## GREEN AND GOLD - CHARITY ROUND

Sutherland Hospital was bowled over by the generosity of young cricketers in the Sutherland Shire, who raised \$5,000 for the Children's Ward.

The Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association held a 'Green and Gold' charity round on Saturday, 13 November, 2010, when all participants donated a gold coin or more.

According to Samantha Martin, Finance Officer for the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association, players, coaches and umpires wore green and gold arm bands and sweat bands.

"Some painted their faces green and gold, and some young players donned green and gold shirts instead of wearing traditional white," Ms Martin said.

"There was a strong community spirit on the day, with many of the 1,500 players registered to play in the Association pitching-in in imaginative ways. Some of the teams held barbeques, others sold green and gold merchandise, with profits going to the cause," she said.

Tracy Harris, Acting Nursing Unit Manager, Children's Ward at Sutherland Hospital, said staff were touched by the support from the young cricketers, aged from five to 16 years.

"Their generous donation will be used to buy three parent beds that will be located beside the beds of young patients in the Children's Ward. This will allow parents to stay by the bedside whilst their children are in hospital," Ms Harris said.

"Hospitalisation can be a very traumatic experience for children and by having beds for parents to stay near to their children is comforting for sick and injured children. Our aim is to try and make the hospital experience for a child and their family as least traumatic as possible," she said.

The Engadine Dragons 12As won the right to present the \$5,000 donation to the Children's Ward by raising \$220, the largest amount from any team. They were followed closely by the Caringbah Sports 12As, who raised \$210.

# DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Season 2010/11 saw a continued focus on the development of club coaches, as well as development opportunities for players, through a number of initiatives.

The SSJCA, in conjunction with Cricket NSW, again promoted a series of Level 1 Coaching Courses at the start of the season. The number of courses was increased to 3 and options offered in both October and November to allow both existing and new coaches to participate. These were well attended and showed the commitment and enthusiasm coaches bring to their Clubs. The SSJCA remains committed to increasing the accreditation rates of all coaches, both at the ITC base level required by CA, but also in achieving the SSJCA's preferred accreditation standards across our cricket formats.

This season, instead of the previously under-utilised coach mentor program, a number of other development opportunities were available with the support of the Sutherland District Cricket Club. Of note:

- A "Coach the Coaches" day was held by SDCC in October, open to all SSJCA coaches – principally aimed at promoting skills / knowledge at the grass roots level.
- SDCC again held a 'gala' day for U14 SSJCA players as per last season, but expanded this program to include one also for U12 SSJCA players. These were held in November and December respectively and were a great success – offering exposure to Grade coaches and activities, as well as SDCC itself.
- SDCC funded certain invitational coaching programs during the season, aimed at developing selected specialist skills.

The SSJCA greatly appreciates the support and involvement of SDCC in the development of our junior coaches and players and looks forward to working together in future seasons, furthering both these and possibly expanded opportunities. This relationship is one

strongly supported – such that this season we allocated specific liaison / coordinator roles for discussions with SDCC. Thank you to Mark Vandermaal and Tony Hess for taking on these additional responsibilities.

Development of our coaches, along with our players, is also a focus of Cricket Australia and Cricket New South Wales as well and we should expect to see more from them in this area in the seasons to come. The future and strength of the SSJCA competitions relies primarily on the degree of volunteer participation at team level and enhancing their skills is critical.

The U10 Development Squad proved extremely popular again with over 50 players nominating for selection in the squad of 24. This season saw a continuation of our preference for higher coach:player ratios with 5 coaches lead by Jeremy Moors (Level 3) as Convenor and Darren Smith (Level 2). This structure allows more player-specific focus and small group skill development and activities. The program was a great success with 3 skill sessions, 2 one-day games and a session at the SCG as part of the on-field entertainment during a Ford Ranger Cup match. The continuing success of this program, and of our representative teams in the ages above, supports the SSJCA's decision to adopt a wider development program as opposed to fielding a smaller group of players in the interdistrict competition – a position lauded by CNSW who have openly recognised the benefits and successes of our program. Thank you to Jeremy, Darren, Steve Dunlop, Ian Raatz and Gerry Wiseman for their

assistance this season in running the squad.

In2Cricket programs were again offered across the SSJCA and those Clubs and volunteers who hosted programs are to be congratulated. This activity provides a great pathway to introduce boys and girls to cricket.

Girls' cricket is an area of continuing development. It is hoped that more and more girls will get involved and that Clubs will actively encourage girls to enter the game and take advantage of the various pathways available to them. The SSJCA acknowledges the efforts of all Clubs who foster girls' involvement in cricket, along with the activities of the SRGCA, to develop girls' cricket within the Shire.

The above are the key highlights of this season's development programs and does not recognise the multitude of activities that are undertaken at team and Club level. The SSJCA appreciates the time and effort that all parents and Club officials put into the game on a weekly basis, including the activities that Clubs already undertake to assist in the development of their own coaches and players. The SSJCA acknowledges that more always can be done and that opportunities should exist for all players and coaches, whatever the age or grade. The SSJCA remains focussed on developing and providing these opportunities.

# COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

Apart from a decrease in numbers the SSJCA has had a most memorable season.

