PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another season has past and in reflecting on it I wonder where the time has gone. It seems that it is all too soon that our focus shifts to another winter. However, despite this lament, I look back on the 2012-13 season and feel buoyed by the steps we have taken to progress cricket across the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association.

Some of this progress may seem of varying degrees of materiality, some can be measured in what was put in place during the season, some can be seen in the aspirations and planning for future seasons, and yet some again is less quantifiable and is measured in the improving collegiate manner by which we can all work towards the betterment of our game. There's not enough room in this report to list everything that occurred across the season, but some key things worth noting:

In conjunction with the ramping up of ground improvements commenced by Sutherland Shire Council this season, we embarked on an ambitious grounds

improvement program with Council. This year saw many new pitches laid and improvements to surrounds implemented. This is a longer term, but worthy, initiative and we look forward to seeing the fruits of this program in future seasons.

We implemented a number of playing rules which we hope improved our Saturday games – to simplify playing conditions and to assist in player welfare.

Green and Gold Day was once again a major highlight on our cricket calendar, with funds raised going to support our local hospital. The generosity of our cricket community continues to look to the benefit of others and never ceases to amaze.

At the start of the season we challenged ourselves to improve the 'goodwill' between all the stakeholders in our competition (players, officials, Clubs, SSJCA). In my view this has exceeded expectations on the whole

- there is still more we can do to improve, but moving away from adversarial mindsets on every cricketing activity and relationship can only improve our culture and the environment we offer our players and their families.

We again had the support of our local grade cricket club, Sutherland, in the holding of an U12 gala day - Sutherland DCC remains a supporter of junior cricket and we look forward to progressing our relationship with them.

The representative cricket program saw the SSJCA again achieving outstanding results. Our Cawsey Shield side were undefeated premiers, while our Gee Shield, Moore Shield and Weblin Shield all progressed to some extent into their finals series. Our Presidents Cup teams also competed with distinction with our U14 Presidents' side topping their division and the SSJCA winning the overall Presidents Shield for the 3rd year running. Congratulations to all involved with the rep program for 2012/2013.

Our U10 Development Squad Program was again a highlight - being a development model often held by

others as a standard bearer.

That all said, in the end our greatest success was in the players who turned up each week, across all ages and grades, and participated in our great game. The smiles on faces and the enthusiasm for cricket, together with the friendships developed on and off the field by players and supporters alike, is in the end perhaps the best measure of what we achieve and is at the very core of what we are here for. I hope everyone enjoyed their season to the fullest.

Going forward, the SSJCA's most important challenge, if not our fundamental responsibility, is to ensure that junior cricket in the Shire remains a viable, relevant and attractive sporting option for families and players - for all level of skills and across all ages. We will continue to test our structures and our cricket offering and encourage ideas that foster greater participation and retention. But we also need to balance with our traditions and our game's core values and focus on what's right for us. A challenge, but one we must all embrace and work together with goodwill. One the SSJCA already has eyes

The SSJCA Competition

COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

2012-13 was another most memorable season for the SSJCA.

- 4 out of 6 DCA Representative teams made the finals series and the Under 12 went all the way and won their final.
- All teams performed well in the Presidents Cup, with the Under 14 team finishing 1st and Sutherland finishing again as the top Association
- Engadine 16A and Caringbah 12A reached the final of the Weet-Bix Twenty20 competition at the SCG; and both teams won their final.
- The Under 10 development squad was again a great success.
- Finals day on 16th March was a great day with all matches played in the best spirit.
- St Patricks won the Club Championship for the first time in over 30 seasons; and it was the first time in the last 8 years that this award went to someone other than Engadine or Gymea Bay.

As well as performing well it is clear that games in all ages and all grades are being played in a great spirit and that we can be very proud of the good conduct of our players.

In recent years the SSJCA has introduced new formats, new rules and changed starting times. These changes have been accepted well and no major changes were introduced. However, our focus switched to the quality of cricket fields and practice nets. Working closely with the SSCA (Men's cricket) and with Council we have implemented the following improvements:

- 12 fields had major renovations which meant improving the quality of the soil profile and then returfing large areas of the field.

- 10 pitches received a new synthetic surface and the for next 3 or 4 years we will continue the improvement to the synthetic surfaces
- 17 fields had levelling around immediate vicinity of the pitch with returfing the improvements to the bowlers run up. In following years we will continue maintenance on the run ups and the grass around the pitch
- During winter we also expect repairs to cricket nets at Woolooware Oval and new nets at Solander Field.

