PRESIDENTS REPORT

As another season wraps up - and we take a break from weekends filled with zinc cream, camp chairs and Napisan - it's my pleasure to present the President's Report for 2024–25. In our 66th year, the Engadine Dragons Cricket Club has once again proven that community cricket is alive, well, and thriving here in the Shire. We've continued to grow participation, deepen our connections, and fly the flag for everything that makes local sport so valuable — not just wickets and runs, but friendship, resilience, and a good takeaway coffee just in time for the first ball.

This year, our Cricket Blast program welcomed five teams and thirty-one players, including twenty-one wide-eyed rookies and ten returning Blast veterans who already knew where to stand and how to high-five like pros. Pleasingly, eight of last season's Blasters graduated into competition cricket, a huge milestone and a credit to the coaches, parents, and kids who turn up with enthusiasm week after week.

In the SSJCA junior competition, we proudly fielded nine teams with eighty-five players, including a joint venture U16 side with St. Pats, sharing four players and plenty of team spirit. Meanwhile, our four senior teams held strong in the SSCA competition with seventy registered players, including ten juniors stepping up to make their senior debut - a terrific sign of the healthy pipeline we continue to build from within.

And on the park? There was plenty to cheer about. Three of our junior teams - 10B, 10D, and 12C-2 reached the semi-finals, with the 10Ds finishing runners-up and the 12C-2 team going all the way to be crowned Premiers. In the SSCA senior ranks, both our A1 and B3 teams made it to the semis and fought hard, falling just short but playing with grit and unity all season long. Across the board, our teams showed effort, sportsmanship, and a love of the game that continues to define the Engadine Dragons.

We also remain a proud contributor to cricket beyond our boundary rope. This season, nine players represented the SSJCA, five players represented the SSCA, and three Dragons were selected for the NSW Primary Schools State Championships. In addition, twenty-six juniors - current or former - played Sydney Grade Cricket, showcasing the ongoing strength of our development. A special congratulations to Kobey Freer, who made his First Grade debut for Sutherland this season. Kobey is a two-time Junior Club Champion and a brilliant example of what begins right here at the local level in our Engadine community.

One of our proudest achievements this season was once again being the lighthouse club for Pink Stumps Day. Our efforts helped raise over \$5,000 for the McGrath Foundation in November, leading the SSJCA's overall campaign. This cause continues to unite our community around something bigger than cricket, and our club's effort was nothing short of outstanding once more.

Off the field, the club's infrastructure has taken a major leap forward. Our practice nets are undergoing a total renovation, including full enclosure, synthetic surfacing, and the installation of lighting to enable training after dark. These upgrades will provide a much-improved environment for player development and coaching, and represent a long-term investment in the future of our club.

This year, we also bid farewell to six juniors who completed their time in the competition ranks. We thank them for their service to the Dragons and wish them the very best in cricket and life. Their names and contributions appear following this report.

So, as always, none of this is possible without the selfless work of our committee and volunteers. Thank you to Neil Croker, Brad Moreland, Col Berry, Matthew Carroll, Tim Russell, Ian Latham and Lee Bailey for your tireless service. From organising gear to chasing sponsors, liaising with council, attending association meetings, sorting out team kits, designing and procuring uniform items, your efforts are the backbone of our club. TREASURERS REPORT

Hopefully everyone enjoyed their time on the field this season. Congratulations to our 12C-2 team who were premiers. Our 10D's were runners up while our 10B, A1 and B3 were all semi finalists. To everyone else, hopefully you all enjoyed the season and return next year.

During the year the club made a profit of \$10,313.95 compared to last season's loss of \$5,512.19. This was primarily driven by more benefits provided back to the club members in 2023/24. The overall balance is healthy at \$65,436.96.