- 5 out of 6 DCA Representative teams made the finals series and 2 teams (Under 11 and Under 12) won their finals.
- 2 out of 6 President's Cup Representative teams won their competition (Under 11 and Under 15).
- 2 club teams in the Michael Clarke Weetbix Twenty20 competition won their final at the SCG.
- The Under 10 development squad was again a success and they also played a match at the SCG.
- 2 DCA Representative players had the honour of being named as Cricketer of the Year for their age group.

In addition to these very positive results it is also apparent that:

- Players at all ages and grades are enjoying playing with the SSJCA
- The various formats; MOD, Traditional 35, Traditional 50 and Traditional 60; are providing well for players of all ages and abilities and they are developing the skills of all players.
- The overwhelming experience is that players, coaches and managers are playing the games in a great spirit and that we can be very proud of the good conduct of our players.

Thank you to staff of Sutherland Shire Council who maintain and provide the facilities for sport in the Shire.

Through the Presidents and Secretaries meeting and the subsequent meetings through winter the SSJCA committee members are working to continually improve the whole cricket experience. Some of the changes that you can anticipate for the next season include:

1. improved score books with much more room to record the bowling figures
2. the introduction of split innings for some grades playing traditional cricket. This means that in the two-week match each team bats half their overs each week and bowls half their overs each week.

A grounds committee is working with council to make substantial improvements to cricket facilities at grounds over the next 5 years.

The SSJCA is also working towards a Twenty20 competition, perhaps on Friday evenings, that is aimed at attracting players who are not playing in our Saturday morning competitions.

## CRICKETER OF THE YEAR - HAYDEN SMITH

To say it is an honour to write about this year's Player of the Year is but one part of the entire experience. Having the honour to be his coach in his final year of junior Cricket was a treat. Hayden arrived at St Patrick's from Engadine by virtue of the fact his original Club did not have an "A" graded under 16 side for the season. Their sad loss was St Patrick's gain. His reputation for being a fine cricketer had arrived a few seasons earlier and had taken residence in the minds of a number of people at his final Junior Club. Most people have a natural ability to do something. It can often be hidden or deprived of the chance to develop. Hayden's cricketing ability has found air at his three Clubs and the culmination of winning the award this year is testimony to his talent. It is arguable he has been the leading contender for this award for most of his junior career.

His is the owner of a relaxed batting style embossed with patience, timing and when required, power. Scoring more than 50 on several occasions, he notched up an unbeaten 101 runs in fine style without conceding a chance. Completing the season with 469 runs at an average of 78.17, he can reflect upon this batting season with satisfaction. That being just one part of his armoury, Hayden bowled well 99% of the time – it is tough to bowl well all the time – often taking key wickets at critical points of the game. As any competent captain would assert, a spinner needs to either collect wickets at a steady rate or deprive the opposition of runs with the consequence of wickets falling to others. Well, his captain during this year got that at every turn. Speaking of turn, Hayden's grip on the plastic decks improved during the season with good flight resulting in greater turn off the deck as the season progressed. It was a pleasing feature of his style that he refused to simply bowl "darts". Compiling a tidy 13 wickets costing 245 runs, he proved himself a potent weapon in his team.

As a player and team-mate, Hayden fitted into the side like the proverbial hand into a glove. His amiable and humour oriented nature underlined his ability to stir with the best....and it can be said with certainty that he was mixing it with the best! As a member of the team's "Brains Trust" Hayden's insights into cricket were handy to all that he aired them to. He was also a sponge for knowledge. Small snippets of information, tips or "how to do's" were absorbed and used. It is little wonder that he has the reputation of a cricketer of note. His total Junior career of 39 catches, 1965 runs and 106 wickets is proof enough.

On behalf of all that have worked with, coached, played with or against or watched Hayden, congratulations on a fine season and the award. May your success continue to grow into the future! With an ability that is more suited to turf decks, we look forward to hearing more from your graded cricket career.

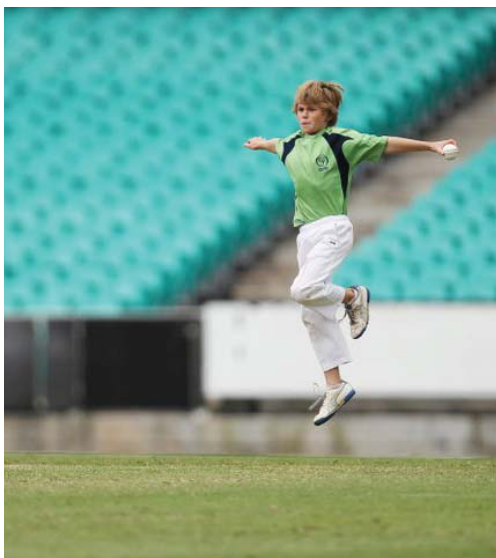

We entered the season confident of a strong performance. Training prior to the start of the season was good and the new faces in the team were blending in to the team structure well.

**Nicholas Amos (co-capt)** – our left arm swing half of the best opening bowling combination in the comp. 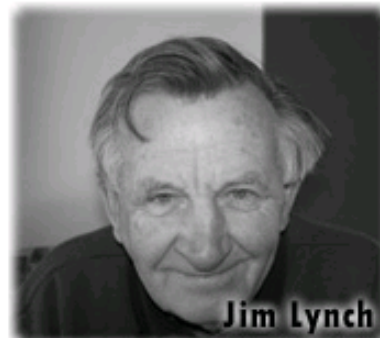