Over the next 4 years the SSJCA will continue to work with Council to bring about very significant improvements to fields. Sutherland Council has also introduced new soil management practices that are expected to improve the ability of the fields to survive the high usage during the winter season. So we will all be keen to see how the 12 fields that had major works done compare to other fields at the end of winter. Both Council and the SSJCA have doubled their budgets for expenditure on Cricket fields for the next 4 years to achieve a better outcome for cricket.

Thank you to all players, parents and volunteers who have helped to make this season such an enjoyable and successful season. Thank you to everyone who has helped, even in the smallest manner. I hope that everyone has enjoyed their part and will be back for more next season.

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR - NATHAN MARCIANTE

It is a great pleasure for me to be able to write the report on the career and achievements of the SSJCA "Cricketer of the Year", Nathan Marciante.

Nathan commenced his junior cricket as a U/8 player in 2003/04 for Engadine. In a ten year, 112 match junior career Nathan scored 2733 runs, captured 136 wickets, took 38 catches and achieved five "A" Grade Premierships. In 2005/06 Nathan was selected in the SSJCA U/10 Development Squad and went on to represent Sutherland Shire with distinction in the Shell Shield competition for five seasons. In the 2008/09 season Nathan was awarded the Alan Craston Memorial Trophy for the SSJCA "Best Performance 12A", which was the signal for greater things ahead.

My association with Nathan goes back to the 2006/07 season when I first coached him as a nine year old in the Dragon's 10A Premiership team. In my end of season "Year Book" report I wrote "What a good cricketer this boy will grow into" as it was quite evident at that early age that Nathan possessed all the attributes to become an outstanding cricketer. Since that time I have had the greatest of pleasure to coach Nathan in Sutherland Shire Representative teams, Green Shield and his final two seasons of junior cricket.

This season Nathan dominated the 16A competition with both bat and ball scoring 547 runs at 54.7, which

included a brilliant 152, and took 23 wickets at 8.52 with the best figures of 6 for 6 off 5.5 overs. In Green Shield Nathan had an equally great season scoring 265 runs at 37.7, including 117 against Sydney, and took 14 wickets at 20.3, thus earning selection in the Combined Green Shield No.1 team. Nathan also dominated the Weet-Bix Twenty20 competition scoring 269 runs at 67.25 and took 8 wickets at 10.37. Nathan's outstanding performances this season assisted his club team to win back to back 16A Premierships and being crowned both Weet-Bix Twenty20 Cup 'Metropolitan' and 'State' champions.

On behalf of the Engadine Dragon's Cricket Club, congratulations Nathan on the way you have conducted yourself as a representative of our club. We are all extremely proud of every one of your achievements throughout your junior cricket career, and your performance this season makes you a very worthy recipient of "Cricketer of the Year".

He is a worthy recipient of under 10s player of the year

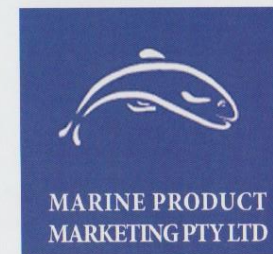

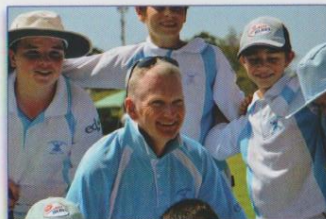
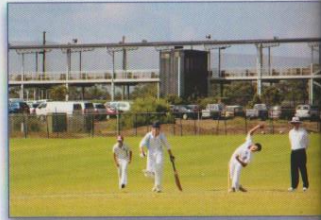

He made it look easy at times, finishing off innings with a mixture of finesse and power. He is also a handy leg spin bowler, brilliant fielder and was the team's vice captain.

Kobi was soon promoted to open where he figured in 6 consecutive half century opening stands. He also chimed in with a few vital wickets with his awesome line and length.

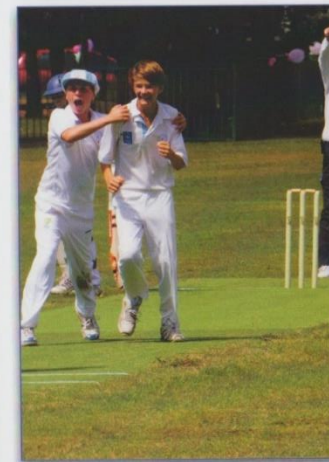

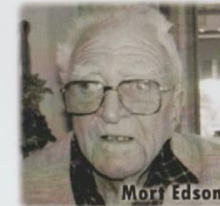