Highlights include;

- Cash balances of \$65,436.96 up \$10,313.95 on last season.
- Income was \$32,294.18 due mainly to Registration fees and Advertising/Sponsorship receipts.
- Registration Fees were \$14,953.82, this is up from last season's \$13,915.06 due mostly to higher senior fees charged this year.
- Uniform purchases were higher by \$2,384.79. The club continued to provide free playing shirts for all new players.
- Sponsorships/Grants for the year were up by \$929.41 to \$14,329.41 from \$13,400 last year.
- Our Expenses were \$21,980.23, down \$11,472.94 compared to last season, mostly due to the supply of supporter shirts and shorts provided to all Players in 2023/24.
- Umpiring costs were down compared to last season, mainly due to the lower number of official umpires.
- Cost of Balls were higher by \$1,385.
- Equipment purchases were down by \$3,003.10 to \$1,551.50, mainly due to re-stocking of some old equipment in 2023/24.
- Uniforms were down \$7,036.70 to \$3,806.00 from \$10,842.70. The decrease was due to the purchase of supporter shirts and training shorts in 2023/24.
- Presentation Night costs were down \$1,078.17, due mainly by not providing food for the Junior Presentation.
- Our Rent and clubroom costs were down \$2,554.00 compared to last year mostly due to new license arrangement rather than the old lease arrangement.
- Other Sundries' costs were lower than last year by \$1,417.97 to \$1,654.82. The decrease reflected the cost of new Banners incurred in 2023/24.

Finally, thanks to all those who contributed in some way to making this a great club, whether its sponsors/advertisers, committee, coaches/managers, players, or parents. Everyone plays some part towards the success of the club.

Vale - Clem Heffernan



It is with great sadness for everyone at the Engadine Dragons Cricket Club that I report the passing of Life Member Clem Heffernan. Clem passed away on Sunday May 18, 2025.

Clem's time with the Dragons has left an invaluable imprint on the Club with his contribution as a player and coach. Clem was highly involved in the establishment of our senior cricket teams in the early years. He played 21 seasons for our Club from 1968/69 to 1988/89, which included back-to-back A1

Premierships in 1968/69 and 1969/70. Clem also had a long standing association with our junior players having coached teams for near on a decade and winning numerous A Grade Premierships.

Clem was a very well-known and respected personality throughout our Club, the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association and Engadine Community. He was renowned for his skills with the bat and keeping gloves winning numerous premierships and Association awards. For his loyal service to the Club, Clem was awarded with Life Membership in 1992, and his name perpetuated on the "Intermediate Division Wicket Keeping Performance Award" trophy in 1997. Clem went on to attend every Junior Presentations from then on to present his trophy.

Clem was a product of the old school of playing hard, but fair which sums up him and his generation.

We send out our sincere condolences to son Greg and the extended Heffernan family on the loss of a great man who will be sadly missed by all.

CURRENT JUNIOR CLUB RECORDS – 2018-19 ONWARDS

Our junior club records commenced in the 1959/60 season, but in 1991/92, the junior competition rules were changed as follows: from time limit to an over limit game, with restrictions on individual bowlers, the number of competition rounds were set at ten. In the younger age groups Introductory and Modified rules were introduced. In accordance with these changes the old records from 1959/60 to 1990/91 were archived.

In the 2018/19 season the junior competition rules were changed by Cricket Australia as follows: the U10 & U12 competitions changed from two day matches to one day matches, the length of the pitch was shortened, number of fielders reduced and compulsory retirement at a set number of balls faced by the batter. In the U14 & U16 competitions matches were limited to one innings per team. In accordance with these changes the old records from 1990/91 to 2017/18 were archived.

Our junior club batting, bowling, wicket keeping and fielding records have been separated into three eras: 1959/60 to 1990/91, 1991/92 to 2017/18 and 2018/19 onwards.

No new senior batting, bowling and wicket keeping records were set this season and remain unchanged from 1967/68 onwards.

Our only loss in the first half of the season was against Gymea which was unlucky as we only had to hold out a few more overs for a draw. We successfully chased 194 in a 30 30 game against Como. Chasing at over a run a ball with almost all batsmen chipping in to help.

The second half of the season brought a lot of bad weather with it. There were a few washed out games with not much cricket being played. The second time we played Como we successfully defended 145. The confidence we went in with every week really brought about our success this season. There was a real team contribution, not just a few players doing it all. Everyone played a part. For season 25/26 the goal will be to play not only in a semi final but now a grand final.

After a number of seasons of vying for a graceful drop down the grades, it finally occurred this season after 4 defeats on the bounce as an uncharacteristic poor start to the season for our team. Even after relegation to the B2 grade, we struggled to close out games that we should have won until that sweet, sweet moment finally arrived on December 14, a glorious win in Round 9 by 3 wickets against top-of-the-table Miranda Magpies. This sparked a 55-day undefeated run that reminded us of our serious ability and competitiveness as a team, and as individual cricketers, while remaining grounded from the hard run of results at the start of the season that epitomises the harsh mistress that the game of cricket can be.

