSW (including Sutherland) are being sued and outcomes will impact on insurance premiums.

Relationships with clubs have been great and as Treasurer I have had no problems as all clubs fully co-operate in financial matters. Thank you one and all.

COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is with surprising speed that the cricket competitions commence and finish and the 1996/97 season was no exception - to say that the season has been challenging at times is certainly an understatement!

Thirteen clubs registered 125 teams - an increase of eleven (1995/96) and I would like to congratulate Caringbah Sports for once again topping off the season winning the Club Championship - "The Bertshell Trophy" - and Illawong for finishing second and Miranda third.

While an increase in teams is exciting and welcomed, there is a downside, with a limited number of grounds and limited playing times some competitions were regrettably reduced to 35 overs.

The condition of some of the centre wickets at the start of the season and the knowledge that they would require extensive work during the season (at the time impossible to program) resulted in the unenviable decision to withdraw grounds from some competitions where traditionally they had been allocated for some time.

The competition was not only strained due to ground changes resulting from works to upgrade wickets, but also because of an increased incidence of vandalism. I believe that the next season we will attempt to continue to improve the standard of wickets in the Shire but on a smaller scale and so I am hopeful that the impact will not be as great. Vandalism on the other hand is a problem more difficult to overcome.

I cannot stress strongly enough the importance of communication between the Management Committee and the member Clubs - I think at times during the past season, there has been a breakdown in the lines of communication - perhaps non attendance at meetings and other various factors have contributed to this. Please support us in our endeavours to ensure the best is provided for our young cricketers on Saturday mornings by ensuring that the information circulated at meetings is conveyed as accurately and as quickly as possible.

On a more positive note, there has been tremendous support from SDCC - Barry Davison was responsible for the programming of another Gala Day's coaching for all Sutherland junior cricketers, irrespective of their age or skill level. Barry also provided representative players and Clubs with coaching clinics with the assistance of SDCC. A 'Level 1' coaching course was conducted and well supported by all Clubs.

SSCUA conducted an umpires course and as a result we enjoyed an increase in the number of official umpires standing on Saturday mornings.

I am confident that both these courses will be available next season and would urge all Coaches/Managers and interested parents to attend.

Managers/Coaches meetings were conducted at the beginning of the season and attendance was compulsory - this once again proved to be positive in providing information to those directly involved on Saturday mornings.

The standard of recording this season has been consistently high - not an easy task, especially or U10 and U12 - and I would like to thank Ian, Lyn, Karen and Steve for their efforts.

I would in conclusion like to extend my appreciation to the Clubs who have supported the Management Committee, and to the Management Committee for their support and assistance to me throughout the season.

1 wish all junior cricketers an enjoyable and successful season in 1997/98.

GROUNDS REPORT

In conjunction with Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, Sutherland Shire Council and all or our member clubs, your Association has embarked on an intense programme of ground improvements. Elsewhere in this report we have set out details of annual expenditure - you will note that the season 1996/97 exceeded \$56,000 and this exceeded the aggregate of the previous four years.

We replaced existing synthetics at Akuna Road, Heathcote, Port Hacking High School, Anzac, Canberra Street, Loftus, Woolooware, Sylvania Heights, Gymea Bay, Kareela and Casuarina Road.

In addition, significant works (levelling, relaying pitch, new synthetic etc) were undertaken at Kirrawee, Jannali, Grays Point and Kareela Central.

Major works were undertaken by individual clubs.

Miranda - nets at Seymour Shaw
 Gymea Bay - nets at Gymea Oval
 St John Bosco - nets at Boys Town

Illawong - new wicket at Coachwood Drive plus significant new developments at Lucas Heights (to which SSJCA contributed

as well).

All in all, this would be the largest capital works programme ever undertaken by Cricket in Sutherland Shire. A major driver in our vision is the safety of participants. None of this would have been possible without the co-operation and excellent support of SSCA (Leon Bunker, David Dee and Graeme Thornley) and the Council (Stephen Bourke, John Gordon and Murray Halls). Actual expenditure is shared 50/50 between the Men's Association and ourselves but the Council "chips in" with a great deal of uncosted support. They are always there to guide, advise and assist.

Plans are being developed for 1997/98 - all we need is the cash!

- J McInnes of Evoca 14B took 72 wickets off 90 overs (of 8 balls each) at an average of 2.33 in 1961-62 - but not good enough to win the bowling average.
- E Robinson of Caringbah De La Salle scored 616 runs in 14A in 1966/67. Mark went on to play Sheffield Shield cricket for Tasmania.
- John Dyson of Jannali scored 645 runs in 14A in 1967/78 John went on to be our Cricketer
 of the Year two years later and played 22 tests for Australia.
- S Edwards took 73 wickets at an average of 1.81 to help Grays Point win the 1976/77 10B competition.



NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

The Trade Practices Act, 1974, came into force on 1st October, 1974. There are important provisions in the Act which contain strictregulations on advertising, all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study these provisions very carefully.

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions for doing any of the following connection with the supply of goods or services or in connection with the promotion by any means of the supply or use of goods or services.

- (a) Falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade or that goods are of a particular style or model.
- (b) Falsely represent that goods are new.
- (c) Represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories uses or benefits they do not have.
- (d) Represent that he or it has a sponsorship, approval or affiliation he or it does not have.
- (e) Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence of, or amounts of price
- (f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.
- Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

PENALTY:

For an individual - \$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment

For a corporation - \$50,000

It is not possible for this company to ensure that advertisement which are published in this magazine comply with the Act and the responsibility must therefore be on the person, company or advertising agency submitting the advertisements for publication.