In the end, we finished a respectable 5th out of 7 teams, which was no more than our season deserved. We lost no fewer than 3 games by just 1 flipping wicket this season and we also managed to lose another by just 15 runs chasing a paltry total of 77. With a bit more commitment to training, especially for our batsmen (this writer well and truly included), and a continuation of a renewed commitment to the cricketing cause that saw us rarely playing short this season (a luxury indeed!), we are confident of a return to finals cricket in season 2025/2026.

Our side were a few men down this week and struggling as we fielded an attack full of spin options. Lukey was the best of the bowlers with 2-28 as our innings was brought to a close by the St Pats players who wouldn't allow the innings to go further than 28 overs at which time they were 6/178. A conversation was had by Steve and their whole side which resulted in no outcome and play on. It's pretty hard to have an 11 on 1 discussion with an opposition.

So, going in to bat we had a desire to knock them off. And so we did. Our dancing queen would hit a six, followed by air guitar, another six followed by the Nutbush. But in the end it wasn't enough, and we fell short of Como once again, this time by 25 runs.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA (Amended March 2024)

GUIDELINES

The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment of the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.

Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final match has been played or any other such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

In the absence of nominations, the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.

The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge exceptional circumstances or to provide encouragement. The Management Committee may also adjust criteria's from season to season to reflect changed conditions of play.

All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

All perpetual trophies remain the property of Engadine Dragons Cricket Club. All perpetual trophies must be returned in good order to the Club Secretary at such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

ADMENDMENTS

Due to the implementation of Cricket Australia Junior Cricket Stage 1 in 2018/19 and the subsequent changes to the U10 playing format our Club decided to no longer award U10 "Individual Team Awards". Instead, all U10 players shall be presented with a participation trophy. It was also decided that U10 players will be ineligible to be awarded "Performance Awards" or "Special Club Awards" other than Junior Rookie of the Year. The Club has introduced the "Most Consistent U10 Player" trophy to recognise the most consistent performance by an U10 player. The "Junior Division" has been amended to only represent U12 teams and players, while the "Intermediate Division" remains unchanged and still represents U14 & U16 teams and players.

GENERAL CRITERIA

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the assessing and determination of awards, the following criteria shall apply when read in conjunction with each award criteria.

- For each 10 runs scored 1 point
- For each wicket taken 1.3 points
- For each wicket keeping catch 1 point
- For each wicket keeping stumping 1 point
- For each fielding catch − 1 point

PARTICIPATION AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Master Blasters and U10 Teams

All Master Blasters and U10 players will be presented with a participation trophy.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions

For all U12, U14 and U16 teams engaged in SSJCA competitions there will be three awards presented per team. The awards are - Batting, Bowling and Coaches. For batting and bowling all awards shall be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team. Batting – runs scored and Bowling – wickets taken. These aggregates will be derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition round and semi-finals, but exclusive of the Final.

- In the case of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average shall be awarded the trophy.
- In the case of one player achieving both the highest batting and bowling aggregate the award shall be determined by using the "General Criteria." The highest calculated points in either batting or bowling shall determine which award is presented. The remaining award either batting or bowling shall be presented to the player with the next highest aggregate.

The Coaches award will be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager).

No one person may be presented with more than one of the above three awards. Please note that joint award winners may be recognised where the Management Committee see fit.

Senior Division

For all teams engaged in SSCA competition cricket there shall be two awards presented per team. The awards are — Batting and Bowling. For batting and bowling all awards shall be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series.

• In the event of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average shall be awarded the trophy.

All team awards shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from the official Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series.

PERFORMANCE AWARDS

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

Junior/Intermediate Divisions: The greatest number of runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

Junior/Intermediate Divisions: The greatest number wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

Wicket Keeping Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

Senior Division: The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series. Junior/Intermediate Divisions: The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined by the lowest average of byes to dismissals.

Fielding Performance Award

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

<u>Junior Division</u> (U12) <u>Intermediate Division</u> <u>Senior Division</u>

"The Paul Waddell Trophy" "The Greg Heffernan Trophy" "The Greg Knowles Trophy"

Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the fielder is credited with the greatest number of fielding dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. Senior Division: The greatest number of dismissals will be the aggregate of all fielding catches credited to the fielder derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series. Junior/Intermediate Divisions: The greatest number of dismissals will be the

aggregate of all fielding catches credited to the fielder derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final. but exclusive of the Final. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on the most catches taken in the least number of matches.

CLUB AWARDS

Most Improved Team

"The Bob Vannan Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager)

Determined by the Management Committee and awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be considered.

Encouragement Shield

"The Bob Price Shield"

(Perpetual shield and personal shield)

Nominations maybe sought and awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee the award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will consider age, performance, level at which played, years of experience, commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricket to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Junior Rookie of the Year

"The Ken Tever Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. To be awarded to a player who has competed in their first season of competition cricket and has displayed a high level of skill and ability.

Senior Rookie of the Year

"The Bill Knowles Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds including first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to a player who is ineligible for junior cricket and has competed in their first season as a senior cricketer and has displayed a high level of skill and ability. There is no weighting for grade. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Most Consistent U10 Player

"EDCC Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. To be awarded to the most consistent U10 player, who through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive in the SSJCA U10 competition. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Player of the Week Trophy

(Shared trophy)

The Club will supply each of our Cricket Blast, U10 and U12 teams with a "Player of the Week" trophy to be shared amongst its players throughout the season. The trophy may be accompanied by a sponsor's certificate or voucher.

EDCC Service Awards

(Memento awarded)

Club Service Awards were introduced in the season of 1996-1997. Service Award acknowledges club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards presented in periods of five years – five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS

Intermediate Club All Rounder

"The Ian Latham Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all-round performance in the Intermediate Division. As a guide the following qualification apply – minimum 150 runs scored and 12 wickets taken or minimum 150 runs scored and 8 wicket/keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 150 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 12 dismissals. The criteria shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and shall be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Club All Rounder

"The Dean Griffith Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all-round performance in Junior/Intermediate Divisions. As a guide the following qualification apply, minimum of 150 runs scored and 12 wickets taken or minimum 150 runs scored and 12 wicket/keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 150 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 12 dismissals. A player who represents the club in more than one senior team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Club Member of the Year

"The Val Tever Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy & personal gift)

Nominations are sought in writing and determined by the Management Committee and awarded to a club member who gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the Club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Executive Committee shall determine the recipient.

Junior Club Champion

"The Barry McManus Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. Awarded to the most outstanding U14 or U16 cricketer through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSJCA Competition. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Club Champion

"The Harry Robbins Trophy"

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who through their efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. The "General Criteria" set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Life Membership

(Life Membership Badge)

In considering any such nomination the committee will be guided by the Club Constitution, in particular – Membership Part No.2 – 2.7 Life Membership –

- (a) A Life member is a club member awarded the honorary title of Life Member for outstanding services to the Club.
- (b) There shall be for the purposes of recognising outstanding service two streams of entry to Life Membership, playing service and administrative service.
- (c) Consideration for Life Membership may only be exercised when the nominee has given no less than 25 years' service to the club as Playing Member (as defined in Rule 2.2) or, no less than 10 years' service to the club as a Committee Member, or some other Club support service of a non-playing nature.
- (d) Consideration for Life Membership will be undertaken in the first instance by the Management only upon receipt of a written nomination containing reasons in support. Any club members may make such nomination to any member of the Management Committee.

- (e) The Management Committee will examine all such nominations and in exercising absolute discretion accept or reject any nomination. Any decision taken is neither subject to explanation nor appeal.
- (f) The Management Committee determines for approval that the nominee is worthy of the honour proposed, shall advise members at the next general monthly meeting. That recommendation shall contain details of the service given by the nominee and justification for the action proposed. Approval being a majority vote.
- (g) A Life Member whose award derives from 25 years playing service shall henceforth pay no playing fee to the Club beyond that which the Club will impose to cover costs associated with Association registration, insurance, and any other like matter.
- (h) A Life Member shall pay no fees to the Club (with the exception set out above in Rule 2.7(g)) and shall be entitled to vote at any club meeting and receive any special consideration as the Management Committee may determine.
- (i) Each life member shall be presented with a suitably designed Life Membership badge.
- (j) A Life member is subject to the rules and regulations and Code of Conduct of the Club.
